This show was really outstanding in every way with outstanding Scotties and outstanding people who co-operated to make this a thoroughly enjoyable weekend.

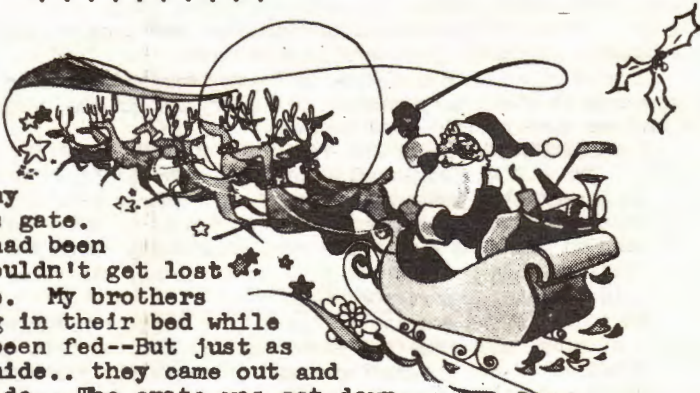

Principles of Dog BreedingBy Will Judy

The rallying cry of heredity is that like produces like but this expectation has been the bitter disappointment of almost all dog breeders. There is no perfect inheritance. It must be borne in mind always that the offspring follows not the parent so much as the entire family line; the like of the offspring is produced from the like of a dozen ancestors. For this reason, a great imported sire does not leave his impress for his get can not be bred to others of his general family, a very important element in linebreeding.

Would not the breeding of dogs be a pale pleasure if the offspring duplicated the parents? The puppies from a mating of a champion sire and a champion dam would be double champions, taking a championship from each parent.

HEREIN IS THE DOG BREEDER'S PROBLEM - THAT HE MUST STUDY FAMILY TREES, NOT PARENTS, THAT HE MUST INTERPRET PEDIGREES FOR SEVERAL GENERATIONS, THAT HE MUST LEARN THE DOMINANT TRAITS, THE OUTSTANDING QUALITIES, OF THE ENTIRE FAMILY ON EACH SIDE OF THE PARENTS, BEFORE HE CAN CHOOSE SCIENTIFICALLY A STUD FOR HIS BITCH.

Alas, the path of the dog breeder is not an easy one and well so, for he who puts a home-bred to a champion's title has won the honor thru much study and many careful comparisons.

Most pedigrees are furnished to the third or fourth generation. For complete study, a pedigree should be known to the sixth generation, a total of one hundred and twenty-six parents.

Many pedigrees after the tenth generation are much alike. The number of different ancestors is smaller than we imagine. Perhaps after the fifteenth generation, almost all dogs of a breed would have practically the same pedigree.

THERE ARE MANY GLARING ERRORS IN DOG BREEDING. BUT AS COMMON AND AS SERIOUS AS MANY OF THEM MAY BE, THE ONE THAT IS MOST INJURIOUS AND HAS DONE MORE HARM TO BREEDING IS THE MISTAKEN INTERPRETATION OF A PEDIGREE TO THE EFFECT THAT AS THERE ARE MANY CHAMPIONS IN THE PEDIGREE, THE PEDIGREE MUST BE A GOOD ONE AND THE PUPS GOOD PUPS.

In a four-generation pedigree, thirty dogs, every one of the thirty might be champions, and the pups scrub stock. This is possible; it is not probable because the bitches would save the day. Were the fifteen males champions and none of the fifteen bitches champions, the probability of scrub stock would be greater.

A good bitch in a pedigree is worth two good studs in the pedigree. Champion males are advertised at stud; they receive the glory; it is the ordinary bitches bred to them who should be praised also for the good puppies.

THE BREEDER WHO SELLS ALL THE BITCH PUPPIES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AND RETAINS ONE OR TWO MALES OF THE LITTER FOR CARRYING ONE, HAS NOT YET LEARNED THE ALPHABET OF BREEDING.

To interpret a pedigree properly, the characteristics of each dog in it must be known. This is the first step only. The next step is to note which of these dogs transmit their qualities on down the line. The remaining dogs, those who do not, can be stricken out for they mean little. In a pedigree of five generations, sixty-two dogs, fifty of them may mean nothing at all in breeding importance.

If in the sixth generation there is a sire or bitch who, for instance, of good head, wide spread of ribs, and excellent ears, has transmitted this quality, and this quality is seen in at least four of the generations, and this quality you want in your pups, that's a good pedigree on the one side of the house. Next, get the other parent who shows a like transmittal of these qualities down the line to her. Out of this union, there should be had puppies of good head, wide spread of ribs, and excellent ears.

Reading a pedigree correctly requires a full knowledge of breeding. The beginner can not do it. In such countries as England, where the breeder knows the dogs in pedigree by actual knowledge of them thru contact and sight, half the difficulty is overcome.

In America the dog breeder stays in the fancy a few years on the average. Fortunately, this condition is changing. As the number of oldtimers increase, so also will the ability to read breeding knowledge into the names on a pedigree.

MERE NAMES ON A PEDIGREE MEAN LITTLE; THE DOMINANT TRAITS OF EACH NAME MUST BE KNOWN. UNFORTUNATELY IN AMERICA WE HAVE NOT YET GOTTEN INTO THE HABIT OF KEEPING BREEDING PEDIGREES, THAT IS, PEDIGREES WHOSE NAMES ARE INTERPRETED BY ABILITY TO TRANSMIT.

ANNUAL SPECIAL PRIZES - 1973

THE SCOTTISH TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA offers to Club members only the following trophies to be competed for during the year January 1 to December 31, 1973.

THE CH. SHIELING SIGNATURE MEMORIAL TROPHY (Sterling Silver) offered by Mr. T. Howard Snethen through the Scottish Terrier Club of America to be awarded annually to the exhibitor or kennel winning the most points for Best of Breed during the year based upon the championship point rating of the shows. For permanent possession to be won three times by the same exhibitor or kennel, not necessarily with the same dog or bitch.

THE FRANCIS G. LLOYD MEMORIAL TROPHY a perpetual Silver Challenge Cup for the Best of either sex, to be awarded annually to the dog or bitch scoring the greatest number of points, based upon the championship point rating of the shows. The names of the winners to be engraved on the trophy which will be in the custody of the owner of the winning dog or bitch for the ensuing year.

THE CH. SANDOONE MISSY LOU MEMORIAL TROPHY (Sterling Silver) offered by Miss Betty Malinka through the Scottish Terrier Club of America. To be awarded to the dog or bitch winning the most points for Best of Opposite Sex during the year, based upon the championship point rating of the shows.

THE CH. LADY ALBERTA MEMORIAL TROPHY (Sterling Silver) offered by Mrs. Vana Mapplebeck through the Scottish Terrier Club of America in memory of her beloved Champion Lady Alberta to be awarded to the bitch producing the most Scottish Terrier champions as validated by the AKC during the calendar year. In event of a tie, the bitch in the tie producing the greatest number of validated champions during the preceding two years shall be declared the winner.

AMERICAN BRED BITCH (Sterling Silver) offered by friends through the Scottish Terrier Club of America to be competed for and won by the exhibitor winning the most points in AMERICAN BRED BITCH CLASS during the year. WINS WILL HAVE THE SAME POINT VALUE AS THE AKC CHAMPIONSHIP POINT RATING FOR THE SEX, PROVIDED THERE IS COMPETITION BETWEEN BITCHES OF DIFFERENT OWNERS. IF THERE IS NO COMPETITION IN THE CLASS OR IF THE COMPETITION IS BETWEEN BITCHES OF THE SAME OWNER, ONE POINT ONLY WILL BE ALLOWED. IF THE AMERICAN BRED BITCH GOES WINNERS, THE CHAMPIONSHIP

POINTS OF THE SEX WILL BE AWARDED REGARDLESS OF THE COMPETITION IN THE CLASS, IF THE BITCH HAS BEATEN A BITCH OF DIFFERENT OWNERSHIP. In the event of a tie, Westminster Kennel Club show points will have a plus rating. If the bitch goes Best of Winners, she will receive the points of the breed.

THE BEATRICE G. VAIL MEMORIAL TROPHY (Sterling Silver) offered by her friends through the Scottish Terrier Club of America to be competed for and won by the exhibitor winning the most points in AMERICAN BRED DOG CLASS during the year. WINS WILL HAVE THE SAME POINT VALUE AS THE AKC CHAMPIONSHIP POINT RATING FOR THE SEX, PROVIDED THERE IS COMPETITION BETWEEN DOGS OF DIFFERENT OWNERS. IF THERE IS NO COMPETITION IN THE CLASS OR IF THE COMPETITION IS BETWEEN DOGS OF THE SAME OWNER, ONE POINT ONLY WILL BE ALLOWED. IF THE AMERICAN BRED DOG GOES WINNERS, THE CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS OF THE SEX WILL BE AWARDED REGARDLESS OF COMPETITION IN THE CLASS, IF THE DOG HAS BEATEN A DOG OF DIFFERENT OWNERSHIP. In the event of a tie, Westminster Kennel Club show points will have a plus rating. If the dog goes Best of Winners, he will receive the points of the breed.

THE BALACHAN TROPHY (Sterling Silver) offered by Dr. & Mrs. T. Allen Kirk, Jr. through the Scottish Terrier Club of America to be awarded annually to the exhibitor accumulating the most points in the Bred by Exhibitor Classes during the year with either dog or bitch, not necessarily with the same dog or bitch. Competition between different owners required. Points will be based on the championship point rating of the shows. If there is no competition, one point will be awarded for being present in either dog or bitch classes. Points may be awarded for entry in both dog and bitch classes.

STERLING SILVER TROPHIES are to be competed for and won by the exhibitor winning the most points in the following classes during the year:

PUPPY DOG

PUPPY BITCH

wins will have the same point value as the AKC championship point rating for the sex, provided there is competition between dogs of different owners. If there is no competition in the class or if competition is between dogs of the same owner, one point only will be allowed. If a Puppy Dog or Puppy Bitch goes Winners, the championship points of the sex will be awarded regardless of competition in the class, if the dog or bitch has beaten a dog or bitch of different ownership. If the dog or bitch goes Best of Winners, he will receive the points of the breed.

Note: Donors of trophies are not eligible to compete for trophies they have donated.

FOR A DOG OR BITCH OWNED BY TWO OR MORE PERSONS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A CLUB PRIZE, EACH OF THE SAID OWNERS MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE CLUB.
