A VERY SAD NOTE TO REPORT - The death of Janet Mack of New York City. She passed away a few days before the Montgomery County Terrier Shows. Ms. Mack owned the Grenadier Kennels and was best known for Manchester Terriers. She also had a few Scotties. Janet Mack was about 83 yrs. young and will be sadly missed by all who knew her in the Dog World.

I felt honored to be asked by the Scottish Terrier Club of America to judge the Montgomery County National Specialty Sweepstakes. And, when I received word that there were forty puppies entered for me to judge, I was a little nervous.

I left beautiful sunny Miami and, courtesy of Eastern Airlines, arrived in beautiful sunny Philly. The Valley Forge Hilton Hotel in King of Prussia was a short limousine and cab ride from the air terminal.

The Saturday evening cocktail party was a lovely social affair and the following banquet, hosting about 100 guests, left little to be desired either in food or hospitality. After the banquet the S.T.C.A. held it's annual meeting at which time the new officers and board members began their term of office.

Didn't hoot too much with the owls Saturday night so I was able to be up and soaring with the eagles on Sunday morning. This was the time for my first big judging. Betty Malinka (STCA Sec'y) drove me out to the show grounds. My nervousness was not helped when we discovered we were 'lost'. As a result of this I was twenty minutes late for my first judging assignment.

At 9:20 A.M. the puppy dogs 6 - 9 months were called out on the lawn for me to pass judgment on. Age group after age group was called out and I examined each and everyone thoroughly. I have never seen a finer group of puppies, all there to win. When the final group of winners was called back to compete for the three best top wins I began to feel relieved. Relieved that it was almost over and relieved in the knowledge that I had done the best of my ability. I finished at 10:55 A.M. and the Regular Classes were due to be judged at 11:00 A.M. (Lucky we weren't lost 25 minutes).

At 10:00 P.M. flight back on Eastern arrived in Miami at 12:15 A.M. A great experience which I shall remember for a long time.

ANOTHER GREAT IS GONE.

It is with deep sadness to report the passing of Frank Brumby of Scottsdale, Arizona. He passed away on September 27, 1973 at the age of 82 years young.

Mr. Brumby was born in England and came to the United States with his father in 1912. They Operated a Kennel in Long Island, N. Y. He was a life time member of the S.T.C.A. He was a breeder and judge.

Sincere sympathy to his wife Clare.

When my employer asked for volunteers to help out in the State of Washington, I readily volunteered. My assignment was to spend two weeks traveling throughout the state. So, armed with my STCA membership booklet I headed for Seattle staying only long enough to check out a car and then off I went across the mountains. Two days later I found my way to Clarkston situated in a deep valley along the Snake river which separates Washington from Idaho. There, only a block from a steep bluff overlooking the beautiful river, resides the Robertsons owners of the famous Glad Mac Kennels.

Glad Mac has a special interest for me because that kennel name appears in most of our own pedigrees. The Robertsons invited me over and put on a big pot of coffee. I was taken directly out to their clean, bright kennels and altho not new, they were found to be well suited to the operation with generous pens and facilities. Everything was clean and bright, the concrete runs are well laid out and generous in size making daily scrubbing quite easy. The building is heated and air conditioned.

But more to my interest were the dogs, and fantastic dogs are what I found. All in all, I saw seven very beautiful near perfect dogs. Her dogs have refined long heads with tightly set ears. The backs are very short and their coats are very hard and straight. The Glad Mac dogs of course are noted for their good fronts and rears. Several hours had passed; we had drained the pot of coffee and the Scotties had to be fed. I had to leave, as I had company work to do.

My next stop was Spokane where I would spend most of my time on this trip. I called Mr. & Mrs. Michael Donohue who had just moved into their new home. They interrupted their box unpacking to extend their hospitality and I spent several hours at their home just talking Scotties. They don't actually have a kennel but they do have four Scots. Their kennel name is LochMist and their Ch. Loch Mist Dramboui is my type of Scottish terrier. He closely resembles one of my dogs who is nearing his championship.

I left for Seattle and arrived on a rainy Thursday. I tried several numbers but didn't find any one at home until Friday morning. Mrs. Karl Young invited me to visit her at the family style restaurant she operates in one of the nicest parts of town. Mrs. Young is not active as a kennel owner, but she is doing a good bit of judging. We enjoyed several hours of Scottie talk before I had to leave to get ready to return home.

Washington is one of the most beautiful places I have ever visited. I found the hospitality unsurpassed. I am sure if some of the dogs I saw were in the East, where shows are numerous and easy to reach, these kennels such as Glad Mac would be very dominant forces in our breed.


Mr. David Eadie judged the classes and had an entry of 16 dogs, 21 bitches & 9 Specials.

ANNUAL TROPHIES - 1974

THE SCOTTISH TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA offers to Members only the following trophies to be competed for during the year January 1 through December 31, 1974.

THE FRANCIS G. LLOYD MEMORIAL TROPHY, a perpetual Sterling Silver Challenge Cup for the best of either sex, to be awarded annually to the dog or bitch scoring the greatest number of points, based upon the championship point rating of the shows. The names of the winners to be engraved on the trophy which will be in the custody of the owner of the winning dog or bitch for the ensuing year.

THE CH. SHIELING SIGNATURE MEMORIAL TROPHY, a Sterling Silver trophy offered by Mr. T. Howard Snethen through the Scottish Terrier Club of America to be awarded annually to the exhibitor or kennel winning the most points for Best of Breed during the year based upon the championship point rating of the shows. For permanent possession to be won three times by the same exhibitor or kennel, not necessarily with the same dog or bitch.

THE CH. SANDOONE MISSY LOU MEMORIAL TROPHY, a Sterling Silver trophy offered by Miss Betty Malinka through the Scottish Terrier Club of America. To be awarded to the dog or bitch winning the most points for Best of Opposite Sex during the year, based upon the championship point rating of the shows.

THE CH. MARLORAIN DARK SEAL MEMORIAL TROPHY, a Sterling Silver trophy offered by Marlorain Kennels, Reg., through the Scottish Terrier Club of America in memory of their beloved champion Marlorain Dark Seal as an annual award to the owner(s) of the sire producing the most Scottish Terrier champions as validated by the AKC during the calendar year. In the event of a tie, the dog in the tie producing the greatest number of validated champions during the preceding two years shall be declared the winner.

THE CH. LADY ALBERTA MEMORIAL TROPHY, a Sterling Silver trophy offered by Mrs. Vana Mapplebeck through the Scottish Terrier Club of America in memory of her beloved champion Lady Alberta to be awarded to the bitch producing the most Scottish Terrier champions as validated by the AKC during the calendar year. In the event of a tie, the bitch in the tie producing the greatest number of validated champions during the preceding two years shall be declared the winner.

STERLING SILVER TROPHIES are to be competed for and won by the exhibitor winning the most points in the following classes during the year:

AMERICAN BRED DOG, AMERICAN BRED BITCH, PUPPY DOG, PUPPY BITCH.

Wins will have the same point value as the AKC championship point rating for the sex, provided there is competition between dogs of different owners. If there is no competition in the class or if competition is between dogs of the same owner, one point only will be allowed. If a Puppy Dog, Puppy Bitch, American Bred Dog or American Bred Bitch goes Winners, the championship points of the sex will be awarded regardless of competition in the class, if the dog has beaten a dog of different ownership. If the dog goes Best of Winners, he will receive the points of the Breed. In the event of a tie, Westminster Kennel Club show points will have a plus rating.

THE BALACHAN TROPHY, a Sterling Silver trophy offered by Dr. & Mrs. T. Allen Kirk, Jr. through the Scottish Terrier Club of America to be awarded annually to the exhibitor accumulating the most points in the Bred by Exhibitor classes during the year with either dog or bitch, not necessarily the same dog or bitch, provided there is competition between dogs of different owners. Points will be based on the championship point rating of the shows. If there is no competition, one point will be awarded for being present in either dog or bitch classes. Points may be awarded for entry in both dog and bitch classes.

OBEDIENCE AWARDS The Scottish Terrier Club of America offers Sterling Silver trophies to the top three obedience Scottish Terriers of the year. The Award is to be computed by the total of the three (3) highest scores received by the dog. One award each will be given for Novice, Open and Utility. The owners will be responsible for notifying the statistician of these scores.

FOR A DOG OR BITCH OWNED BY TWO OR MORE PERSONS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A CLUB PRIZE, EACH OF THE SAID OWNERS MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE CLUB.

Note: Donors of trophies are not eligible to compete for trophies they have donated.

Then for members only, the S.T.C.A. will award on an annual basis awards to the top obedience Scotties of the year. The award is to be computed by the total of the 3 highest scores received by the Scottie from October to October. Awards are to be given one to each division: Novice, Open and Utility. BUT, it will be the responsibility of the owner to notify the statistician of these scores.

The obedience newspaper, FRONT and FINISH, (Oct.'73) recently featured Diana Williams and her 3 Scots, Fibber McGee,UD, Eliza Doolittle, UDT, and Hoss,CDX TD in their monthly column "Breeds Seldom Seen In Obedience". Its a very delightful article and for those that have not seen it, just drop me a note and I'll gladly send it to you.

WHO EVER SAW A SCOTTISH TERRIER REGISTERED AS A "SANDY" COLOR?????

The Standard states "color(2½ points) Steel or iron grey, brindled or grizzled, black, sandy or wheaten...." Every person who has bred a Scottie can recite those colors but no one has to my research registered a dog as a sandy during the last fifteen years at least to the extent that it was ever published in the Studbook, as I have checked each entry for those fifteen years. I have also not found one mentioned as such in any copy of "DOG NEWS" from 1932 to the present. Perhaps the authors of the 1947 standard meant to equate sandy and wheaten because there is no comma between the two in the standard, but I have never seen sand the color of a good wheaten Scottie nor have I ever seen a winning wheaten the color of sand.

I would sincerely like to know what the authors of the Standard had in mind when they included in mind when they included the word "sandy" in the allowable colors, and I would also like to know the name and number of the last dog accurately registered as a "sandy". What color was it????
