On December 30, 1975 Mrs. Helen Stalter passed away after a short illness. Mrs. Stalter, with her late husband Charles, owned Barberry Knowe Kennels for well over forty years. They bred and exhibited Sealyham Terriers, Dachshunds and Scottish Terriers. The latter to a degree of success that was remarkable not only for the numbers of Champions bred and made up, the numbers of trophies collected, the numbers of Specialty Show wins, but primarily because they set a standard for the breed that stood for many years.

In an area bounded by a half circle centered in New York and extending out for two hundred miles, there was hardly a week-end between September and June that a dog show was held where you couldn't find an entry of four or five Barberry Knowe Scottish Terriers. Many an all around judge developed the mental images of what he looked for in the breed from the consistent quality of these dogs.

The handlers that presented them were the best and most consistent "terrier people" that the Stalter's could find. The Prentice family, Philip then Florence. The legendary Johnny Murphy, and in the past several years Stephen Shaw and Barbara Kingsbury. All professional and noted for their ability to put down and present an exhibit in the most favorable way.

Chuck Stalter was a prominent attorney, a one time President of the New Jersey Bar Association and partner in a successful practice in that state. He was a member of the U.S. Army Flying Corp, the Lafayette Escadrille in World War I, and a respected member of his community. He and Helen devoted a great deal of time and financial resources to the "dog game" and were very active members in the S.T.C.A. as well as several other terrier and all breed clubs. Chuck was President of the S.T.C.A. during 1943 - 1944 and served as Secretary, Vice President and a member of the Board of Governors for more than twenty-five years. Chuck judged the February 1957 parent club show and many other regional club specialties over the years.

The Stalter's hosted several S.T.C.A. Specialty shows and for a number of years the fall showing "season" was inaugurated with a Sunday afternoon lawn party at their Woodcliff Lake home.

Their kennel was probably one of the largest and most certainly one of the oldest in the breed, they maintained a stud force that was available to all. An asset that proved time and again an indispensable continuity with past quality and greatness.

The winningest Scot to be shown by Barberry Knowe was ironically not bred by the Stalters (although sired by their Ch. Barberry Knowe Merrymaker). It was Ch. Charmichael's Fanfare, bred by Ruth Johnson. A bitch that for many was the ultimate example of what sound breeding could achieve, "Mamie" was handled by John Murphy and posted a record that is not likely to be broken in the near future. This unusual combination of dog, handler and owners that were willing to commit the financial resources to campaign her, was instrumental in setting the highest standard of quality for the breed. With perhaps the exception of FDR's "Falla", never before had a Scottish Terrier been given so much national prominence.

The support that Helen continued to give to both the parent club as well as many of the local all breed clubs after Chuck passed on, and the time and effort she put into the kennel were expression of her love for the breed and dogs in general.

I never visited the house without being taken into the kitchen to see the "old people", a conglomeration of six or eight Scotties and Dachshunds that ruled the house with great self-assurance. It was impossible to finish a drink without being invited to see the latest litter in the "puppy" house and the next stop was the "trophy room", a wing recently added to the house that seemed almost like an extension of a Fifth Avenue silversmith. The Stalters were as proud and possessive of their Scots and their accomplishments as most kids are of their toys and successes in school. There was a disarming innocence in their love for dogs and the show ring.

THE S.T.C. OF NORTHERN OHIO, INC.

The S.T.C. of Northern Ohio, Inc. as it is known to-day had its early beginning back in the mid-thirties, possibly 1933 or 1934. A group of people living in the Cleveland, Ohio area who were devout admirers of the Scottish Terrier breed, set up monthly get-to-gethers. Their dedicated common purpose was to promote their stalwart attractively bewiskered friends their Scotties, and enjoy the friendship and fellowship of others of the same mind.

Thursday evening of January 24, 1935, the group calling themselves the Scottish Terrier Club of Northern Ohio, met at the Hotel Allerton in Cleveland, Ohio for a first annual meeting. This meeting was to organize, and as temporary Chairman they selected Mr. F. B. Jetter of Euclid, Ohio. He presided for the election of Officers and he was voted in as president. Mrs. Harry S. Haylor as Secretary, the other Officers and Executive Committee were elected. At this meeting the Constitution and By-Laws were read approved and adopted.

At the February 22, 1935, President Jetter appointed Robert Glass as chairman of the membership committee. The Ways and Means committee chairman was Mrs J. F. Benedict. There were 22 members and 5 Associate members at the meeting.

Two Sanction Matches under Plan "E" were held in Cleveland Area in 1935. The first was judged by Victor Langusen and the 2nd was judged by Alph Lepine. Both were approved by AKC. During the next 5 years the STCNO held numerous Sanctioned "E" matches, sometimes as many as 4 in one year.

The Club supported with entries and trophies in the Scottish Terrier classes at the Cleveland Classic Western Reserve All-breed Kennel Clubs annual dog show. They also were privileged to choose their judge for the Scotties at these all breed shows every year.

In 1938 the S.T.C.N.O. began to talk about Futurity Sweepstakes with the regular classes at these annual shows. The Futurity stakes were approved and instituted in 1940. (The same year the Club was Incorporated.) The Club held the futurity stakes in conjunction with the regular classes with the Western Reserve K.C. All Breed show. They continued this policy until they held their first Specialty Show in 1951.

Over the years the Club increased in membership, by 1939 total members were 63. The same year it was decided to have an emblem. It was the result of much work by L.E. Melchar that one was worked out and approved by the members.

Throughout the years the emblem seemed to have gone into oblivion, until 1971 when Hilda Bigelow, as secretary was looking through the old Club records and discovered it and brought it to the attention of the Club members. The Club membership decided to restore it in a new status, instead of an emblem for a member in good standing it was decided to make it a Club insignia. The word "Member" was deleted and FOUNDED 1935 added. This emblem was used for the first time (after restoration) on the cover of our Specialty Show Catalog 1971.

In 1940 membership went down to 30 members. Then during the war years the membership and activities of the STCNO dwindled to the point where the active members remaining had thoughts of disbanding, but decided against it, and to hold meetings occasionally. The last get-together was a puppy match held September 26, 1943.

The first meeting of the STCNO after the war was held Sunday, June 23, 1946 at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Harry S. Haylor, S. Euclid, Ohio. An election of new Officers and Trustees was held. There were 13 members and 2 guests present. A puppy match and picnic was planned for Sept. 29, 1946 at the Town Hall in Twinsburg, Ohio. The day arrived and despite a very rainy afternoon nine puppies ranging from four to twelve months old stepped out for Mr. Victor Langesen to judge.

The members welcomed a guest speaker Mrs. Jean F. Mathews, President of the S.T.C.A. Mrs. Mathews gave a short and interesting talk covering the general activities of the Parent Club, at that point in time (1946).

The Club began to plan for their 1st A.K.C. Specialty Show, but more members were needed, so they put on a membership drive and new names began to appear on the roster. One of which was John F. Wright, Sr. John, Jr. "Poverty Hills Knls" The Club learned they had to hold 2 A.K.C. Sanctioned Plan "C" Matches six months apart to be eligible to hold thier 1st Specialty.

The 1st AKC Match was held June 12, 1949 at Willoighby, Ohio and the judge was E.S. Montgomery. The 2nd Plan "C" Match was held at the Westside YMCA in Cleveland, Ohio Jan. 15, 1950 Mr. Alex Napier from Ontario Canada judged.

The Club went all out soliciting trophies for their 1st Specialty Show. The S.T.C.A. donated silver spoons for the best Puppy dog and bitch and Bred-by-Exhibitor dog and bitch. Mrs. Blanche Reeg was then Secretary of the S.T.C.A.

In 1951 the first Club bulletin was published in time to proclaim the coming of the first Specialty Show. It was called "SCOTTIE". In this newsletter it gave the date as April 28, 29, 1951 for this event that was to be held with the Western Reserve Kennel Club (Cleveland Classic) all breed show.

The first Specialty Show was a big success. Mr. Alex Napier of Canada judged an entry of 9 dogs and 11 bitches.

BEST OF BREED - Ch. Sheeling's Style Craft and was owned by Mr. & Mrs. Howard Snethen.

BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX - Stadlers Royale Heiress and was owned by Mr. & Mrs. Stadler. There were majors in both sexes.

The STCNO did not hold the 2nd Specialty until 1954. In the meantime (1953) saw much activity in the Club. They decided to find out from AKC about changing the name of the Club to an "All Ohio Club" but AKC refused to approve this change.

New names began to appear on the membership list. . Dick Hensel (Dunbar), Mr. & Mrs. McGilvray (Lealscot), Mr. & Mrs. Henry Isreal and Goldie Seagraves. The new members brought new life in the Club, new activities and progress.

In 1954 the Club held their 2nd Specialty in conjunction with the Marion Ohio K.C. (all breed) January 31, 1954. In 1957 the Specialty show was held with Richland Co., K.C. Mansfield, Ohio. In 1962 the S.T.C. of Northern Ohio decided to hold their show "Independent."

The Club held their first independent Show at the Holiday Inn at Mansfield, Ohio on Oct. 27, 1962. Their 1st puppy Sweepstakes was started at this time. They had an entry of 17 dogs, 30 bitches and 8 Specials. There were 26 puppies in the sweepstakes. Mr. Frank Ortolani judged the regular classes and Mrs. John Marvin judged the sweepstakes.

In 1970 - Our location was changed to the Crippled Childrens summer camp at Strongsville, Ohio. In 1971 our class judge was Mrs. Elizabeth Meyers of the famous Reanda Kennels in England.

Our next Specialty Show will be held Oct. 23, 1976 and will be held in the Hospitality Motor Inn Cleveland South same place as last year, this is in the Cleveland area, near the Cleveland airport and surrounded by free ways and highways. This will be our 24th Specialty Show and 14th independent show.

Our present official bulletin is "THE CLAN NEWS" and the Editor is Hilda Bigelow, and the Assistant and publisher is Beverly Haines, also assisting with the Clan News is Maureen Setter. First Issue of the Clan was February 1970.

All kinds of special activities are held each year. . One and two puppy matches per year, usually in summertime with a picnic or covered dish dinner at the Matches. Auctions are held including raffles, white elephant sales etc., Maureen Setter has a little project going, she looks up and records pedigrees for people who do not have one on their Scotties. She charges a minimum fee then donates it to the Club Treasurer.

The Officers and Trustees for the year 1976 appeared in the last issue of the Bagpiper.

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY THE PRESIDENT AT 10:00 P.M. THOSE PRESENT:
