CODE OF ETHICS

We are pleased to have your name as a sincere and dedicated fancier of the breed, interested in membership to the Scottish Terrier Club of America. The following requirements must be fulfilled in order for your application to be considered for approval.

1. The enclosed Application for Membership must be completely answered and signed.
2. Code of Ethics. Please read carefully, one copy is to be signed and returned with the application, the other copy is for your records. Your signature indicates you understand and will abide by them.
3. SPONSORSHIP - Two letters to be mailed to the corresponding secretary of recommendation from Scottish Terrier members, who are not related to you or to each other stating (A) how long they have known you, (B) that your facility meet meet with minimum standards, (C) that you will be an asset to the Scottish Terrier Club of America.

Please send all the above to the corresponding Secretary, along with your dues (\$12.00 per individual or \$18.00 for a double membership.)

Your application is subject to approval by the Board of Directors. You will be notified of the status of your application by the Corresponding Secretary.

THESE TWO ARTICLES WILL BE SENT TO EACH NEW APPLICANT WHO WISHES TO JOIN THE S.T.C.A. ALONG WITH AN APPLICATION FORM.

1. It shall be considered unethical for any member of the Scottish Terrier Club of America to engage in the wholesaling of litters of puppies, or the selling of puppies or breeding stock to or through such places as pet shops, catalogue houses or other commercial sources of distribution, nor shall he engage in overbreeding his own bitches for profit, disregarding the quality of the puppies.
2. It shall be considered unethical for any member of the Scottish Terrier Club of America to knowingly violate any of the normally accepted ethical practices in breeding dogs, selling dogs, or holding dogs at public stud.
(No bitch shall be considered for breeding who carries known hereditary defects, nor who is not in good health and physical condition at the time of breeding. Knowing misrepresentation of the health or quality of a puppy or adult dog for sale shall be considered unethical. A stud owner will not knowingly breed bitches with hereditary defects, nor those not in good health or condition, nor shall he breed a bitch to any stud other than that agreed upon previously with the bitch owner.)
3. Every member of the Scottish Terrier Club of America shall familiarize himself with the American Kennel Club rules regarding record keeping, registration, sale and transfer of dogs, and the procedures regarding exhibiting dogs and the holding of dog shows. It shall be considered unethical to knowingly violate these rules and regulations.
4. Each member of the Club has an obligation to protect the best interest of dogdom by conducting himself in a manner designed to reflect credit on himself, his breed, and on the SCOTTISH TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA.

From England: The Scottish Terrier Breeders and Exhibitors Association founded in 1934 is a truly ambitious Club with many overseas members. Muriel Owen is now President and Honorable Secretary is Philip Cockrill. The Club is most anxious to establish rapport with other parent and regional clubs around the world. I wonder if ALL U.S. Regional Clubs would be good enough to send a copy of their latest bulletin to Philip whose address is: Hampstead Norreys, Newbury, Berkshire RG16 0TT, England, U.K. He will reply to each.

It is with deepest sadness that I report the passing, within a week or two of each other, of two "elder statesmen", Mrs. Marjorie Wade and W. 'Max' Singleton, Mrs. Wade (Shortwood) was over 90 years young. She was President of the West of England S.T.C. and a member of the parent Club for 44 years, joining in 1932! She was a Championship Judge and Member of the Breeds Council to the K.C. Sympathy is extended to her daughter, Peggy.

Max Singleton just never seemed to fully recover from the loss of his wife, Blanche a few years back. At that time, Lillian Dewar (Desco) wrote of her, "Over forty years ago, I went to a Show at Darlington where at the ringside I met a pretty young lady with a baby in her arms and a little boy standing beside her. That lady was Blanche Singleton who was watching her husband Max showing his first Scot 'Whisper'...."Blanche was well loved by all, her kindness and friendliness could never be forgotten. Without her, Max continued but recurring sickness... slowly prevented him from taking an active part. He wrote me about a week before he died saying how sorry he was to have had to cancel his assignment for the Terrier Group at Crufts. He continued, ".....I was interested to read what you said about size of Scotties and I certainly agree with you, but there are other bad features as well that many judges just ignore nowadays" Unfortunately he did not clarify, but could it be EARS? Sympathy to his son, now a prominent Veterinarian and his daughter and their families.

FROM CANADA: Congrats to Louise Whent on her election as a Director of the C.K.C. for Ontario. She will handle By-Laws and obviously lawyer husband Ken will be an asset!! Scottie breeders are well represented in the new slate of officers. Mrs. Hilda Pugh in for a fourth term as President, John Devlin now 2nd Vice-President and of course, Louise.

Travelling to Alberta, first to Lethbridge where in the two All Breed Shows she went WB, BW and BB then on to Calgary with a three day Show and an entry of 9 Scots where she was WB and BOS each day, was KILTIE WEE LASSIE O'GLENADBAR who finished her Canadian Championship under expertise of owner Vi Morphet and handler Ken Pratt. This is the first champion to carry the Glentadbar name as we have worked our dogs rather than show. Also GLENADBAR WEE TOBY TOBASCO gained his Canadian C.D.

REPORT OF CANADA S.T.C. SPECIALTY APPEARS ELSEWHERE.

Of interest to ALL: How many of us have fumbled around with a three-ring binder taking out pedigrees, folding them in half to match male and female lines only to find they were not same size, holes broke but we struggled on. When breeders of long standing put together a book it is usually compiled from experience and specific need. SCOTTISH TERRIER COATS by Betty Penn-Bull (Kennelgarth) is a classic example. Published years ago, the supply is drawing to an end but it still remains the optimum of grooming books on the breed. Now Nigel Aubrey-Jones, International Judge, Pekingese breeder, Bibliographer and Columnist has put his experience to the making of a PEDIGREE BOOK. I call it the "stable-door" book! Pages are conveniently divided horizontally so that at a flick of the page, any male or female line can be matched giving the breeder a complete SIX generation lineage at a glance. There are 24 pages (48 pedigree forms). This has to be the innovation of the century. When I look at my old pedigree system, so neatly filed and cross-referenced yet so thoroughly impossible to use without major removals etc., I wonder why no one thought of this idea before. The book measures 14" x 13". Clubs or individuals interested please write me for further details.

THE CANADIAN S.T. CLUB SPECIALTY - 1974

A last minute change in venue was a welcome change for me, as the arena chosen was close by and the one my youngest son plays ice hockey from all winter. The judge listed as Mrs. Joseph Mecera of Elyria, Ohio was actually Mr. Mecera and I thought he did an excellent job. He thoroughly examined each and every dog on a table and no exhibitor could possibly have felt by-passed. A record entry of 3 males, 9 bitches, 5 champions and 2 veterans made it all the more enjoyable, although apart from three U.S. exhibitors, it was mainly a local Ontario entry.

The S.T.C. of Chicago held its first A.K.C. Specialty Show on November 22 - 23, 1930 in conjunction with the Western Specialty Clubs of America at the Chicago Armory. The Officers at that time were C. deQ. Whittle - President; T. E. Weible - Vice-President; Mrs M. F. Hillis - Secretary-Treasurer; Directors were Mrs. E.M. Stephens and Mrs. M. W. Patterson.

In 1934 and up until 1949 the shows were held at the Chicago Coliseum. A Representative sample of the growth of the Club can be taken from the 1933 - 1934 World's Fair Specialty Shows. The exhibitors list reads like "Who's Who" of our breed. Attending were Mr. & Mrs. Charles Stalter, Mrs. Flagler of the Relgalf Kennels, Elizabeth Hull, Bareae Kennels, Charles Schott, Mrs. J. Lewis Roby, Braw Brickt Kennels, Edward F. Maloney, P. K. Groves, S.S.Vandine, F. W. Zimmerman, Mrs. Marie Stone, C. B. Goes, & Mrs. S. L. Forelich. Truly the competition must have been formidable.

Our entries have ranged from 20 in 1930 to 69 in 1938. In 1938 a joint sweepstakes was held with the Scottish Terrier Club of Indiana and in 1940 with the Scottish Terrier Club of Minnesota, both now defunct.

In 1950 Robert Stewart persuaded Miss Betty Malinka to accept the presidency and the Club joined the Associated Specialty Clubs at Donovan Hall at the International Amphitheater. The prominent members and friends at this time were Mrs. Frances Gannon, Nick Janeskie, Robert Blain, Robert Stewart, P. K. Graves, Marie Stone, Charles Garthwright, Anthony Stamm, Hosea Bayor, T. Howard Snethen, A. E. Cartwright, Dr. Carter, Edna du Bois, T. W. Bennet, John H. Winant, Mary German, Ann Gilkey and Leon Godchaux.

T. Howard has won BEST OF BREED 6 times; Mr. & Mrs. C. Stalter, 5 times; Mr. & Mrs. A. Stamm 4 times; Dr. Stewart Carter, 3 times; Mr. John C. Winant, 3 times. A few of the outstanding winners have been; 1934 Ch. Heather Reveller of Sporrán; 1939 Ch. Hillcote Destiny; 1941 Ch. Relgalf Ribbon Raider; 1944 Sheling's Signature; 1951 Ch. Edgerstoune Troubadour; 1953 Ch. Marlu Clincher; 1964 Ch. Carmichael's Fanfare; 1966 Ch. Bardene Bobby Dazzler; 1972 Ch. Anstamm Happy Venture.

1977 will be a big year for the Club. We are leaving the Associated Specialties to hold our first independant specialty show. The date will be announced later. We hope it will prove

to be a successful show and an annual event that Scottie lovers will come to look forward to attending.

We are also compiling information to publish a book on the HISTORY OF THE S.T.C. OF CHICAGO.

W.S.S.T.C. was founded in 1935. Through the years the records have been lost, but we are fortunate to have two of the original founders still in the area - Mr. & Mrs. Hamlin Grier.

In the thirties the club was very active and dedicated group. With so many outstanding breeders in the area, most shows had over 20 Scottish Terriers entered and many of them English Imports. Our Club has always been fortunate in having quality kennels in the area. Some of the early members that the Griers' could recall were Mr. & Mrs. Willard Hudson, Grace Severson, Ben Brown, Eddie Warburton, and Bob Bradbury.

According to the records that I do have, our first Specialty Show was in 1946. We have just had our 30th consecutive show. A list of the outstanding fanciers-breeders who have judged this show reads like "Who's Who".

On November 17, 1947 the W.S.S.T.C. was incorporated in the State of Washington as a non-profit organization. Our Officers at the time were President Ruth M. Paul, Vice-President Ellen F. Hudson, Secretary Martha Merrill, & Treasurer Hamlin C. Grier.

The year of Seattle's World Fair, 1962, we were one of ten Specialty Clubs holding a show called "Associated Canine Specialties". Amongst all the fanfare of the Fair, we had an entry of 58 Scots for Mr. T. Howard Snethen to judge.

In 1967 we were a very proud and happy Club when our member, Bob Bartos, showed the Stuart's Eng. Cana, & Am. Ch. Bardene Bingo to BEST IN SHOW at WESTMINISTER.

We once again combined with other Specialty Clubs in 1973. This was the "Western Washington Combined Specialties", which we continued within 1974 and 1975.

As in the past, we shall continue to contribute our best, in and out of the ring, to the "World of our Scottish Terriers"

S.T.C.A. MINI-WORKSHOP in New England was held at the Ramada Inn in Brighton, Massachusetts.

The sessions were opened with slides of the National Specialty winners. Tom Natalini, workshop leader, gave a commentary which emphasized both the development of our breed and changes in grooming techniques. Prior to lunch Mr. Natalini gave an exceptional grooming demonstration. His clear and detailed explanations, which accompanied the step-by-step grooming, and the opportunity to ask many questions made this an outstanding learning experience. Following lunch we were able to try our hand at achieving the desired results on our own dogs. Mr. Natalini moved from person-to-person and assisted each and every one to a higher level of proficiency.

The relaxing atmosphere of dinner enabled us all to socialize, dine and of course learn more about our breed. "Breeding Better Scotties" the topic of our after dinner speech was followed by questions from the floor.

Sunday morning's agenda consisted of an informal meeting followed by a handling class. After lunch, Bob Graham, Hy and Betty Weiner joined Tom Natalini for a panel discussion. The topic "What a Judge looks for" focused attention on a variety of topics including: the A.K.C. requirements for judges, proper handling, ring courtesy, Wheaten Scottish Terriers, anatomy and physiology of the Scottish Terrier, gait, proper angulation, expression, and the 'Standard'.

A Match show Sunday afternoon culminated our weekend workshop. Each dog entering the ring was groomed better and presented more competently while each exhibitor understood so much more than when we began.

Mr. Natalini judged the Match and chose Terriwall's Angel By Jingo owned by Marjorie Guppy as Best in Match. Best of Opposite Sex went to John D. Hughes Gren-Aery Ferguson while Best Puppy was Blueberry's Wayside Willpw owned by Kathleen Brown. The following is Mr. Natalini's summary of the Match.

"For the most part I found that there were too many poor toplines and low tail sets. My puppy bitch 9 - 12 months was a beauty - she let down for the Best Scot in Show but will overcome that with experience. She made the selection of BEST IN MATCH difficult. The Open dog and Open Bitch were very similiar in type and I would suspect were from the same breeder, they both showed well but the open bitch far out showed the rest."

It was a pleasure seeing so many eager exhibitors willing to learn about the Scottish Terrier. The S.T.C. of New England wishes to express our deep gratitude and sincere appreciation to the S.T.C.A. for instituting the MINI-WORKSHOP concept. It has reached and educated, and we hope will continue to do so, many people thereby resulting in a greater understanding and improvement of our breed.

Based upon interest stimulated by the Mini-Workshop the S.T.C.N.E. has already had a follow-up grooming clinic and plans other related activities.

THE ANTHONY STAMM MEMORIAL FUND. The monies in the fund so far have been awarded to Dr. Gary Thayer for a project called "SELECTIVE BRONCHIAL BRUSH BIOPSY IN THE CANINE". The goal of this project will be to develop the ability to successfully catheterize a specific bronchus with the aid of an image intensified fluoroscope and pass a small brush through this catheter and collect a sample of the cells present in that particular area. This technique will be helpful in the diagnosis of lung tumors, chronic infections and allergic lung disease because it allows collection of biopsy material from the specific area of the bronchial tube that is diseased.

We do hope that more donations will be forthcoming so that this worthwhile project can be continued.

From the Editors desk of the S.T.C. Michigan

DID YOU KNOW - - that we have an organization called the AMERICAN DOG OWNERS ASSOCIATION? President Duncan Wright spoke to the Terrier Club of Michigan at the annual dinner in April. Some of the things Mr. Duncan Wright told us were rather a "shocker" to say the least.

Did you know that the puppy mills are responsible for 1 MILLION 250 THOUSAND PUPPIES per year - - most of the mills are in Kansas, Iowa, and Nebraska. There are 17,000 pet stores - the average wholesale price on 70 breeds is \$44.76 - that is what the wholesaler gets - - the breeder gets somewhere around \$35.00 per puppy.

The ADOA has been responsible for obtaining FEDERAL legislation on transporting animals. They tested 6 shipping crates that were made available by the airlines and only ONE passed the barest humane way to ship an animal. They used a temperature device in several different planes in several different cities and the Temps in the cargo holds ranged from 4 degrees to 109.6 degrees with the temp., going as high as 129.6 degrees on a DC 10 excursion. They have been responsible for getting Dog Fighting made a felony in several states and if you don't think this is a serious problem in Michigan you had better wake up - - its big business.

The humane societies place pets in homes (un-spayed and un-neutered) and a few years their progenies are among the 14 million put to sleep.

The only way we are going to get continuous better humane treatment for our animals is through legislation - - that is the answer.

I can't speak highly enough for this organization, the dues per year are only \$6.00. . they pay no salaries, except the secretary and last year they spent some \$50,000.00 in court cases and legal fees to protect OUR animals.

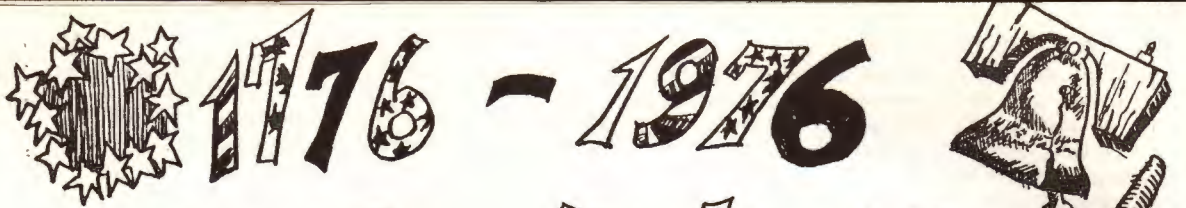
