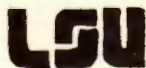

Re: Sudden Death in Puppies Associated with a Suspected Viral Heart Disease  
(Myocarditis)

Sudden death in puppies associated with a viral heart disease (myocarditis) appears to be a new disease entity seen in 4-8 week old puppies. It has been reported recently from several veterinary colleges and clinics in the United States. The first time it was observed in this country was in September 1978.

Since we need to know more about puppies affected with this disease we are initiating a survey of dog owners to learn more about the problem. Your club has been selected as part of this survey and we would greatly appreciate your help.

Would you please inquire among your members if any have had recent experience with sudden death in 4-8 week old puppies. Please send the name and complete address of any members identified and number of dogs on premises to me as soon as possible in the enclosed self-addressed envelope.

A questionnaire will then be sent to each of the members identified by you.

If you have any questions concerning the information wanted, I will be glad to answer them. My phone number is 504-346-3336.

ANNUAL TROPHIES 1978

THE FRANCIS G. LLOYD MEMORIAL TROPHY

A perpetual S. Silver challenge cup to be awarded annually to the dog or bitch scoring the greatest number of points for Best of Breed based on the championship point rating of the breed; the names of the winners to be engraved on the Trophy, which will be in the custody of the owner of the winning dog or bitch for the ensuing year.

THE CH. SHIELING SIGNATURE MEMORIAL TROPHY

A S. Silver trophy offered by Mr. and Mrs. T. H. Snethen through the STCA to be awarded annually to the kennel or exhibitor winning the most points for Best of Breed during the year based upon the championship point rating of the shows. For permanent possession to be won three times by the same exhibitor or kennel, not necessarily with the same dog or bitch.

THE SANDOONE MISSY LOU MEMORIAL TROPHY

A trophy offered by the late Betty Malinka through the STCA. To be awarded to the dog or bitch winning the most points for Best of Opposite Sex during the year, based upon the championship point rating for the breed.

THE BALACHAN BRED-BY-EXHIBITOR TROPHY

A S. Silver trophy offered by Dr. and Mrs. T. Allen Kirk, Jr., through the STCA to be awarded annually to the exhibitor accumulating the most points in the Bred-by-Exhibitor classes during the year with either dog or bitch, not necessarily the same dog or bitch, provided there is competition between dogs of different owners. Points will be based on the championship point rating of the breed. If there is no competition, one point in both dog and bitch classes.

The awards for American Bred Dog and American Bred Bitch, Puppy Dog and Puppy Bitch will be calculated on the following basis: Wins will have the same point value as the AKC championship point rating for the sex, provided there is competition between dogs of different owners. If there is no competition in the class or if competition is between dogs of the same owner, one point only will be allowed. If a puppy dog, puppy bitch, American-bred dog, American-bred bitch goes Winners, the championship points of the sex will be awarded regardless of competition in the class, if the dog has beaten a dog of different ownership. If the dog goes Best of Winners, he will receive the points of the Breed.

STONEHEDGE TROPHY (American-Bred Dog) Offered by Mr. Don Massaker and Tom Natalini, through the STCA (Rules above.)

AM ANGER CINDERELLA MEMORIAL TROPHY (American-Bred Bitch) Offered by Edward B. Jarvis and Stephen Kurek, through the STCA (Rules above.)

THE CH. LAIRD OF SCOTS GUARD MEMORIAL TROPHY (Puppy Dog) Offered by Eileen Lyne Weaver, through the STCA. (Rules above.)

THE DUNBAR TROPHY (Puppy Bitch) Offered by Richard Hensel through the STCA. (Rules above.)

THE WAYRIDGE TROPHY (Stud Dog) Offered by Mr. & Mrs. Wayne Ridgley, through the STCA, to the owner(s) of the Scottish Terrier siring the most Scottish Terrier champions during the calendar year. In the event of a tie, the dog in the tie producing the greatest number of validated champions during the preceding two years shall be declared the winner.

CH. LADY ALBERTA MEMORIAL TROPHY (Brood Bitch) Offered by Mrs. Vana Mapplebeck, through the STCA, to the owner(s) of the Scottish Terrier producing the most Scottish Terrier champions during the calendar year, (Same rules as the Wayridge trophy).

ANSTAMM ACHIEVEMENT AWARD is offered annually through the STCA by friends of Anthony Stamm. The award can be made to a person or persons, a group, a club, or any other organization. Conceivably, it could be made to persons or organizations not connected with the STCA, Particularly in cases where achievement outside of, but affecting or relating to the breed might transcend any accomplishment by a club member for a particular year.

Letters of nomination stating reasons why the nominee(s) should receive the award should be sent to the Corresponding Secretary. Cut off date to be decided later by the STCA Board.

TROPHY AWARDS (con't)

ANTHONY STAMM VETERINARY MEMORIAL FUND

The STCA will award on an annual basis One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) donation to a College, in memory of any STCA member(s) that died during the preceding year. The recipient School, - - and the names in whose memory the donation is made will be announced at the Annual Meeting. Donation to be used for small animal research, through the STCA.

This award to be given to a different University each year.

THE SANDISSY TROPHY offered by Dr. & Mrs. Barry Meador through the STCA, for the American-Bred dog or bitch best representing the breed in All-Breed competition during the award year. The dog or bitch must have competed in no less than ten shows during the year. The points to be computed as follows: 1 point for each Best of Breed; 2 points for each Group 4th; 3 points for each Group 3rd; 4 points for each Group 2nd; 5 points for each Group 1st; 8 points for each Best in Show. Independent specialty Best of Breed wins not to be counted.

THE STERLING SILVER MEDALLION AWARD To be awarded at the Annual Meeting to persons who have contributed their services to the STCA. If a member wishes to nominate someone, they should make their nominations in writing to the Corresponding Secretary, stating their reasons for nominating this person or persons.

COMPUTING THE S.T.C.A. ANNUAL AWARDS

The awards are calculated from January 1st to December 31st calendar year, not Gazette year. This is why there generally is some difference between results of other systems, awards, and tallys. The final calculations are not complete until all shows from the previous year, with corrections, champions of record have been published. Often that is not until the April Gazette. It usually makes a big difference especially in figuring the stud dog and brood bitch awards.

The awards are calculated by the points available in the breed that day; except for the Sandissy Award. There are several conditions that apply before points can be awarded. Example - In the Sandissy award the dog or bitch winning B.B. at any given show (except independent specialties) is awarded 1 point for that win. The dog or bitch is awarded 2 points for a group 4th; 3 points for a group 3rd; 4 points for a group 2nd; 5 points for a group 1st; 8 points for a BEST IN SHOW. Thus a dog going B.I.S. would accumulate a total of 14 points toward the award. A dog placing 3rd in group would accumulate 4 points. A dog winning B.B. but placing in the group 1 point.

### CRUFTS 1979

Leaving home at 6:15 A.M. so as to beat the usual commuter rush into town on Friday, February 9th. The outlook was bleak as there had been snow overnight and more was falling as we drove up to London; however halfway there the snowfall ceased and the fields either side of the motorway showed no signs of snow but up in London it was terrible cold - too cold for snow, a fact of nature which always puzzles me but which many of you reading these notes know far more about than we do here in England normally. However our winter has been one of the most abnormal on record with temperatures of minus 15 to 20 degrees several times locally in January & February and has been the worst winter in living memory in the village where we live.

What with the weather, no gritting or salting of the roads in most areas due to strikes by Public Service Workers which also included dustmen who made only one collection instead of five normally in January and the shortages for a time (and for some items only) in the shops due to a three week strike lorry drivers there has been a somewhat depressing start to the New Year here but the British public seem to have taken most setbacks in their stride, possibly saving up their thoughts until they can express them at the polls, as our present government has to go to the Country before next November! Just remembered, we also had a series of rail strikes Tuesdays and Thursdays during most of January which didn't help as these in fact meant four days a week dislocation of rail traffic of which very craftily the Union only had to pay for two days out of Union funds!

On arrival near the new venue for Crufts at Earls Court, parking proved so difficult that it was necessary to go onto a carpark one knew of some way away and take a two mile taxi ride back, so perhaps one did not arrive at the Hall three hours after leaving home in the most cheerful of spirits. The new venue seemed much like the old Olympia one but it was a bit warmer and the dogs were in one hall on two floors with ample space and rings were a good size, though toilets and refreshment bars seemed fewer and much further between.

Qualifications for Crufts had been made harder this year to ensure that the new Hall was not overcrowded so there was only an entry of 44 for Miss B. Sedorski to judge, however this was

made up for by the standard of entries and at the end of 3½ hours judging her Best of Breed winner was Susan and John Gaskell's bitch Mayson Canasta (by Ch. Gaywyn Kingson X Darmar She's a Lady) with Mellie Holland's dog CH. NOONSUN NEW SEEKER (by Ch. Kennelgarth Edrick X Noonsun Leeding Lady) a very worthy Reserve Best of Breed.

Although the Gaskell's bitch had already won 3 C.C.'s last year all had been whilst a puppy, the third was won when she was only a matter of days under 12 months but by our Kennel Club rules a puppy cannot become a Champion no matter how many C.C.'s it may gain - it must win a further C.C. once it is out of puppy hood, so at best Canasta received her accolade at this premier show and I'm sure the Owen family were very happy.

The general consensus of opinion taken after the show seems to be to move it to the new Exhibition Hall at Birmingham which is in the Midlands and almost the centre of England. However I wondered what those of you who come over to Britain for Crufts felt about this? When you come over do you also want to take in theaters and other shows, museums, the sights and the ladies, of course, to do some shopping! How would you feel about a Very early start, an hour and a half train journey by Intra-City Express after a taxi to the station and to have to stay in Birmingham over night if you wished to attend both days. If anyone would care to express any opinions, either way, I'll be happy to pass them onto Crufts Secretary, there are always so many overseas visitors that I'm sure they would be happy to take their views into consideration also.

Crufts got considerable T.V. coverage in the weeks leading up to the Show with short half hour weekly programmes on smaller shows that are held up and down the Country including evening "friendly" shows. Sanction shows as they are called here - where all breeds compete for the judge to pick an overall Best, a form of variety class except that a Scottish Terrier may be competing against a Great Dane in one round and or Afghan Hound in the next if he should Beat the Great Dane!

These were followed on the Sunday directly after Crufts with a three quarter hour programme covering All Breeds through the groups up to the final Best in Show. Then on the following Sunday there was a programme of half an hour on the Obedience ring, this proved very popular with the general public, whilst mention in the general T.V. news on both Friday and Saturday winnings gave short excerpts including the winner. All this was a considerable improvement on previous years so we must hope it will continue in future years.

2. Annual Roster: A new method of preparing the Roster and the mailing labels was suggested by Marjorie Cohen. Miriam Stamm restated her Motion, which was tabled at the February, 1979 meeting, to rescind prior action of the Board determining to print the Roster in alternate years. Motion amended by Robert Marshall to direct that the duplicating process suggested by Marjorie Cohen will be used. Carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The Treasurer presented his Report as of May 31, 1979. Cash balance as of that date, including accrued interest, \$20,055.15

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

1. MONTGOMERY COUNTY: Bart Lapin reported that the Valley Forge Sheraton has been booked for the 1979 and 1980 Montgomery County week ends.

2. JUDGES FOR 1980 ROTATING SPECIALTY and MONTGOMERY COUNTY, 1980: Nominations were made and voted upon for judges for Sweepstakes and Regular Classes at each of these Shows. The names will be announced after the judges have accepted and AKC approval has been given.

3. REGIONAL CLUBS REPRESENTATIVES' MEETING: Motion by Robert Marshall that the following be printed in the Bagpiper:

"The Board notes with concern that expert opinion appears to indicate a prevalence of von Willebrand's Disease in the Breed. The Board supports the testing program, but at this point, the Board has not endorsed the establishment of any Registries."

Second and carried

Peggy Burge also suggested that it be brought to the attention of the members that the Board strongly urges those interested in using any particular dog in their breeding program to make contact directly with the owner of that dog.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

1. CLARIFICATION AND AMPLIFICATION OF THE SCOTTISH TERRIER STANDARD: The members of the Board examined the first drawings presented to be used as the illustrations and made suggestions for some changes to the Committee.

2. REPRINTS OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY AND ROTATING SPECIALTY CATALOGS: Dr. Kirk has negotiated with the Superintendent of the Montgomery County Shows to assist us with the material for the reprints of the Catalog. This is expected to reduce costs of mailing these to the members.

3. JOHN MURPHY MEMORIAL TROPHY: The Treasurer, H.J. Weiner reported that funds for this trophy, which were to be provided by individual members, are now exhausted. Motion by Robert Marshall, second by Miriam Stamm, that three Paul Revere Bowls on hand and not needed for trophies at current shows be used to continue this trophy award for three more years. Carried unanimously.

Motion was made, second and carried to dispense with reading the Minutes of the February 10, 1979 Meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

HEALTH BANK COMMITTEE

Barbara Dunham reported two successful testing clinics have been held in California. 219 Scotties have been tested. 77 were tested in Northern California, 67 in a clinic in Southern California, three kennels tested 65, and 10 individuals tested their dogs. With the assistance of Dr. Jean Dodds, Barbara had compiled some figures which reflected that the average figures for the carriers, those affected and those which tested clear were close to the figures compiled so far for the national averages. Barbara distributed copies of the article she has written on this Disease which will appear in the Scottish Terrier Column of the A.K.C. Gazette in July. Her California Club will try to set up clinics for the tests in other breeds. Clinics for all breeds are being conducted in Minnesota and the State of Washington.

Judy Riga reported on the clinic held for the STC of Northern Ohio and Maureen Setter reported that because of some of the airline difficulties their Club had used Federal Express for the shipment of specimens. They felt the slight additional expense was well worth the convenience and guaranteed shipment.

Helen Prince stated that the STC of Greater Washington, D.C. will try to coordinate the tests of their dogs with tests for heartworm, a growing problem in their area, so that blood samples need be taken only once.

Catherine Ridgley reported that all of the dogs in the Dayton area belonging to members of the STC of Greater Dayton had been tested as early as last October and that since then dogs of new members and all puppies in the local area had been tested. Since the members of this Club feel that complete honesty is the only way to deal with this problem they have started a Registry of their members' dogs that

have tested Clear. The Registry will be sent out with their Club's Newsletter. If others wish to be listed in this Registry they should send a three generation pedigree, \$2 to cover costs, and a copy of the Certificate showing that the dog is clear, to Pauline Lay, Secretary STC of Greater Dayton, Ohio. The Certificate will be returned promptly and no percentages or numbers will be included in the Registry.

Other Clubs reporting participation in the tests were the STC of Greater Baltimore, the San Francisco Bay STC and the Greater Miami Scottish Terrier Club.

It was pointed out that the purpose of Dr. Dodds' grant is research for the benefit of human beings. (Note: In her talk before the dinner on June 2nd Dr. Dodds stated that her research is in Comparative Coagulation in Vascular Disease). We who own Scotties are able to benefit from her research. Anyone interested in holding a clinic to have a group of dogs tested may, if they wish, contact the San Francisco Bay STC or the STC of California each of which have conducted successful ones.

There was a lengthy discussion on the point that some people, in certain areas have been and are reluctant to participate in the tests, fearing that their names and those of their dogs will be made public by careless gossip. Everyone present felt that there should be confidentiality between the laboratory and the owner of the dogs, and that information on the results should be distributed by the owner of the dogs only, but one way to defeat those who would spread gossip (about vonWillebrand's or anything else, for that matter) is REFUSE TO LISTEN AND REFUSE TO SPREAD IT. Many of those present felt also that an honest approach to this is the only intelligent way to deal with the problem, and that by each individual owner taking a direct, honest approach, von Willebrand's Disease will be eliminated in a short span of time.

## 2. Infectious Canine Enteritis Caused by Corona-Like Virus

The researchers at Cornell University responded to Mrs. Ridgley's offer to have our Clubs answer questionnaires on this by stating that they had enough responses to this particular inquiry, but they were appreciative of our offer and would like our cooperation on future surveys. However, if anyone has had particular problems with this virus they would particularly like to hear from you.

The San Francisco Bay STC supports the program on this being conducted at U. of C. at Davis, California. There is some thought that this may be some other sort of virus, and further tests are expected to be completed in a year. The U. of C. would welcome contributions.

## 3. Cancer in Scottish Terriers

This is another area where the Health Bank Committee is seeking to build up information. Bart Lapin has contacted doctors at the University of Pennsylvania where they are doing extensive work on this and hopes to have more to report in October.

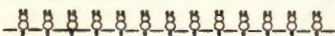

# Vet's Call

## Protect Your Dog Against the Corona Virus.

**T**HERE HAS been some concern recently, especially among dog breeders and those who show dogs, concerning a few outbreaks of corona virus diarrhea in dogs. Some of the initial incidences were in collie shows, where some reported cases resulted in death. It is almost certain that this disease, corona virus diarrhea, and another, parvovirus diarrhea, have been with us for some time, but it is only recently that they have been recognized as a specific cause of canine diarrhea.

As is the case with quite a few human and animal diseases, the signs of this disease are shared by many others, and thus are not easily attributed to a specific cause.

Corona virus diarrhea is a highly contagious disease of dogs, readily transmitted between dogs by contact, with varying degrees of severity and duration. It is believed that the virus is present in the feces of infected dogs, and this, along with virus particles dispersed in the air, is the means of transmission. Typically observed are such signs as lethargy, a decrease in appetite, and soft stools. The onset of disease is often very sudden, and may be preceded or accompanied by vomiting. The soft stools are usually very fetid in odor, and may be of an orange color. Blood or mucus may be seen in the stool. Fever is usually not present. Outward signs of the disease usually run their course in a week to ten days, but may linger up to three to four weeks, with relapses possible. As stated earlier, the disease is highly contagious, especially between dogs in close contact. Young dogs are especially sensitive to the disease, and may die suddenly.

Parvovirus diarrhea also affects dogs of all ages, and is more severe in puppies than adults. Vomiting is a frequent sign and this, along with a loss of appetite, may result in rapid dehydration. The stool may appear to have a gray or yellow-gray coloration, and may contain blood. Fever is often present. Unlike typical corona virus diarrhea, a decreased white blood cell count is often associated with parvovirus infection. Young pups with parvovirus infection may develop a shocklike syndrome, with death occurring within a few days of signs of the disease.

The techniques for rapid and accurate diagnosis of either corona or parvovirus diarrhea are only presently being developed. Electron microscopic examination of feces, or of viral organisms grown on cell cultures, is the only definitive method currently available. Research is being conducted now in an attempt to develop a test to detect the presence in the blood of antibodies directed against the virus.

Treatment for corona and parvovirus diarrheas is at present directed at correcting the symptoms of the disease since no specific therapy against the viruses is known yet. Treatment consists of fluid therapy to replace the fluids lost during the vomiting and diarrhea. Intestinal coating agents such as Pepto-Bismol® or Kaopectate® and antimotility drugs may be of benefit. Most important is resting the animal, keeping him warm, and preventing stress (which has been shown to exacerbate the disease).

Prevention of the spread of these diarrheal diseases is probably as important as the treatment. Affected dogs should be isolated and the premises should be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected. Nolvasan and iodine-containing shampoos are effective sanitizing agents.

It is important to stress that the signs and symptoms of corona or parvovirus diarrhea are very similar to those of other types of diarrhea. Other kinds one must consider include nervous diarrhea, intestinal parasitism, diarrhea following changes in diet, bacterial enteritis, pancreatitis, toxic substances, canine hemorrhagic gastroenteritis (HGE), and food allergy. Blood samples, stool specimens, and a thorough history of possible exposure to infection can be of great help in determining the cause of canine diarrhea.

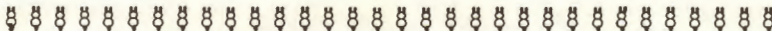
