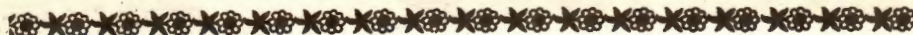

SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SCOTTISH  
TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA

HOLIDAY INN BISCAIYNE, MIAMI, FLORIDA - JANUARY 19, 1980

The President called the meeting to order at 3:30 P.M.

Motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to dispense with reading the minutes of the October 6, 1979 Meeting.

RECORDING SECRETARY'S REPORT:

The Resolution of the Board clarifying the intent of the proposal to add Section 2(g) to Article III of the By-Laws was reported submitted to the American Kennel Club. This change in the By-Laws passed by vote of the membership and has now been reviewed by AKC and placed in its approved file.

Results of the proposal to amend Article I, Section 2 of the By-Laws to raise annual dues were: Ballots were mailed to 681 members. Within the time allowed, 416 ballots were cast. 337 were votes in favor of the amendment; 79 were votes against. The Amendment passed.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT: Correspondence received since the last Board Meeting was read.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The bank balance as of January 15, 1980 was \$15,514.46. This figure includes the Stalter bequest which is a strictly restricted fund.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

AMPLIFICATION AND CLARIFICATION OF THE SCOTTISH TERRIER STANDARD:

Mr. Graham, Chairman of the Committee for this work reported that it should be ready for distribution before June.

NEW BUSINESS:

FORMAT FOR THE BAGPIPER: Jackie Seelbach, the new Editor for the Bagpiper will assume her duties after the April issue is published. Suggestions for a change in format have been made.

Ron Giese moved, Dick Seelbach seconded that Louise Ellsworth and Ann Landry be appointed Contributing Editors for the Bagpiper, on a yearly basis. Motion carried unanimously.

Miriam Stamm suggested that the final issue of the Bagpiper each year list all of the Trophy winners for the year as well as the winners of all of the Specialty Shows during the year.

S.T.C.A. HISTORIAN: Robert Marshall moved, the motion was seconded, that Jackie Seelbach be appointed Club Historian. Motion carried.

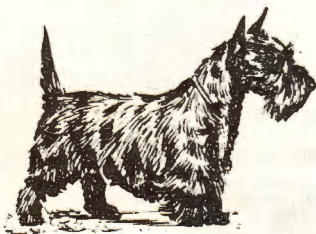

ILLINOIS HB 2590 was introduced to amend the Animal Welfare Act of Illinois concerning the sale of dogs and puppies, and also to require that dog dealers provide proof of pedigree. This new bill reads: Se.302.2 No dog dealer shall separate a puppy from its mother, for the purpose of sale, until such puppy has attained the age of 8 weeks. All dog dealers shall maintain records of the the origin and sale of all dogs, and such records shall be made available for inspection by the Secretary upon demand. Such records must contain proof in proper form of purebreds and their pedigree, and evidence of such proof be provided to any person acquiring a dog from a dealer.
