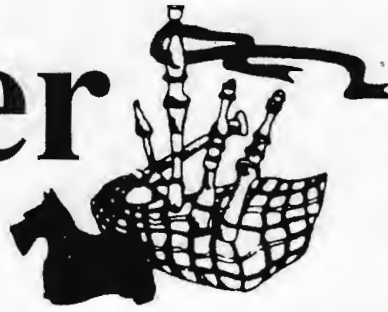

I has been our pleasure to exhibit "Lucky" in Canada and the United States for the past three and a half years. While each of us feels that our own dog has features that make it "best," one of the nicest things about showing Lucky is the very positive response she has generated with breeders. The consensus is that she is a beautiful, typey creature...sound in every respect. She owes that to her many quality laden ancestors.

In Canada, breeder-owner handled, Lucky has won 18 all-breed Bests in Show and two all-terrier specialty shows (under breeder-judges Jim Reynolds and Sandra Goose Allen). In 1991, while we were raising puppies, we tried Lucky with Bergit for a couple of months. In just that short time, Lucky won several groups, placed in many more, and was ranked among the top winning Scotties in the U.S. Since Bergit was committed to give first call to another terrier in 1992, we decided to restrict Lucky's American outings to specialty show weekends. Exhibited at eight specialties, her record was: BISS at both nationals (Montgomery County and Rotating under Dora Lee Wilson and Jerry Roszman, respectively; BISS at STCs of Tampa Bay and California (under Elaine Young and Shirley Justus, respectively; and BOS at Stcs of Baltimore and Chicago.

Again, she won and placed in groups, with the highlight being Group 2nd at Montgomery County. She will finish the year once again among the top Scotties (breed points)...not bad for a dog probably shown on less than 30 occasions!

Lucky is taking a break from dog shows. Puppies are expected this Spring by Brookhill Brindle Brat.

Our heartfelt thanks to everyone who said such nice things about Lucky and to Bergit Coady, who helped us achieve what every Scottie breeder dreams of doing.

President's Message

December 1992



It's a new year and a new look. We are anticipating that you will be as thrilled with the *Bagpiper's* new look as we are. Please join me in wishing the *Bagpiper* and those involved in its "being," a super abundance of success and continued support of the membership.

As I write this message, occasionally gazing out the window, (this is the day the destructful Nor-Easter hit the Eastern coast), I wonder what the New Year will hold for the Scottish Terrier Club of America, for us, for our dogs, and for the sport of exhibiting dogs. something. An individual member's dues barely cover the yearly expenses for that member.

Cost of publishing the *Bagpiper* have and will continue to be prudently reduced making our official publication cost efficient. If costs for the *Bagpiper* begin to rise, steps will be taken immediately to forestall a reoccurrence of recent events. A yearly budget will be adopted by the Board and will be strictly enforced. This budget will include all aspects of the STCA.

Several major subjects will be included in the agenda. Your Board is working to make the Scottish Terrier Club of America the Club you wish it to be. I do hope it is common knowledge that all members of the STCA Board pay all their expenses, such as air fare, ground transportation, hotels and meals, when attending Board meetings. Many take unpaid days off work, many must hire someone to dog or baby sit. There are just so many hours to be spent at a Board meeting, and not all decisions on various subjects can be reached during the time allowed. The Board will once again invite members to suggest names of Judges for Mont-

gomery County 1995 and the Rotating Specialty in 1996. Last time members were asked to submit names, a mere 33 members responded. If the poor response continues the opportunity for members to have a say in selecting judges will be discontinued. There are three types of members: those who make things happen, those who watch things happen, and those who say "What Happened?" Which type are you?

In closing I'd like to wish you and yours a happy, healthy and prosperous New Year. Let us resolve to strive toward the betterment and protection of our beloved Scotties, to encourage as well as practice good sportsmanship, and to take an active interest in the STCA. If you have a worthy idea, or suggestion you would like to share with the Board, jot it down and send it to a member of the Board or to the Corresponding Secretary, Diane Zollinger, we need and want your input. Let us know what you would like for the future of your Club.

Enjoy the "new" *Bagpiper*. We'll see everyone in April, when the Clan gathers for the 1993 Rotation Specialty, hosted by the STC of Greater Atlanta.

Scotties Try The Pilot Hunting Tests

In Spring 1991, we received information about the pilot Small Terrier and Dachshund Hunting Tests developed in California. To show our support for future AKC recognition of the sport, we decided to hold the tests at our fall terrier trial. Under the proposed rules, there are four hunting tests. The first two tests - an optional Preliminary Test and a Junior Hunter Test - are similar to the Novice and Open Classes at an American Working Terrier Association terrier trial. The other two tests - the Senior and Master Hunter tests - have added features intended to provide an increasingly greater challenge for the dogs.

Fortunately, while we were organizing our construction and planning committee, the Garden State All Terrier club hosted an AWTA trial plus the Senior and Master Hunter Tests. We couldn't pass up the opportunity to get some experience with the Hunting Tests before trying them ourselves.

Five of us took 14 Scotties to the Garden State trial. Five of our Scotties had earned their Certificates of Gameness from the AWTA several years before, but this was the first AWTA trial for the other nine. We are proud to say that four of the nine earned their Certificates of Gameness that day - **Ayrlawn Elizabeth I of Hiwood**, **Seanachie Gold-**

en Bear, Working Ch.*, **Munro's Dark Chunk O'Chocolate, Working Ch.**, and my ten-year-old, **Ch. Alohascott Dark Dandy, CD, Working Ch.**, who not only earned his Certificate of Gameness, but also was Best in Breed reaching the rats in six seconds in the Certificate Class.

Just as we were finishing lunch, the breeze became a strong wind and an electrical storm with heavy, heavy rain sent us racing for our cars. The storm lasted just long enough to thoroughly wet the dogs and owners and make lots of mud for us to contend with the rest of the day. Even with the storm delay, our Scots were eager to try the hunting tests.

The Senior Hunter Test was first. Each dog was released 15 feet from the tunnel entrance. The 30-foot tunnel had three right-angle turns and a ten-foot false exit/entrance set at the second corner. The unscented false exit/entrance had one right-angle turn.

The dog had to enter the tunnel at the main entrance, but he could exit and re-enter the tunnel without penalty so long as he re-entered at the same entrance that he had exited. After entering the tunnel, the dog had to reach the quarry within thirty seconds and then "work" the quarry continuously for ninety seconds.

*A Working Championship can be earned at Potomac Cairn Terrier Club sanctioned terrier trials and is recognized by STCA. A score of 100 in the Open Class at three trials is required for a Working Championship.

Only a few dogs qualified and two of them were our Scotties - **Seanachie Golden Bear and Ch. Alohascott Dark Dandy**. Several of the other Scotties did everything right but took too long to reach the quarry, so didn't qualify.

The Master Hunter Test presented a new challenge for our Scotties. For this test, the dog was released twenty feet from the tunnel entrance. Again, the tunnel was thirty feet long with three right-angle turns. In addition, there was a four-foot side tunnel with no exit. This side tunnel was set at the second turn. It held a pile of scented bedding material to simulate the bedroom area found in most natural dens. The entrance to the main tunnel was marked with a mound of dirt that was at least four inches higher than the top of the tunnel, which provided a sharp incline into the earth.

After being released, the dog had two minutes to find the hidden tunnel entrance, investigate the bedding area

and reach the quarry. A penalty was assessed if the dog failed to remain in the bedding area for twenty seconds on the way to the quarry. Once the dog reached the quarry, he had to "work" the prey continuously for three minutes. As soon as the dog had completed the working portion of the test, the judge placed a solid partition at the end of the tunnel, removed the quarry and instructed the handler to recall the dog. That involved walking to the tunnel entrance and calling the dog out of the tunnel. The dog had a maximum of two minutes to exit the tunnel.

Only four dogs qualified in the test, but, again, one of them was a Scottie - my **Munro's Dark Chunk O'Chocolate**. Several of our other Scotties did quite well too. They found the tunnel with ease but stayed in the bedroom area too long, so didn't make the time limit to the quarry.

While a score of 100 is required to qualify in the tunnels at all other terrier trials and in the Senior Hunter Test as well, the scoring of the Master Hunter Test is different. A dog has to receive a specified minimum number of points

for each part of the test and the total score has to be at least 75 to qualify in that test.

When the trial ended, a totally exhausted and very muddy crew piled in to our vans for the long trip home. Our success and the experience we had gained regarding the hunting tests made the long day worthwhile. We were now confident that we could handle a successful hunting test trial come November.

After weeks of planning and preparation, the time for our trial finally arrived. We had a gloriously sunny and warm autumn, but the weather took a decided turn for the worse on our trial weekend - penetrating cold, rain (often heavy), strong winds and lots of mud. However, the dedication and perseverance of terrier owners is the greatest! Despite the dreadful weather, all but two of our 87 entries came to the trial.

Needless to say, we didn't have many qualifying scores that day. The heavy rain and crosswinds played havoc with the dogs' concentration and scenting.

By the time we started the Master

Hunter Test, our judge was kneeling in three inches of cold, muddy water. Since we all know that our terriers are the very smartest, we were not surprised that many of the dogs preferred to stay in the bedroom extension, since that part of the tunnel was filled with bedding material and likely was fairly warm and dry.

Most of us owners looked in vain for a warm, dry spot all day. Some of the assortment of rain gear worn by the owners proved to be less than adequate in a downpour, and some so-called "waterproof" boots leaked badly. Nevertheless, everyone made light of the discomforts and smiled through the worst Mother Nature hurled in our direction.

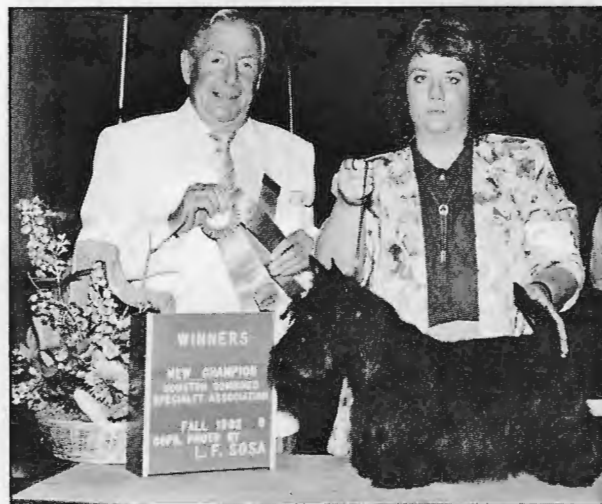

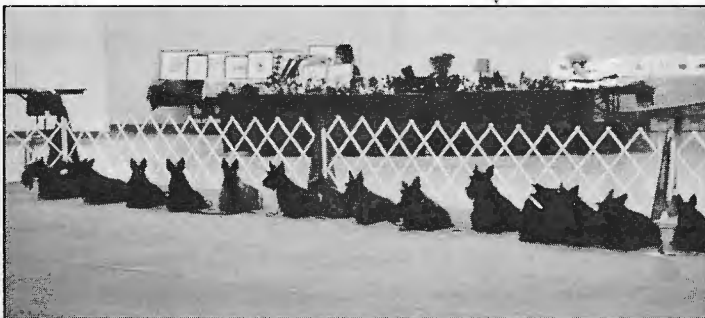

LYME DISEASE TODAY

LYME DISEASE SEASON IS ALMOST UPON US!!!

We have a club member, Bobbie Richmond, who was stricken by Lyme disease at a dog show a couple of years ago and went untreated for a long time. She was instrumental in collecting this information and wants to share it with Scottie club members so that everyone will know the signs and symptoms, diagnosis and proper treatment and prevention techniques for Lyme disease.

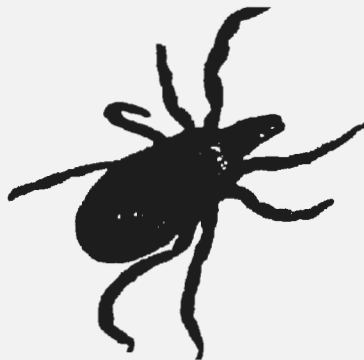
The disease is named LYME disease as it was first diagnosed and reported in Lyme, Connecticut, in 1977, where an unusually large group of children demonstrated signs of acute rheumatoid arthritis. The rural setting and the discovery that each child displayed a characteristic skin rash, Erythema Migrans, implicated certain ticks as the carriers of the disorder. It soon became apparent that Lyme disease was a multisystem illness that affects primarily the skin, nervous system, heart and joints. The Center for Disease Control in Atlanta states that Lyme disease is the most common vector borne infection in the United States. From 1980 to 1988, 13,795 cases were reported, primarily in three areas of the country; from Massachusetts to Maryland in the northeast, Wisconsin, Michigan and Minnesota in the midwest and California and Oregon in the west. The disease is widely found in Europe, particularly Germany, Austria, Switzerland, France and Sweden. It has also been found in Russia, from the Baltics to the Pacific Ocean, and in China, Japan and Australia. The infection is usually acquired when nymphal ticks feed between May and July, but only a small number of patients remember the bite because of the

small size of the tick. Adult ticks occasionally transmit the disease in the autumn. People of all ages and both sexes are affected.

There are three stages of Lyme disease. Stage one is the hardest to diagnose but most successful therapy is achieved here. It begins with a characteristic skin rash seen in about 80% of all cases. The rash looks like a small slightly raised area like a mosquito bite but spreads evenly away from the center becoming reddened on the outside and clear blister-like in the inside. Some patients (18%) may have multiple lesions. This rash is accompanied by a flu-like illness which may include headache, stiff neck, fever, fatigue, nausea, muscle and joint swelling and aching and, occasionally, swollen glands. Stage two is more involved as the spirochete, which causes the disease, becomes widely spread throughout all of the body's systems. The common signs at this time are excruciating headache, neck stiffness and fatigue. Other symptoms may include hives, spreading raised rash, migratory bone and joint swelling and pain, Bell's Palsy, cardiac disorders, including inflammation of the heart muscle (carditis), rate and rhythm changes, depression, memory loss, attention and concentration difficulties, seizures, stroke, en-

cephalitis, spastic paralysis and a Multiple Sclerosis-like syndrome. Stage three is even more involved and few people achieve any kind of lasting therapy if they have reached this stage before seeking treatment. The diagnosis of the disease remains difficult. There are a number of very high tech blood, urine and stool tests that can be performed but they are not perfect and patient history and observation remain the best diagnostic tools physicians have. The disease is transmitted from mother to fetus. Wild animals do not seem to be affected but the disease has been found in domestic animals; horses, dogs and cattle.

Treatment is divided into three categories. Tetracyclines (including doxycycline) are effective when used on patients displaying stage one symptoms but to avoid relapses or treatment failures they must be given for long periods of time, six to eight months. Tetracyclines do not enter the CSF (cerebral spinal fluid) and so are very poor therapy choices for stage two or three Lyme disease. Amoxicillin has been shown to be the best of the penicillins to treat stage two Lyme disease. It is bactericidal (kills the bacteria) not bacteriostatic (stops the growth) and it penetrates the CSF, preventing such symptoms as seizure, memory loss, depression, etc. Suprax, Biaxin, Zithromax and Ceftriaxone are some of the newer antibiotics being used that promise great hope to those suffering from long term side effects of the disease. Patients are warned to eat a well balanced diet, but most take a multi-vitamin and B complex daily. Treatment failures will occur if the patient: 1) fails to get proper rest; 2) is non compliant with medication; or 3) uses alcohol on a regular basis.

THE BEST TREATMENT IS PREVENTION!

PROPERTY: There is a produce on the market called "Damminix". It is a synthetic pyrethrin and comes as cardboard tubes that have cotton balls inside. The cotton has been treated with the insecticide. Place them around the property and mice will carry them off to their nests. This will deprive the tick of needed hosts. Do not spray your property because studies have shown this to be ineffective and very destructive to aquatic life.

CLOTHING: Wear long pants (cuffs tucked into socks), long sleeves, smooth clothing, like windbreakers, not knits. Light colored clothing will show up any ticks more easily. You may choose to spray your clothing lightly with "Permanone" (another pyrethrin substance). Be sure clothing is thor-

oughly dried before wearing it.

SKIN: Insect repellents that contain "DEET" are somewhat effective, when applied to the arms, legs and around the neck. Do not use repellent over large portions of your body as it can be absorbed through the skin and cause toxicity.

GENERAL: A quick call to poison control cautioned that children under the age of six put everything in their mouth and should not have "DEET" or "Permanone" applied to body or clothing.

Check frequently when you are out to see if you have collected any ticks.

Check pets carefully for ticks after dog shows and walks through the woods and fields.

Toxicologists inform me that the concentration of pyrethrins in "Damminix" and "Permanone" range from 7.4% to 3.1%, not unusually high

for these insecticides. The concentrations of pyrethrins in Mycodex shampoo is 0.3%. Another fact about pyrethrins is that they have a much more lethal affect on insects than mammals. I'm sure they are right, but I remember something similar said about DDT. USE YOUR JUDGMENT!!!!

HOW TO REMOVE AN ATTACHED TICK: Using tweezers (not your fingers!), grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible and pull straight out. Do not try to burn them, or use chemicals (like hair spray!) or grasp them by the body, as this may cause the tick to inject more chemicals into the skin. Tape the tick to a card and write on it the date and location of the bite and where you were bitten, then call your physician or vet. Remember, the sooner the tick is removed, the less likely you are to get ill. □

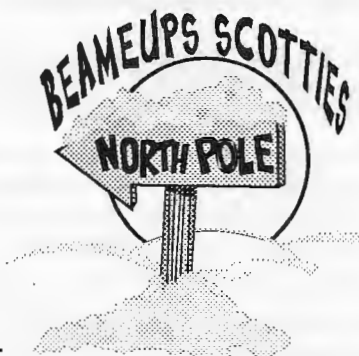

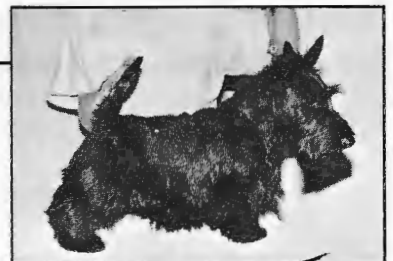

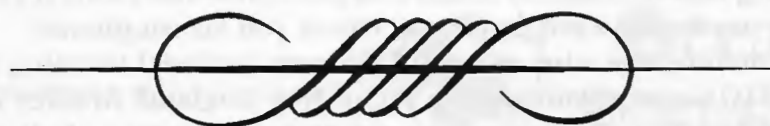

1992 STCA SWEEPSTAKES CRITIQUE

What a thrill it was to be able to judge the sweepstakes at Montgomery County. Earlier in the day, I was asked if I were excited. Actually, no! It wasn't until I walked into the room that the anxiety began to build. It was absolutely FUN! I appreciate the assistance of my capable stewards, Bill Berry and Barbara Anthony. Thanks!

The facility is fabulous and provides a place where people can SEE the dogs. I have too often seen those furry little spots under a dark tent in a down-pour of rain where the spectators as well as the dogs were uncomfortable.

I do not intend to offend anyone or their dogs; I am proposing my reasons for my placements. I suppose one begins at the beginning. Before I began to judge, my hope was to be able to end my assignment feeling that I had been consistent in selecting the best Scottish Terrier.

My first class of young boys held some quality entries. My first prerequisite is a low-to-the-ground, typically balanced dog. My class winner met my criteria--smooth mover and nicely balanced. He was moderately short, low-to-the-ground, had a nice tail carriage and a clean head with small, well-placed ears. Standing still, he looked good and moving, he still had it. My second place winner was different in the sense that he was not as together as

my first puppy, but his soundness attracted my attention. He moved true and smooth. Not elegant, but a working terrier style. My third place puppy had a great time. He's not quite reserve enough to carry it off, but he has some exceptional qualities--nice body, a clean head. From a teacher's standpoint, he reminds me so much of the class clown. My fourth place pup was a brindle lad who, like the third place, didn't quite get it all together. He's a nicely bodied pup, low and nicely put together. He has a pleasing expression and will make a fine adult.

The puppies always bring a lot of quality into a sweepstakes. This class was no exception. The type, in general, was excellent. My first impression--I had to sort. Movement would be the starting point. I was looking for the ideal. One can tell so much by watching. On the table, some of the entries caught my attention but fell away on the individual move. My eventual winner was, without a doubt, what I felt to be the top of the class. There is nothing I can say that would relish such a delectable dish--a standout. My second place youngster was not shabby. Both first and second places were good movers; first carries herself just a little better than second. Beautifully presented and nicely balanced; she garnered a close second. My third place

bitch was a very nicely balanced Scottie. Fourth was another young lady, short, nicely presented. Third and fourth captured their placements due to their type. All of these girls could have a bright future.

The junior puppy dogs brought some maturity to the ring. It was obvious that these guys were older. The winner was a handsome brindle dog that had a lot of quality. I also liked my second place winner and while he too had a terrific body--solid as a rock--and was nicely balanced, the first place winner edged him out on some minor technicalities. My third and fourth places were nicely balanced but third winning over fourth on my preference of size.

In the junior bitches, I found a brindle bitch in the blue. She was an exceptional young lady, low to the ground, a pleasing eye and expression so important to the breed, pretty ears, pleasing mover and carrying a nice jacket. Second was a young black bitch--maturity will help her. A lovely show animal, I found her needing more width. I prefer first place's expression. My third and fourth place winners were very typey bitches, very low. Third placed over fourth because I felt third beat her on the move. Both bitches represented the type one breeds for.

The senior dog class found a very nice dog as number one. First and second place were totally different styles, both finding their place in the standard. I placed the first dog over the second as I prefer the leaner head and neck. Third place was a brindle dog with some clean lines over a bigger, but balanced dog for fourth.

First place from the senior bitches went to a bigger bitch than I would normally prefer. I was incredibly surprised when I examined this bitch as she was very low to the ground, not what one would imagine when looking at her from across the room. She was a true mover and had a pleasant expression. My second place was a striking wheaten, a show girl. I placed her in the red as I felt the first place winner a little better in a couple of areas. My third place winner was a nice bitch, balanced. She was not making the

most of herself on this day--so typical of most Scottie bitches. Fourth was a nicely balanced bitch who showed well.

We made it! Now, the final decision. My aim at the onset was, hopefully, to have three good representatives of the breed of similar type. I felt good about it--the dog and the two bitches. All three were exceptional. The older bitch fell to the younger one as she was not quite up as I would like to have seen. That narrowed the field down to the dog and bitch. The dog didn't give me the lines and curves I was looking for. The puppy girl had it on her own. I would have placed her BEST even if there had been no thunderous applause. As I mentioned at dinner, her only fault was that she didn't belong to me. At that moment, she did!

I must comment about the senior

dogs and bitches. I find it sad that the youngsters so often outshine the older kids as so many seniors have already finished. By eighteen months, they have retired from the show ring. To me, they, too, deserve to share the spotlight in sweepstakes competition.

I was pleased with the overall type that was brought to me. I found fault with a number of youngsters on the move--coming and going. Heads were good with few extremes. Grooming was good. I would like to see less furnishings on our low-legged terriers. I would prefer to see legs rather than flowing furnishings coming at me in the ring. They can all be improved with careful plucking. We need to work on this. What looks very good on the table can always be improved on the ground.

The breed has had a great past and will continue to have a great future! □

Health and Education

By Gail Gaines

When committee choices were offered, I was delighted to have the opportunity to work on Health and Education. After 30 years of trying to breed for healthy Scotties I am no closer to that goal than when I started. My intentions were good but knowledge was obviously inadequate. As a breed we have our health problems. In talking with other breeders there is great frustration in trying to deal with the health issues. It is certainly not clear that there is one path to healthy breeding. Many of us have been hoping some miracle of modern scientific research, such as "gene mapping" might provide the solution. I may, but can we afford to wait that long to try and improve our stock? In the meantime, I would like to propose two projects that might be of some use.

First

I would like to collect information on health issues about which I have heard concern expressed. Frequently, people who have pets and show dogs will approach breeders about CMO, swimmers, Scottie Cramp, etc. Their vets may have read about these, but chances are they do not have much first-hand experience with the conditions. Owners may be told the puppy must be destroyed when, in fact, it can live a relatively or perfectly normal life. For a number of years I have kept files of different veterinary articles which I have made available to people who inquire. Upon request for information, I mail a copy of the articles I have, asking that the person reproduce them and return the original to me to be available to someone else. So far this has worked well.

I would like to suggest that we expand these files to cover more conditions and as much authoritative infor-

mation as possible. You, as breeders, have probably run across helpful information that would be invaluable to someone just meeting a problem for the first time. We could collect this in one place and make it available upon request. I would welcome any solid articles on Cushings Syndrome, swimmers, stomatitis, epilepsy, autoimmune problems, thyroid, VWD, juvenile

cataracts, Demodectic mange or other skin problems.

This would not need to be an expensive project once initial copies of articles were made. Postage would be the biggest expense I foresee.

I talked with Ruth Ann Krause about how this might dovetail with her Genetic Alert Program she discussed in the recent Gazette. We decided the starting place for both programs was in information collection. She would like to take this a step further to provide a summary of what we know in terms of modes of inheritance, treatment, prognosis, etc.

In conjunction with this proposal, Linda Anderson and perhaps others who have access to medical material, will try and present some basic information and a bibliography of articles featuring one condition in each Bag-

pipe, kind of a, "disease of the issue", if you will.

Second

My second proposal is that we investigate the ideas of The Institute for Genetic Disease Control in Animals. This is an open registry program for both healthy and affected dogs. It offers "professional genetic evaluation and scientific support services". Their purpose is not to dictate what dog you do or do not use, but attempts to steer a breeder toward a breeding where it might be predicted you would have some success in eliminating the problem with which you are currently dealing. The program is not in the hands of breeders of Scotties and we would not be reporting to a breeder of Scotties. We would identify a couple of disease areas we would like to work on, then accumulate as much data about diagnostic criteria, age of onset, heritability and similarity of the disease among breeds. If we know these factors, we may be ready to establish a

registry. If not already known, we may begin by developing a Research Data Base.

We would need to develop a "hierarchy of disagreeable genetic traits" to determine which conditions are most important to tackle initially.

This is not a "quick fix" solution but will take a long-term commitment on the part of the club and the breeders.

We are dealing with about 10,000 genes* in dogs. We would be magicians indeed if we balanced them all perfectly, or even well. Most of us would do better if we knew a reasonable way to do so. The purpose of the program is to help us steer around problems through knowledge rather than on a "hit or miss" basis.

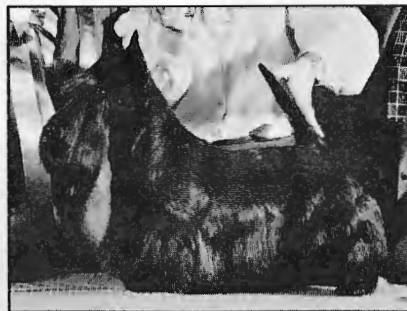

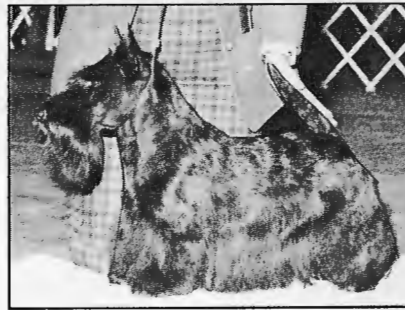

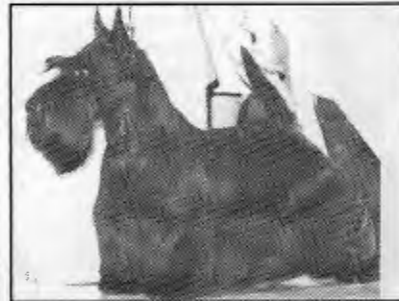
