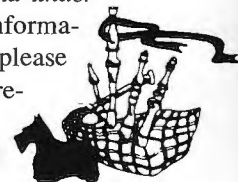

Absent were: Vice-President Ruth Ann Krause and Director Jeanie Jennings.

Corrections of the Minutes of the October 5, 1995 meeting: Omitted from the *Bagpiper* Minutes was the information concerning the price increase of the silver membership pins, from \$5.00 to \$10.00. Trophy donations for Montgomery County 1994 were \$2,700.00; 1995 Montgomery County Trophy donations were \$3,025.00. Jackie Seelbach, Immediate Past President, was in attendance, as she has been at every meeting since leaving office. Corrections of the Annual Dinner Meeting Minutes for October 7, 1995, Marjorie Cohen's name was misspelled. Corrections will be reflected in the permanent files. Dick Seelbach made the motion to accept the Minutes as corrected, Evelyn Kirk seconded the motion, motion passed.

Report of the Corresponding Secretary: Evelyn Kirk states that all judges for the Rotating Specialty and Montgomery County 1996 have accepted and been approved by the AKC.

Report of the Recording Secretary: Written. Discussion from the Board on projected printing and mailing fees for

the Roster. Vandra Huber made the motion that we add E-Mail and Fax numbers to the Membership Roster. Seconded by Joanne Kinnelly, motion passed. The Board voted on October of 1995, approving Charles Lounsbury to serve as the Computer Technician for the STCA. Vandra Huber made the motion that Charles Lounsbury, as the Computer Technician, and his committee, be responsible for a Computer Roster, and requests generated. Cost of Computer Roster disc will be \$10.00 and the person requesting the disc must sign a disclaimer stating that they will not use the Roster for commercial purposes. Seconded by Russ Somma, motion passed. Charles Lounsbury will be contacted to receive E-mail addresses.

Treasurer's Report: Written. Annual Report to be printed in the #1 issue of the *Bagpiper*. Michael Cook made the motion for Jackie Seelbach and Fred Brooks to conduct an in-house audit. Maxine Stickler seconded, motion passed. After discussion from the Board concerning the cost of printing and mailing of the Yearbook, Vandra Huber made a motion that the 1996 Yearbook not be printed. Seconded by Richard Seelbach, motion passed unanimously. The Year 2000 Yearbook will be a special Centennial edition celebrating our 100th Anniversary.

Vice-President's Report: Ruth Ann Krause sent a written report, with a strong suggestion to the Board that the STCA set up guidelines enforcing repercussions when an STCA member allows hotel room destruction caused by their dogs.

AKC Delegate's Report: Vandra Huber made the motion that a letter of support for Dr. Robert Berndt, Board Chairman, be sent to AKC Board Members. Seconded by Fred Brooks, motion passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Advertising: Written report, with a tentative Advertising Packet mail-out date of February 15, 1996, and Advertis-

ing dead-line date of March 15, 1996.

Annual Awards: Maxine Stickler states that she has received nominations for Individual Awards for all three categories. Michael Cook made the motion that the Regional Clubs be polled to see if they would be interested in providing table centerpieces for Montgomery County. This could rotate from club to club annually. Seconded by Fred Brooks, motion passed unanimously.

Annual Awards Tally: Mary Lou Somma submitted written report summarizing how well that committee has the Tallies under control. They are currently working on 3rd quarter reports for 1995.

Bagpiper: Written report. Bonnie Lamphear is working on Issue #1 for 1996. Fred Brooks made the motion to increase the cost of 4 issues of the *Bagpiper* from \$25.00 to \$30.00 for non-members. Seconded by Vandra Huber, motion passed unanimously.

Computer Technician: Charles Lounsbury sent a written report. The Computer Committee will be comprised of Bill Martin, Cindy Cooke, Camille Partridge and Michael Krolewski. Russ Somma made the motion that would allow Charles Lounsbury to set up STCA Home Page, that he be allotted the \$300.00 annual fee, plus a one-time set-up fee, which is not to exceed \$60.00. Content will be limited to Public Information Packet, Resources (such as grooming manuals), *Bagpiper* Subscriptions and Rescue Information via Bill Berry. He is to use only the STCA logo, and any additional content must be approved by the Board. Seconded by Evelyn Kirk, motion carried unanimously.

Education and Health: There was a written report outlining goals set by the Education and Health Committee for 1996, plus achievements for 1995. Vandra Huber made a motion that proposed a \$1,200.00 budget for the Education and Health Committee to hold one seminar at the Rotating Specialty and one seminar



at Montgomery County in 1996, to be paid for with STCA General Funds. Seconded by Russ Somma, 5 for, 5 against, 1 abstention. President voted for the budget approval, motion passed. Let the record show that Michael Cook voted against this motion. Vandra Huber made the motion that the Education and Health Committee would audio tape the two upcoming seminars, and write up summary articles for publication. Seconded by Maxine Stickler, 9 for, 2 against, motion carried. Let the record reflect Michael Cook voted against this motion.

Gazette: Carole Owen reported an update on possible upcoming articles, the Health Survey and its results being the primary subject.

Health Trust Fund: Joanne Kinnelly reports the HTF elected officers at their first brief meeting. They are planning an extensive meeting to be held at the Rotating Specialty.

Historian/Yearbook: Muriel Lee has been in contact with Mary Lou Somma regarding statistics on titles, championships, and top producers.

Illustration of Standard: Michael Cook reports that Jodie Sylvester has been chosen as the illustrator, with a signing of the contract in the very near future.

Judges' Education: Sandra Goose Allen has given one seminar on January 13, 1996 in Florida and she has an upcoming seminar for the Judges' Association to be held April of this year in Georgia.

Legislation Liaison: Susan Clarkson sent a written summary covering legislation proposals for 1995. She reports that many Bills were proposed but few were passed. Most of them concerned "Vicious Dog Law."

Membership Committee: Fred Brooks gave a full report on new applicants.

Obedience Chairperson: Vandra Huber made the motion that the Board approve the judges selection provided by the Obedience Committee. Fred Brooks seconded, motion passed unanimously.

Public Information: Bill Martin reports that requests keep pouring in for Information Packets.

Referral: Evelyn states she has had many calls.

Regional Clubs Representative: Connie Smith felt they had a good turnout for the Regional Clubs meeting held at Montgomery County and she's looking forward to Montgomery County 1996.

Rescue: Bill Berry states its been fairly quiet since October 1995. He has had 12 inquiries.

Specialty Arrangements Coordinator: Eric and Marlene Burgess sent a written report culminating in all the information on the smooth proceedings at Montgomery County.

Sweepstakes Show Secretary: Richard Seelbach presented a written report on Montgomery County Sweeps and Obedience Trial. He thanked all who helped make our shows a success.

Ways & Means: Vandra Huber submitted the information that the silent and verbal auctions brought in approximately \$1,800.00.

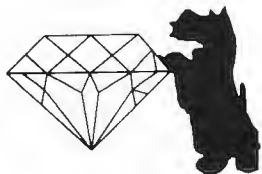

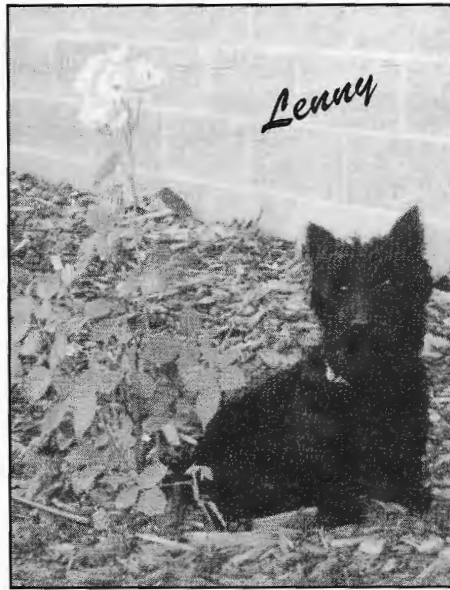

Lenny Lends His Ears

Blackie had spent the first 10 months of his life living outside in a backyard, receiving very little human attention. Although he was a good watch dog, his owner felt that there must be a greater destiny for this sweet Scottish Terrier and turned to Dogs for the Deaf (DFD) of Central Point, Oregon. Living close by, Blackie's owner was able to bring him to the DFD facility for an evaluation and aptitude test by the training staff. Due to his high energy and playfulness he was accepted for the program. His name was changed to Lenny and he began his internship with other canine trainees.

Lenny was in good hands at DFD. This organization has been in existence for 18 years and is the oldest and largest Hearing Dog training center in the United States. DFD is a non-profit agency based in southern Oregon which trains and places Certified Hearing Dogs nationwide. Lenny went through a 6 month intensive training program while at the facility. He was trained to alert individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing to basic environmental sounds such as the smoke/fire alarm, telephone, alarm clock, door knock/doorbell, oven timer, name call, and a baby's cry. Having no obedience training, Lenny was also taught basic commands such as sit, stay, down, down-stay, heel, recalls and boundaries. During his training he was exposed to numerous social situations. Certified Hearing Dogs have the same legal access rights as Guide Dogs and must be able to maintain a professional image when in public. Before leaving DFD, Lenny went grocery shopping, dined in restaurants, went shopping in the mall, delivered mail to the post office, learned to walk around downtown traffic, and was exposed to other public places and situations. Lenny definitely displayed a stubborn streak while in training. However, his teacher saw the "desire to please" in him and stuck with him through the worst of times. Finally, the "battle of wills" was won and he proved to be a dedicated little worker. The time had come to compare waiting list files and select the person



who would best match Lenny and his unique personality.

Richard Velilla-Mirabal is a native Puerto Rican who now lives in Washington State. Having always loved dogs, he decided to apply for a Hearing Dog to assist him with sounds in his home. To apply for one of DFD's specially trained dogs, Richard completed an application form and returned it with a current audiogram. Our Placement Screening Committee carefully reviewed his application and prioritized by need, hearing loss and family situation. DFD then asked one of their Hearing Dog Recipients to conduct an in-home interview with Richard and his roommate Gloria Jochims. The application and interview process is much like adopting a baby. DFD invests much love, time, and money into these very special dogs and wants to be certain that they go to happy, healthy homes.

After their interview, the training department reviewed the entire file and accepted Richard for the program. His file was placed on our waiting list and 6 months later Lenny was selected and placed with him. Once accepted for our program, Richard agreed to meet certain requirements. He was expected to have regular training sessions to keep obedience and sound responses up to standard, provide a fenced area and adequate exercise, provide regular veterinary visits, and Richard was not allowed to have another

dog in the household. Richard's home was full of other types of pets, and Lenny soon learned to not be distracted by the cat, two rabbits, and six birds.

A DFD trainer and Lenny took the trip to Richard's home and began the week long placement. During this time, Richard learned how to reinforce Lenny's training, including sound awareness, obedience, and social skills. Richard's roommate Gloria, who is also deaf, wanted Lenny to alert her to sounds, too. Lenny quickly learned how and when to alert both Richard and Gloria to sounds. At the time, Richard was attending college and Lenny often accompanied him. Some days he goes to work with Gloria at Boeing. They no longer have to worry about being late for the day's activities with Lenny on the job. He is more than happy to alert them to the alarm clock each morning.

DFD has an extensive follow-up program to insure the best possible working relationship with each assistance dog team. Monthly written progress reports are required of the recipients, and each one is responded to by our trainers. DFD also attempts yearly visits in the Recipient's home to assist them with any problems they may be having. Last year's follow-up visit reaffirmed Lenny's trainer's beliefs. Lenny may have been stubborn but his training had stuck with him and he has made two people very happy. This is one little Scottie who found a special purpose in life outside a lonely backyard in southern Oregon.

The total cost of operating DFD comes through contributions from individuals, service clubs, foundations, memorial fund designations, and bequests. Absolutely no funds are received from any government agency.

Breeding Dogs

I recently received a call from a woman who was looking for a stud dog. She has a pet bitch and wanted to raise a litter of her own. "Why?" I wanted to know. "Because she's a wonderful pet and we think she'll make nice puppies." "For whom?" I asked. "People who love Scotties, like me," she replied.

She was not at all receptive to my suggestion that, instead of breeding her bitch, she should consider spaying her. She was disappointed that I had no stud dog to offer. I'm sure that she'll find one.

We've gotten dozens of calls for puppies lately—and not one of them for a boy! Why do the majority of puppy buyers want girls? "It's because females make better pets," they say. And then when I explain that my pet females are all sold with limited registration and spay contracts, their enthusiasm often wanes.

"We want a female we can breed," they say. I'm sure that they'll find one.

Some of the barely disguised anger that I hear when I suggest that they should not become breeders is understandable. "We love all Scotties," is what I read between their lines. "Ours don't have to be beautiful show dogs in order for us to love them." I understand that I must sound like a "dog snob." Who am I to suggest that they not breed their beloved little girl? She's given them so much joy—why not create more little Scotties to spread the joy still further? Are we snobs? Are we some sort of Supremacist who feels that only the beautiful should procreate? Do we resent competition in the buyers' market? In a word, NO! Many of us have shared and continue to share the lives of Scotties who would be out-of-place in the show ring. But the same experience, expertise, care and consideration that goes into breeding for the show ring also goes into those wonderful Scots who, with larger-than-perfect ears, or rolling toplines, or loose elbows, or

soft temperaments, find a place on someone's sofa and in their heart.

"But wait a minute," you say. "I love Scotties, too. What do you think you can do in breeding your bitch that I can't?"

"Maybe nothing," I answer. "But take a minute and see how you would respond to the following."

Have you screened your bitch for vWD? Do you know what it is? Do you know what the consequences of an affected dog are? Do you understand how it's transmitted?

Have you ever seen Scottie Cramp?

Would you recognize a mild episode? Do you know which lines carry it? Does your girl's? Is it a simple autosomal recessive? Something more complex? Is it behind your girl somewhere? How about your chosen stud dog? Is it behind him, as well?

Do you know what brucellosis is? And how a bitch, even a maiden bitch, can contract it? And what effect it will have on her puppies? And her breeding career?

Allergies are a major health problem in Scotties. Few show breeders' dogs suffer from them, as we are careful not to breed animals who might pass such an awful affliction on to their offspring. But lots of pet shop Scotties suffer terribly, as do Scots produced by people without the knowledge required of a reputable breeder. What about your girl? Even if she is

allergy-free, do you know what's behind her? And the stud dog? Might you be producing puppies condemned to a lifetime of suffering and veterinary care?

I'm sure your bitch's temperament is above reproach, or you wouldn't even consider breeding her, but what about her parents? Do you know them? Well? And grandparents, too? And the stud dog's ancestors, as well? A frightening number of Scotties turned in by their owners to dog pounds have snapped at or bitten someone. Why do you suppose this happens so much more often with pet shop dogs?

A Scottie's life span can be 12 or 14 years or even more. Each puppy you bring into the world is your responsibility. For life. Reputable breeders will take back any puppy of their breeding, for any reason, for the life of the dog. Will you?

Reputable breeders are those whose primary goal is the improvement of the breed, in form and function. We don't just try to make pretty Scotties. We study genetics and phenotypes and animal behavior. We plan breedings generations in advance, with an eye toward making better and healthier Scotties. We are serious about this endeavor and expect you to be equally so.

My first Scottie was a pet, produced by a local "backyard" breeder who saw breeding as a nice way to supplement the family income. She was a decent lady, just uninformed. He was by "Jodie McKenna" out of "Liza McKenna." I named him "Andrew McKenna" and was as proud as can be that Ch. Heather Commodore of Edgerstoune was way off at the right-hand edge of his pedigree. He was the joy of my life, and the reason I'm in Scotties 38 years later. He was a loving and happy little fellow who died of kidney failure at the age of 7. So had his father.

So, before you breed your bitch, ask yourself, why? And have a very good answer. □

Prostatic Disease

The following article was written by Dr. Hutchison, who is a co-director of the Animal Clinic Northview in North Ridgeville, Ohio. Internationally recognized for his work with canine frozen semen and canine reproduction, he is also a popular speaker nationally to both breeder and veterinary groups concerning canine reproduction, whelping and pediatrics. The STCA Education and Health Committee will be featuring Dr. Hutchison at our health seminar being presented during Montgomery County weekend in 1996.

Prostatic disease in male dogs is very similar to prostatic disease in male humans. As aging occurs, the prostate responds to a change in testosterone and a change in the ratio of testosterone to estrogen.

The most common prostatic disease seen in the canine is Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia (BPH). The disease is characterized by a swollen, non-painful prostate gland with external signs exhibited by dripping blood from the penis and blood in the ejaculate. Blood is not killing

to spermatozoa. However, enough blood and clotting can inhibit fertility. The disease is non-infectious (infected prostate glands exhibit fever, pain, and pus, not blood) in the ejaculate.

A common mistake is to treat BPH with only antibiotics. Since bacteria are not the causing agent, many owners are frustrated by the non-responsiveness of the disease.

As BPH is a result of hormonal body changes, the proper treatment is one of neutralizing the testosterone's effect on the prostate. This can be accomplished in a number of different manners:

- 1) Neutering - very effective in the treatment of BPH; however, very detrimental to future reproductive potential.
- 2) Estrogens - cause an initial regression in prostate gland size; however, the effects are temporary and rebound enlargement is seen. The estrogens are also very damaging to the spermatozoa and can cause bone marrow suppression.
- 3) Progesterones - currently the treatment of choice. The drugs most commonly used are Ovaban or Megace. The progesterones will cause a shrinking of the gland, stop the bleeding and will not sup-

press the sperm count. The drug is used daily for 21 days, then the male is maintained on a weekly dose. Side effects are minimal and results are outstanding.

If one suspects prostatic disease in a breeding male, a veterinarian knowledgeable in reproductive problems should be consulted. Ultrasound is essential for a definitive diagnosis of BPH. The ultrasound also allows one to access cystic formation within the prostate gland itself. Males over 3 years of age can show signs of BPH and most males over 6 years of age will show Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia on a biopsy. Many males with BPH will show no clinical signs until they are around bitches in season, then the clinical signs of bleeding, etc. will flare up.

Prostatic abscesses and tumors do occur in the male dog. These diseases are characterized by pain, fever, and systemic illness and show distinctive changes in the gland when evaluated with the ultrasound. Neutering in the male does not prevent prostatic cancer. □

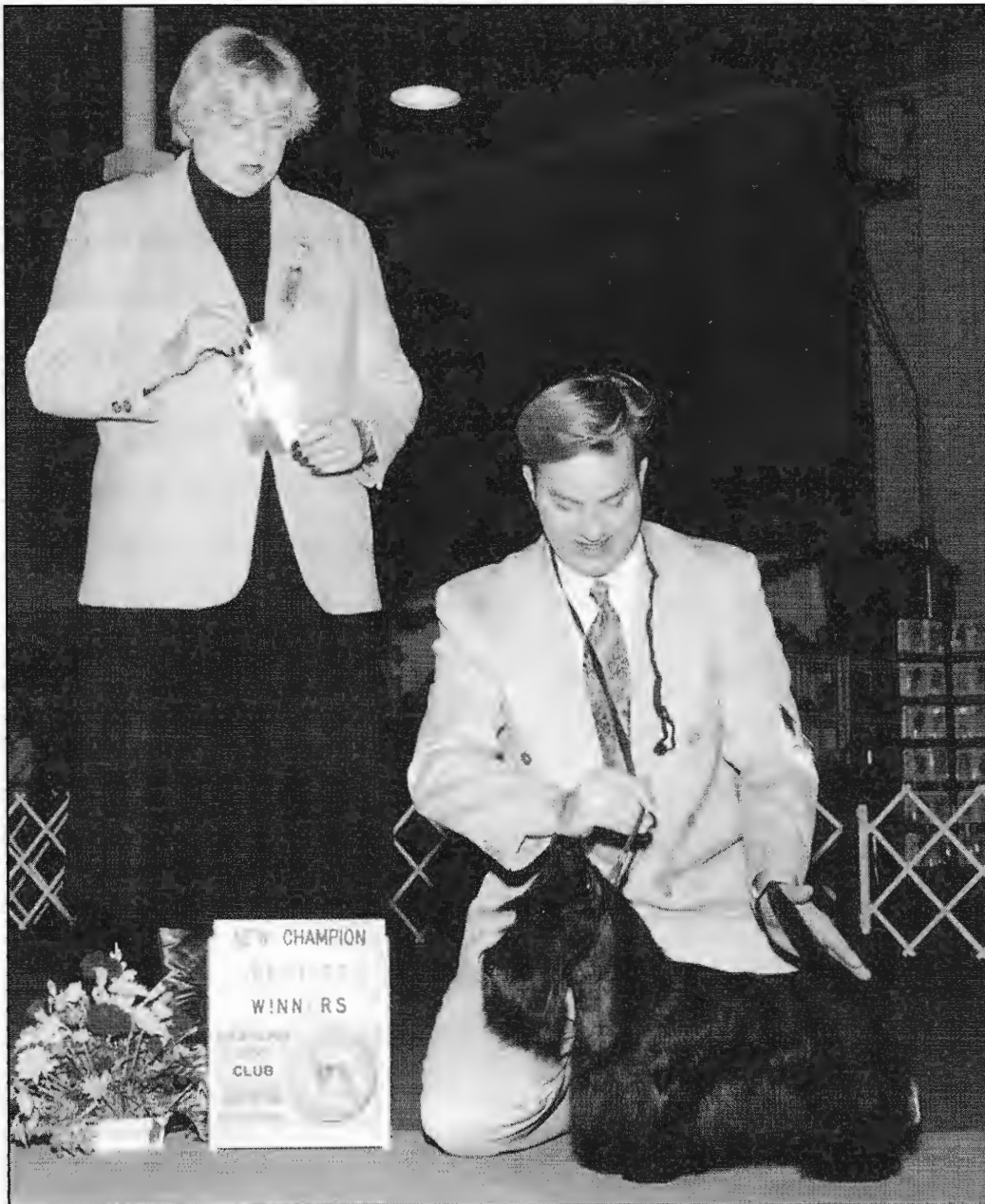

Stud Dog Contracts

*For simplicity, the term **Breeder**, where capitalized, shall refer to the owner of the bitch in a contractual agreement. The term **Owner**, where capitalized, shall refer to the owner of the stud dog.*

Now that the holidays are over and spring is around the corner, breeders are reviewing the winter issue of the *Bagpiper* to select a stud dog. They will pour over the flattering photos and the sometimes-inflated prose, trying to choose the perfect mate for their bitches. The stud dog owner will answer phone calls and letters asking him to gaze into the future and predict the results of a mating between his dog and a bitch he may never have seen. Once the breeder has selected a stud dog, she and the dog's owner will start hoping that the bitch gets pregnant, that she delivers successfully and that the puppies will be stars.

Since the majority of these matings will take place without a written stud contract, why is it important to have one? First of all, because putting things in writing forces people to anticipate all possibilities. This is particularly important when one of the parties (and this is usually the owner of the bitch) is a novice. An inexperienced breeder may, for example, be unaware that it is customary for the stud dog owner to put his kennel name on a puppy given to him in lieu of a stud fee. One stud dog owner was surprised when a breeder shipped him his stud puppy without giving him an opportunity to make his own selection from the litter. A written contract spells out such important details. Another good reason for a written contract is the simple fact that individual memories of the oral agreement may differ widely. Nothing can ruin a civil relationship faster than each party believing that he or she is entitled to pick puppy from a single puppy litter! Written contracts make good records which are increasingly important for maintaining good standing with the American Kennel Club. Finally, using written contacts leads to a reputation for straightforward and-honest dealing.

The complexity of stud contracts can vary widely. Both parties should read any contract carefully and discuss all of the terms. A good stud contract is comprehensive and fair to both sides. It should, at a minimum, address the following issues:

The Owner of the stud dog agrees to breed the Scottish Terrier bitch Ch. Heather, RM123456/01, to the Scottish Terrier dog, Ch. Jock, RM789101/01, on the dates when she appears most likely to conceive.

This paragraph identifies the dog and bitch to be bred and obligates the stud dog owner to make every effort to breed the bitch at the right time. Some stud dog owners rely on their dog to tell them when the bitch is ready. Others use test tape, vaginal smears or progesterone tests as additional aids. If the owner of the bitch wishes the stud dog owner to use a particular method with her bitch, she should include that in the contract. Otherwise, the timing of the breeding is generally considered to be the responsibility of the stud dog owner.

The Owner of the stud dog guarantees that the above-named stud dog is in good health and is fertile.

This is so obvious that many stud dog owners do not think to include it. Still, since the stud service itself is the subject of the contract, the health and fertility of the stud dog should be guaranteed.

The Owner of the stud dog guarantees that the above-named stud dog is a proven sire.

This, of course, will not apply to unproven stud dogs.

The Owner of the stud dog guarantees to provide the above-named bitch with adequate food and clean water in a clean, safe environment while in the care of the Owner.

Every stud dog owner should have adequate facilities to care for visiting bitches. Breeders should inquire about such facilities and, where possible, inspect them.

The Owner of the stud dog promises to take reasonable care to assure that the above-named bitch has no access to any other dog capable of inducing pregnancy

during the period that the bitch is in the care of the Owner.

The stud dog owner is responsible for preventing accidental matings while visiting bitches are in his possession. Before any bitch leaves home, her owner should have total confidence that the bitch will be denied access to any dog other than the one selected.

If the bitch fails to produce a litter as a result of the above breedings, the Owner of the stud dog will provide a free return service to the same bitch or another bitch owned by the Breeder by the same stud dog, if available, or by any stud dog owned by Owner if the above-named stud dog is not available. A litter consists of two puppies surviving to the age of ten weeks. Availability of the stud dog will be determined by the stud dog's Owner.

This paragraph spells out the stud dog owner's obligation if the bitch fails to conceive as a result of his first efforts. Remember that the Breeder is paying for the stud service - it is not customary in the dog fancy for the stud dog owner to guarantee live puppies. It is customary, however, for the Owner to provide a so-called "return service" regardless of whether the Breeder has paid a stud fee or has promised the Owner a stud puppy from the litter. This paragraph includes a number of options that the parties need to consider: Will the stud dog owner give the return service to a different bitch owned by the same Breeder? Will the Breeder accept the services of a different male if the chosen dog is not available when her bitch is ready to breed? What constitutes "unavailability" and who decides if the stud dog is unavailable? Defining a litter is particularly important in a stud contract. In the past, a single puppy was customarily considered a litter. As costs of shipping and breeding have increased, some stud dog owners have offered free repeat services to bitches who have produced a single puppy or who have produced live puppies who failed to survive. One other matter that is often overlooked in stud contracts is the obligation of the Breeder to bring her bitch back to the same dog after the bitch has failed to conceive. When the Breeder has paid a stud

fee, she is under no obligation. She may avail herself of the return service or not - the choice is hers. The Breeder is, however, by tradition obligated to return to the same stud dog if she promised a puppy instead of a stud fee to the Owner. This obligation should be clearly spelled out in the contract.

The Owner of the stud dog promises to refer potential puppy buyers to the Breeder in the event the bitch produces puppies.

This paragraph, while not essential, is nice to have, particularly for first-time breeders. In general, stud dogs are maintained by more experienced breeders who will usually have an established network of referrals. Referrals from the stud dog owner are not only helpful to the Breeder, but also to the pet buyer seeking a responsible breeder with available puppies. This is a better practice than having the established breeder take deposits on unborn puppies while the new breeder languishes with a houseful of puppies to sell.

The Owner of the stud dog promises to sign the litter registration application provided by the Breeder.

The stud dog owner is obligated to help the Breeder register the puppies unless he has some reason to believe that the puppies are not purebred. Many stud dog owners will refuse to sign if the Breeder has violated some term of their agreement. AKC, however, will not recognize an oral contract - another good reason to put it in writing.

The Breeder agrees to pay Four Hundred Dollars to the Owner of the stud dog upon delivery of the bitch for breeding.

This paragraph should be used where the Breeder is paying a stud fee. The following paragraph is one used by a stud dog owner who often takes puppies in lieu of stud fees:

The Breeder agrees to give the Owner of the stud dog first pick puppy from the resulting litter in lieu of stud fee, except that if the Breeder intends to keep and show a puppy from this litter then the Breeder shall give the Owner second pick puppy. The Owner of the stud dog shall not be required to pick his puppy before the litter is ten weeks of age.

Traditionally, the stud fee was set at the price of a pet puppy. The stud dog

owner who accepted a puppy in lieu of a stud fee usually got the first pick puppy. This paragraph follows that rule except that it allows the Breeder to keep her best puppy if she intends to show it. A stud dog owner who adopts this policy will still get, at a minimum, a pet puppy, equal in worth to a stud fee. The real benefit, however, is that a Breeder who gets a top-quality show puppy from such an arrangement will not only be likely to use the stud dog again, but she will also encourage other breeders to use the dog. This paragraph also provides the minimum age at which the owner of the stud dog must select his puppy. If the parties do not live nearby, this paragraph should also answer such questions as: Where will the selection be made? May the Breeder postpone selection until the puppies have their second teeth? If the Owner cannot make the selection personally, does he wish to appoint a surrogate and, if so, who?

The Breeder promises to provide a healthy environment for the resulting puppies. This shall include providing immunization against rabies, distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis, parainfluenza, coronavirus and parvovirus. This shall further include keeping the bitch and her puppies free of fleas and other external parasites, performing regular worming for internal parasites and other veterinary treatments as are consistent with the latest technology in veterinary care for puppies.

This requirement **should** go without saying, but omitting this paragraph would diminish the importance of proper puppy care. It should always be included.

The Breeder promises to wait until the puppies are at least 12 weeks of age before selling them.

This paragraph will help eliminate breeders who are looking for the quick sale of their puppies at a young age. Backyard breeders prefer to sell puppies before they require expensive inoculations.

The Breeder promises to carefully screen prospective purchasers to ensure that the resulting puppies are placed in loving, safe homes. Wholesaling of any litter of puppies, or the knowing sale of puppies or breeding stock to, or through, such places as pet shops, catalogue houses, or other commercial sources of distri-

bution shall be considered a violation of this contract.

This paragraph places the responsibility for placing the puppies squarely on the Breeder and gives the stud dog owner some recourse if one of his dog's puppies ends up in a bad placement.

The Breeder promises to require prospective purchasers of pet-quality puppies to sign a spay-neuter purchase agreement.

This paragraph ensures that pet-quality puppies will not be sold to irresponsible breeders. If they prefer, the parties may wish to use the Limited Registration option instead.

Both parties agree that this contract may be modified at any time with the agreement of all parties thereto, but such modification must be in writing.

Many contract disputes arise when the parties to a written agreement claim that they modified the agreement during a phone conversation. This paragraph requires that all changes be put in writing.

Both parties agree that any disputes relating to this contract shall be governed by the laws of the state of _____ and all parties agree that this contract has been made in the state of _____ for the purposes of determining jurisdiction should any litigation result from this contract.

Normally, contracts are governed by the law of the place where a contract was made. When the Breeder and the stud dog owner live in different states, it can be difficult to determine where the contract was made. The general rule of law is that a contract is made in the place where the last act necessary to make it a binding agreement took place. In other words, if the contract does not address this issue, the contract is considered "made" when the last signature is executed. This can, however, be modified by the terms of the contract, hence this paragraph.

Contracts are enforced in two ways: The Court can order specific performance (making the other party do what he promised) or payment of damages (making the other party pay for not doing what she promised). As a practical matter, however, dog-related contracts are difficult to enforce for several reasons. First, litigation is expensive. Damages are often less than the cost of hiring a lawyer. Second, damages are "cold comfort" to a

Breeder whose bitch escapes from the stud dog owner's kennel or to a stud dog owner who finds one of his dog's offspring in a pet shop. Courts rarely take dog cases too seriously and litigants are rarely compensated for the emotional suffering they experience in such cases.

On the positive side, stud contracts are an important part of the good record-keeping practices mandated by AKC. Most important, using written contracts helps keep breeders out of messy, potentially detrimental arrangements. The hallmark of a successful breeder is a reputation for straightforward dealing.

Because of the difficulties of enforcement, no Breeder or Owner should consider a contract as a substitute for careful screening of the people with whom you do business. Whenever possible, ask for references and then check them. The dog community is a small world and it is worthwhile to take time to investigate a person's background before any breeding takes place with his dog or bitch. If you have any doubt about the integrity of a breeder or stud dog owner, the best policy is to walk away. □
