Dear Fellow Members,

NETIQUETTE AND LEGAL LIABILITY. I have been contacted by members about the conduct of others on the Internet. Our present society lacks civility. This absence of courtesy is further encouraged by the Internet, where we communicate in the privacy of our home or workplace, without face to face exchange. Misunderstanding may occur since we cannot hear the tone of each other's voice. An essential rule for governing Internet use is: "Never send anything over the Internet you wouldn't want your worst enemy to see." **DON'T WRITE IN ALL CAPS. IT COMES ACROSS AS SHOUTING.** Shorthand and emoticons (symbols universally acceptable to convey humor, anger, sarcasm) can be used to remove some of the sting, and to be sure your message is not taken the wrong way. Examples: BTW=By The Way; IMHO=In My Humble Opinion; IHNI=I Have No Idea; LOL=Laughing Out Loud; ROTFL=Rolling On The Floor Laughing; :-)=smiling; :-D=laughing; :-t=angry; 1-1=asleep or bored. The communications you send and receive are conceivably readable by anyone with access to

any computer. Be careful when you select the addresses of your email. Mis-directed email can be embarrassing or sometimes disastrous. Use prudence. If you compose an angry letter, think about holding it until tomorrow before you send it. Resist the urge to send scathing letters or diatribes over the Internet. Be certain of the accuracy of your statements. A red-hot letter, or one that contains incorrect facts or untruths can cause you greater problems than you realize. The laws of slander and libel apply to internet communications. When the whole world is watching, a Judgement in court against you for damages can potentially be even greater.

I attended the meeting December 9 and the preceding Delegates Forum. The Delegates Forum was about AKC's role in DNA studies. It explained the AKC DNA Identification Program. We are fortunate that AKC did DNA identification for Scottish Terriers at Montgomery this year, since the current program will provide for only 25 breeds over a 3 year period.

The genetic mapping portion of the forum was exciting. Washington State University, in conjunction with other researchers, has completed a very preliminary genetic map of the dog. In the next two years, the map will be made more and more precise and it will become clearer and clearer on what part of the dog DNA various characteristics are to be found. There are many ethical issues to be studied so that, when various tests are available, they can be used with confidence by breeders and fanciers.

The issues to be voted on regarding the makeup of the nominating committee and eligibility of delegates to sign nominating petitions were withdrawn by Richard C. Perrell, the delegate who introduced them.

The matter making the actual reading of proposals in full optional was not adopted. It was an amendment to the constitution and by-laws and required a 2/3 majority. It was a close vote, 170 for and 110 against.

Read for vote at the March meeting were: (1) an amendment to Chapter 2, Section 18 of the Rules, eliminating the prohibition on advertising an event prior to AKC approval; (2) an amendment to Chapter 2, Section 19 of the Rules which stipulates which publication must be available at an event (i.e. Complete Dog Book, Rules Apply to Registration, etc); (3) an

amendment to Chapter 4, Section of the Rules eliminating the requirement for obtaining a postal certification of premium list mailing; (4) an amendment to Chapter 5, Section 4 of the Rules to permit alcoholic beverages to be given as prizes; (5) an amendment to Chapter 5, Section of the Rules to permit clubs to offer multiple-win trophies for first place in non-regular classes; and (6) an amendment to Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Rules to permit transfer of entries from Puppy to the Twelve-to-Eighteen Month class (the same way you can now transfer up from 6-9 to 9-12 Puppy).

Also, the elections for the Board of Directors are in March. The nominating committee nominees are: Ken Marden, Bob Smith and Bernie Schwartz. Usually, many others run on individual nominating petitions. I have not been notified of any others yet.

Chairman Merriam reminded the delegates to give input to Pat Scully's "Future Direction of Show Events" committee, studying sites, clusters, back-to-backs and territories. Fifty-five letters have been received so far. He mentioned the Board has voted to increase the expense allowance for committee members to \$200 per meeting. There has been a decision that all co-owners of the dam must sign the litter registration. This will be implemented along with other changes in a new registration form. President Cheaure reviewed the year's accomplishments, highlighting the consolidation of employees in North Carolina, where there are now 370 AKC staff.

The March meeting will be held at the Sheraton New York Hotel and the June meeting will be held in St. Louis, MO.

The minutes of the meetings of October 2, 1997 and October 4, 1997 were approved as written.

Report of the Corresponding Secretary, Polly O'Neal: A written report was distributed addressing Correspondence received, and answered, Grooming Manuals mailed, Breeder Referral Requests, Requests for Bred By Medallions, Member response to Standard Question, and AKC Correspondence.

Correspondence discussed: A letter was received from the UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine asking for our assistance. They are beginning to build a DNA database, similar to that in progress by AKC. The Corr. Sec. was asked to write a letter to the regional clubs outlining the request, and suggesting that this be handled on a regional club level.

A lengthy discussion regarding breeder referral, and the availability of puppies followed. It was generally agreed to be a function of the regional clubs. It was agreed that it

would be helpful for them to each maintain a breeders directory to help those seeking puppies, and to help stop frequent phone calls to people who cannot help.

Report of the Treasurer: Gene Hains:

A written report was distributed. Balance in checking: \$55,331.23. Rescue Fund: \$3,022.09. Stalter Interest Fund: \$10,982.44. C/D Stalter: \$10,000.00. Our total assets are \$79,335.76.

It was reported by the Treasurer that approximately 150 units have not yet paid their dues, and second notices will be sent. A review of our insurance policies has been started, and will continue, to assure that all members are properly covered at all STCA events.

Mary-Ann Cole was asked, as liaison, to help facilitate a routine in house audit of the Health Trust financial records.

Report of the Vice President (Show Chairman): Maxine Stickler:

A written report was distributed. Important general information from written report as follows: Rotating Specialty will be held in Kalamazoo, Michigan on May 23, 1998. There has been some confusion regarding the Award of Merit, and eligibility to receive this award. After lengthy discussion the following **motion was made by Bill deVilleneuve, and seconded by Susan Clarkson. The wording in catalogue for Award of Merit shall be as follows: Award of Merit offered by The Scottish Terrier Club of America. This Award of Merit is a Rosette to recognize outstanding champions excluding those selected for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Winners Dog, Winners Bitch, and Best of Winners. 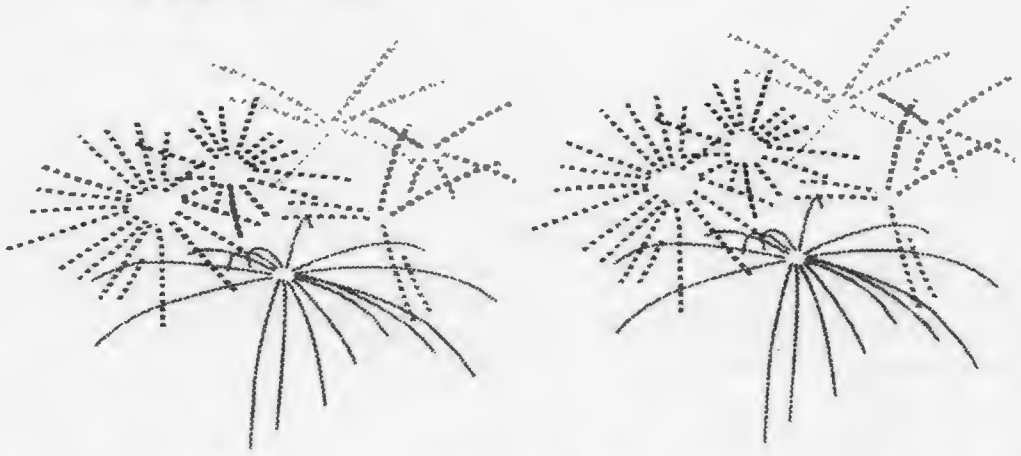

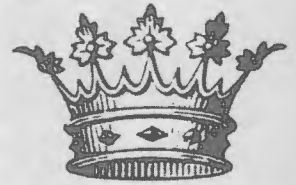
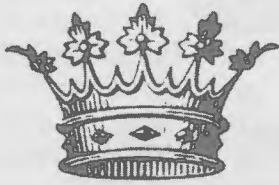

The Michigan, Tampa Bay, Greater Denver, Chicago, Greater Dallas and Greater Houston clubs have made other donations, too. Bravo to them!

By Jan 16, Dr. Patrick Venta reported 165 samples: 85 Scotties (13 affecteds, with two more affecteds promised); 42 Cairns (8 affecteds), 38 Westies (12 affecteds, with one more affected promised). Continue sending DNA samples to Dr. Venta. Call him for free sample collection kits (517-432-2515). For other CMO research information, call Carole Owen (915-263-3404).

vWD update: VetGen reports that by February 3, 1998, 514 Scotties have been DNA tested for vonWillebrand's Disease: 89% Clear, 10% Carriers, 1% Affecteds. Orthopedic Foundation for Animals reports that by January 26, only 45 DNA-tested Scotties have been registered in the OFA vWD Open Registry.

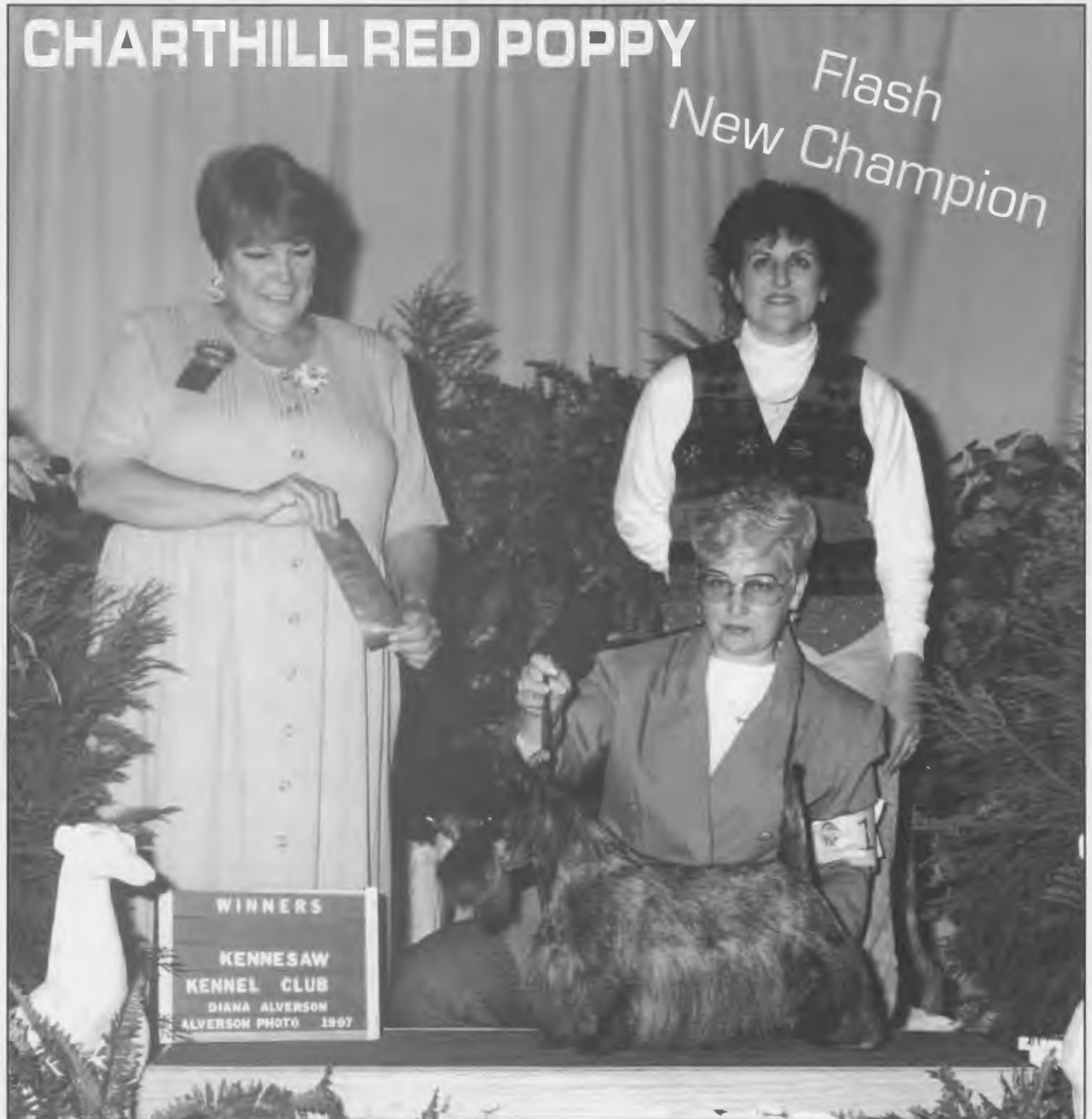

Scottish Terrier Rescue

GAIL AND KELSEY

By STCA Rescue Coordinator - Daphne Branzell

I first heard about Gail Smith and her agility Scottie, Kelsey, while watching the first STCA Agility Trials at Montgomery County in October 1997. Unfortunately, Gail was not able to take Kelsey to PA because of the KC Nationals in Chicago. I contacted Gail and asked if she would tell the Bagpiper readers about Kelsey and her agility career. She agreed and this is their story. We hope it will inspire others to adopt a rescue Scottie and/or get involved in the wonderful sport of agility.

"My first Scottie, "Satin," lived a long and happy life with my family until her death in 1989 from liver cancer. My family, especially my Dad, really missed having a Scottie in the house, so I started looking for another Scottie a few months later. I had read about the Scottish Terrier Club of Southern California rescue program headed by the wonderful Carol Herd. I spoke to Carol a few times and my name was placed on the waiting list. At that time in my life, I was not active in agility and just wanted another pet Scottie that would fit into our family. I had been on the waiting list for about six months when I received a call from Carol telling me that there was an 8-month-old bitch available and asked if I were interested. Of course, I said yes. I contacted the wonderful Elaine Carrington who said that the young dog had kennel cough and needed time to

recover. She also told me that although she did not look like one at the moment, she was most definitely a Scottie. It seems that the animal shelter had "dematted" the poor dog and shaved off her furnishings. After Kelsey (as she became) had recovered from her kennel cough, Elaine contacted me, and Dad and I adopted our new Scottie.

"I had moved to the Riverside area shortly before getting Kelsey and had a Pembroke Welsh Corgi puppy named "Courtney" whom I was hoping to show in conformation. Unfortunately, she did not turn out as a show prospect so I had started some basic obedience lessons with my good friend Barbara Mah. Kelsey and Courtney got along extremely well. I hadn't even thought of taking Kelsey through obedience as she was to be just a housedog. Barbara's husband, Stuart, started teaching agility and I decided that would be a nice outlet for her instead of lying around the house. The first few months were pretty slow and frustrating. Kelsey was my first experience in training a terrier and she seemed interested in running around and playing with all the other dogs and not doing much agility. I was extremely lucky that she had a very good temperament



and she thought agility was getting to play with her dog friends. People in class would also mention from time to time how tough it was to train terriers, especially Scotties, and maybe I would do better with another dog. I was becoming extremely frustrated but Stuart felt she had great potential and I should not give up too easily. Well, I decided to stay in class and after a few more sessions it seemed as if a light bulb went off and Kelsey started doing more obstacles and focussing on me. Back in my younger days, when I was really crazy, it meant going to agility classes three nights a week at different locations to get Kelsey used to different places and have her focus on me. After a few more months of training I entered Kelsey in a local agility show. At that point, in time AKC Agility had not been established, so there was only USDAA (United States Dog Agility Association). There are three levels of competition in USDAA agility, Novice (AD), Advanced Agility Dog (AAD) and Master Agility Dog (MAD). In each level the dog must run the course clean with no faults and under course time. At

the Master Level, the dog must run three qualifying legs and qualify in the games classes, which include a pair relay, jumper course, gambler course, and a snooker course. A total of 37 points are required to qualify. Kelsey managed to finish her Master Dog title in eleven months. She is also the first Scottish Terrier to have completed a MAD title. In addition to the USDAA titling program there are regional qualifying events in which the dog must qualify with 15 faults or less in order to qualify for the USDAA National Finals. Kelsey was working at the advanced level in 1995 when we qualified for our first Nationals in San Antonio, Texas. At Nationals there are two semi-final rounds and the top eight dogs with fewest faults/fastest times are selected for the "finals". Unfortunately, during our first Nationals, Kelsey went off course in Round Two and was disqualified. So we trained really hard and tried again the following year in Ventura, California. I felt we were really running well in Ventura. A handling error on my part put us into 7th place but we still made the Finals. During the Final competition we finished in third place out of the original 32 dogs from the 12-inch division. We trained really hard again last summer getting ready for the USDAA Nationals that took place in July in Cleveland, Ohio. I was pleased with our runs and once again we turned in three clean rounds on our way to another 3rd place at the USDAA Nationals.

"After our first Nationals, the AKC started their agility program and I entered Kelsey in AKC competition. When we started in AKC, it was at the novice level. I will always remember Kelsey's AKC agility debut because as I walked up to the start line a few Sheltie owners behind us were discussing the prospect of showing Scotties in agility. I believe their comments included "What on earth is she doing showing the Scottie in agility? Doesn't she know those dogs are untrainable? You can't get them to do anything." Well, fine, I thought, just watch and learn! I think they learned their lesson when we walked away with the blue ribbon for that day. Kelsey went on to earn her Master Excellent (MX) title in the AKC agility program (the first Scottish Terrier to obtain a MX). We also competed at last year's AKC National Agility Trial in Oklahoma. Unfortunately, Kelsey did not feel well on that trip. She

had been given a parvo shot two days before we left and she was not my bright-eyed little dynamo when we arrived. I learned not to do that ever again. We also competed in the 1997 AKC Nationals in Chicago (the weekend after the Scottie Nationals). We ran really well three out of the four runs even managing to place 2nd and 3rd in two of the four rounds. Unfortunately, in Round Two Kelsey missed a contact zone and had a refusal on the table, which knocked us out of the main competition. Had we held together and had four clean rounds, we would have had High Scoring Terrier and placed either

2nd or 3rd out of the top 12 inch dogs in the country.

"I am so proud of Kelsey and ever grateful to Carol Herd and Elaine Carrington from the Scottish Terrier Club of Southern California. They have an excellent rescue program. I would urge anyone looking for a pet Scottie to contact the local rescue program."

Preparation

When and where will dog shows be held for a particular area? I haven't received a Premium List yet!

- The MB-F site presents a list of ALL Dog Shows by date (secondarily indexed in alphabetical order by State) up to thirteen weeks in advance. They provide the Premium Lists for all MB-F shows in HTML format; they list judging assignments for most shows (incl. non-MB-F).
- Most other superintendent sites contain judging programs and complete premium lists for their own dog shows.
- The AKC has an abbreviated "Events" format on their website (<http://www.akc.org/event.htm>).

When are all the Regional Scottish Terrier Club and National STCA shows being held? Where? Who should I contact? Who is judging Sweeps and Regular Classes?

- An overview of the 1998 Scottish Terrier Specialties can be found at <http://www.akc.org/clubs/stca/stcasp98.htm>; detailed information (entry info; directions; etc...) can be found at <http://www.akc.org/clubs/stca/stcaspec.htm>.
- National Specialty (Rotating (Kalamazoo, MI) and Montgomery County, PA) info can be found at <http://www.akc.org/clubs/stca/stc-nat98.htm>.

Who will be judging? What kinds of Scotties does Judge "X" like?

- The superintendent's sites contain Judging Assignments, in addition the MB-F (Infodog) site has a comprehensive Judge Directory. You can run queries which will list all the shows a particular judge has recently judged or a list of shows the judge will be judging in the near future. Links are supplied to MB-F results - you can see who the judge has "put-up" in recent assignments. MB-F also provides interesting

biographies on selected judges.

- The AKC also has a Judge Directory (<http://www.akc.org/search.cfm>).
- Another interesting site is the American Dog Week site. This site contains detailed interviews with several of today's popular judges. There are also a number of dog show related articles. Back-issues and an index are provided for several hours of interesting reading (<http://dog-week.com/>).

Entries and Reservations

I want to fax or mail my entries to the Superintendent.... but I don't have an Official AKC entry form!

- You can download the official AKC dog show entry form from several dog show sites and the AKC Site (in most cases you will need to use the Adobe Acrobat Reader software to view the file) (<http://www.akc.org/regforms.htm>).

Can I enter a show via the internet ?

- You can enter any show via the MB-F (Infodog) internet site (with a credit card). MB-F shows can be entered up to the closing day and time. Shows held by all other superintendents can be entered via the MB-F on-line entry site up to 24 hours prior to the closing day and time. There is an additional charge associated with each entry. You will be e-mailed confirmation of your entries.

What local hotels accept dogs? Can I make reservations on-line? Are there any maps to the site?

- A good all-around hotel, flight, car-rental site is <http://www.travel-web.com/>. Once you have accessed hotel details, you can click on a map of the area and zoom in and out until you achieve the level of detail you desire. This site will allow you to search for hotels in the show area that accept dogs. Once you arrive at the hotel's website,

you can check for availability, price and you can even make a reservation in many instances.

- Not all hotel chains are represented on that site... you may find it easier to search the hotel sites directly (for example: <http://www.super8.com>; <http://www.redroof.com>; <http://www.holiday-inn.com>; <http://www.knightsinn.com>).
- The Excite Search Engine has a page that provides links to city info and maps and driving instructions (one address to another address) (<http://city.net/maps/>). There are several more sites similar to this one, as well.

I wonder if it's a major? What time will Scotties show? In what ring? How many breeds are ahead of them?

- From the moment you send/fax or e-mail your entry, often you want to know whether it's going to be a major. Most of the superintendents have the Judging Schedules up on their websites by the Monday following the entry close date (some even have the schedules up earlier!) The judging schedules include the entry breakdown, the time and order the Scottish Terriers show and the ring number.

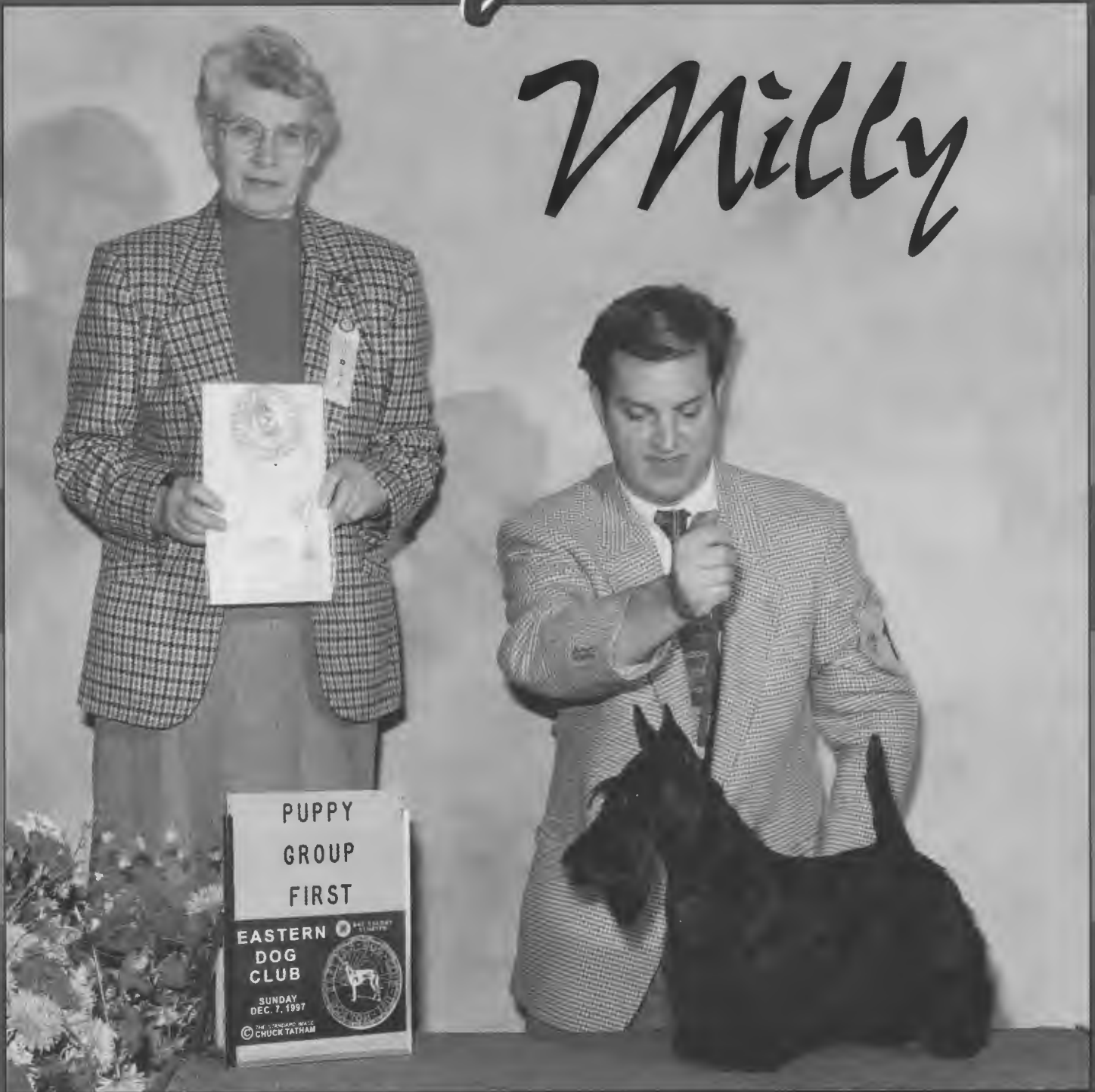

Adding to her long list of accomplishments, Duffy is also a certified therapy dog with Therapy Dogs Incorporated who travels to personal care homes and participates in rehabilitation work.

INTRODUCING THE OBEDIENCE AND PERFORMANCE EDITOR - SUSAN HARNED

As the new performance editor for the Bagpiper I would like to tell you a bit about my life with Scotties. I was brought up by a very stuffy old Scot named Jock. My parents bought him in 1948 and he was my guardian but not much of a playmate. When I was 12 I got my very own puppy from Cornelia Crissey. He was Lloyd Trophy winner Ch. Crisscot Carnival's grandson. Robbie was gorgeous and fun! I read books about obedience training and he did everything I asked of him. He could even retrieve! Something I haven't been able to teach any other Scot with much luck since. It wasn't until after college that I started being interested in exhibiting. I had a Scottie bitch that I took to obedience classes for what seemed forever. When I thought she was ready to show she was about 10 years old. Shortly after she was diagnosed with cancer and died before I could finish her title.

I continued to train all of my Scotties in obedience. But it wasn't until my daughter started showing her Scottie that I started again. I also try to get Canine Good Citizen Certificates on all of them.

I've been doing my own form of agility for years as a fun way to condition the dogs. I've found that agility and obedience complement one

The Difference Between Them and Us

We took in a rescue dog recently with the improbable name of Tiny. He wasn't. He was a tall, long, slab-sided Wheaten boy who tipped the scales at 28 pounds with his ribs showing. "Why are you giving him up?" I asked the owners. "He bites children," they replied. "Did you get him from a pet shop?" I asked. "Oh, no!" they stated emphatically. "We know better than that! We got him from a breeder." As it turns out, we know this so-called "breeder." Tiny is the third Scottie from the same litter to find his way to our rescue program. All biters.

The well-meaning owners called this "breeder" when things began to go wrong. She offered no help. They called her again when they made the difficult decision to let Tiny go. She refused to take him back.

"Maybe you'll keep him?" the man asked, hopefully. "This color is really rare, you know, and you can "stud him" and make some money. He might even be a show dog."

"What makes you think so?" I asked in amazement. "The breeder told us so," he replied.

They said goodbye to Tiny. The kids cried. The husband, once again, suggested the possibility that he might stay here with us. I assured them that I would do my best to find him a good home.

Several weeks later, however, Tiny was not in a new home. Tiny was dead. His aggression toward children, and, indeed, toward anyone with whom he was unfamiliar, was so dangerous and uncontrollable that we knew we could not place him safely in anyone's home. His brief and troubled life ended at our veterinarian's office, cradled in my husband's arms.

I've thought a lot since then about "breeders."

We work hard to educate the public about the evils of the pet shop. "Buy from a breeder," as the bumper sticker says. But how do we set ourselves apart from "breeders" who thoughtlessly and carelessly and selfishly produce misfits like Tiny?

My vet, whom I adore, is retiring and I'm faced with the daunting prospect of finding another vet whom I trust and with whom I share rapport. When I suggested several names to a friend, she warned me not to bother. "They hate breeders," she said. "How can anyone possibly find fault with people who take care of dogs like *we* do?" I asked. "We're not backyard breeders!"

"I know we're not backyard breeders," she replied, "and *you* know we're not, but *they* don't know the difference."

And if some of the vets in the area look upon all "breeders" as belonging to the same, unsavory category as the woman who bred Tiny, how can we expect the puppy-buying public to tell us apart? Perhaps we need to expand our educational efforts beyond the dangers of the pet shop, to include a serious attempt to educate the public to the differences. "Buy from a breeder" is not enough. We need to tell puppy buyers to buy from a *responsible* breeder. But

how does one tell the difference between "them" and "us"?

First of all, a responsible breeder is dedicated to improving the breed. No mating is ever planned or consummated without the intention - and the expectation - of producing the next "great one."

The responsible breeder studies pedigrees *and the traits of the dogs therein*. Breeding plans are often mapped out for several generations hence. It's interesting how the old advertisements *always* included the sire and dam of the dog, as it was just as important to know what he *came* from, as what he *looked* like. Next time someone inquires about using your dog at stud, ask them to name his parents and grandparents!

A responsible breeder ensures that breeding stock is free of genetic defects, insofar as possible. And educates buyers about what constitutes a healthy Scottish Terrier. I have had several puppy calls recently in which the prospective buyer asked me about vWD and cramp. *Someone* is educating these folks, and we need to add our voices, too.

A responsible breeder offers a stud dog only to suitable bitches, and seeks to educate those owners whose bitches should not be bred, no matter how tempting the stud fee. Should a breeder, for example, offer a stud dog who is a known producer of cramp, to a cramp-affected bitch? Unfortunately, it's been done.

The STCA breeders' guidelines say that a responsible breeder does not breed primarily for the pet market, even if the sale of copious pet puppies subsidizes the careers of the show dogs. There is certainly nothing wrong with making a profit in dog breeding (although, Lord knows, I've never gotten the knack of it!) but to breed puppies simply to pay the bills is unconscionable.

A responsible breeder stifles the urge to sell every bitch puppy on a "puppy back" contract. With quality bitches, it is a viable way for good breeders with space limitations to keep their breeding program moving forward. With pet quality bitches, it is simply a way to take advantage of innocent puppy buyers. It not only results in their ultimately paying several times more for their pet than they probably would have paid for a future champion, but also leaves them with a litter of puppies to find homes for; puppies which are, in fact, not their *responsibility*, but *yours*.

Responsible breeders screen puppy buyers

carefully and do everything possible to place each puppy in the perfect home. Most of us want to finish champions, but sometimes the best place for a puppy is on someone's couch, as a pampered pet. The breeder who would rather sell this pup to a less suitable show home should rethink their commitment to the breed.

A responsible breeder waits until bitches are old enough, and mature enough to breed safely and retires them when they've made their contribution in the whelping box. My vet's new associate was amazed to learn that I planned to spay my six year old bitch after her third litter. When she asked why, I told her that this special girl had given me everything I had ever asked her for - three litters of lovely, healthy puppies, some great moments in the ring, and six years of devotion. I felt that she had given me enough. "Most breeders wouldn't do that!" she said...another one who doesn't know the difference between "them" and "us."

A good breeder pampers the oldsters as much as the current star. If unable to provide the kind of attention a senior Scottie deserves, the responsible breeder unselfishly finds a loving home in which the retiree can live out his or her life as someone's beloved pet. Don't think that they will pine away for you. I have seen few things as gratifying as the look on the face of one of the most beautiful Scotties I've ever known - a Best In Show winning bitch - curled up on "her" sofa in a house surrounded by love, after a life in which she basically went from crate, to run and then back again. Old timers deserve better.

And, a responsible breeder gives unselfishly of their time and expertise in educating those who are just beginning their love affair with the breed. But mentoring is not limited to newcomers. I owe my sanity to an experienced Scottie and Sealy breeder who lives 1000 miles away from here, who spent virtually the entire night on the phone with me, helping me through a very difficult whelping.

Hopefully, the folks who read the *Bagpiper* - responsible breeders all - in rating themselves according to the "ten commandments" above, would score a perfect "10". Tiny's "breeder" would be hard-pressed to come up with something above a zero. And *that*, as I'd like to tell my new vet, and the people who call about puppies, and the family who left poor Tiny with us, is the TRUE difference between "them" and "us."

DNA Collection & Scottish Terriers

by Tom Sharp

The American Kennel Club has embarked on an ambitious project to use DNA for the identification and parentage verification of purebred dogs. This project is threefold: The Parent Breed Club Program, Kennel Inspections Program, and a new, voluntary, DNA Certification Program. The results of these programs will be a never-before experienced confidence in the integrity of the stud book, and the largest database of canine DNA profiles ever assembled.

The Scottish Terrier Club of America participated in the Parent Breed Club Program in October, 1997, at the National Specialty in Ambler, PA. The Parent Breed Club Program has given us the opportunity to ensure that the markers tested are appropriate for each breed, thereby increasing the efficiency and efficacy of DNA testing. We collected 158 samples of Scottish Terrier DNA, and each person who submitted a sample received a 'Certificate of DNA Analysis' for their dog. We will attempt to explain the results on the certificates.

First, to explain some terms and give some examples of Scottish Terrier genotypes.

Genotype = genetic constitution.

L1, L2, etc. = location (on chromosome) = locus 1, locus 2 etc. (L1=PEZ 01, L2=PEZ 03, etc.)

Genes occur in pairs - one pair (indicated by letters, e.g. AA or AC) at each locus.

One Gene is from the sire and one gene is from the dam at each locus.

Examples:

Locus: L1 L2 L3 L4 L5 L6 L7 L8 L9 L10

Dog 1 - Sire

Genotype = BE FG BC HH EE HH GI BB CD AA

Dog 2 - Dam

Genotype = BF DG BC DG EE GG II BB CD AB

Dog 3 - Pup

Genotype = EF DG CC DH EE GH GI BB CD AB

Dog 4 - Pup

Genotype = BF DG BB DH EE GH GI BB CD AA

Dog 5 - Pup

Genotype = **CF** FG BB **DD** EE **CH** GI BB CD AA

In the above examples, we see a sire, dam, and three pups. We can determine unique identification and parentage verification by analyzing the data shown.

First, let us look at the parentage verification. At the first locus, the sire can contribute either a B or E to each pup, and the dam can contribute either a B or F. Pup 1 has EF (E from the sire, F from the dam). Pup 2 has BF (B from the sire, F from the dam). Pup 3 has CF, indicating the this *pup* is not from the sire and dam tested. One can continue this analysis across all ten markers, and see that the markers for pups 1 and 2 are consistent with being the offspring of the sire and dam (we say they are *included*.) Pup 3, however, is **excluded** at three loci (in **bold**, above), showing that this pup cannot be the offspring of the sire and dam tested.

We can use the data for identification, as well. You can see that the pups 1 and 2 do not have identical genotypes, even though they are from the same litter. This genotype is like a fingerprint, in that the chances of genotypes matching is less than one in millions.

We heartily thank the Scottish Terrier Club of America for participating in the Parent Breed Club Program. The data collected is invaluable in building the world's largest database of purebred dog DNA information. DNA is yet another tool to "advance the study, breeding, exhibiting, running and maintenance of purebred dogs" (quoted from the AKC Charter, 1909).

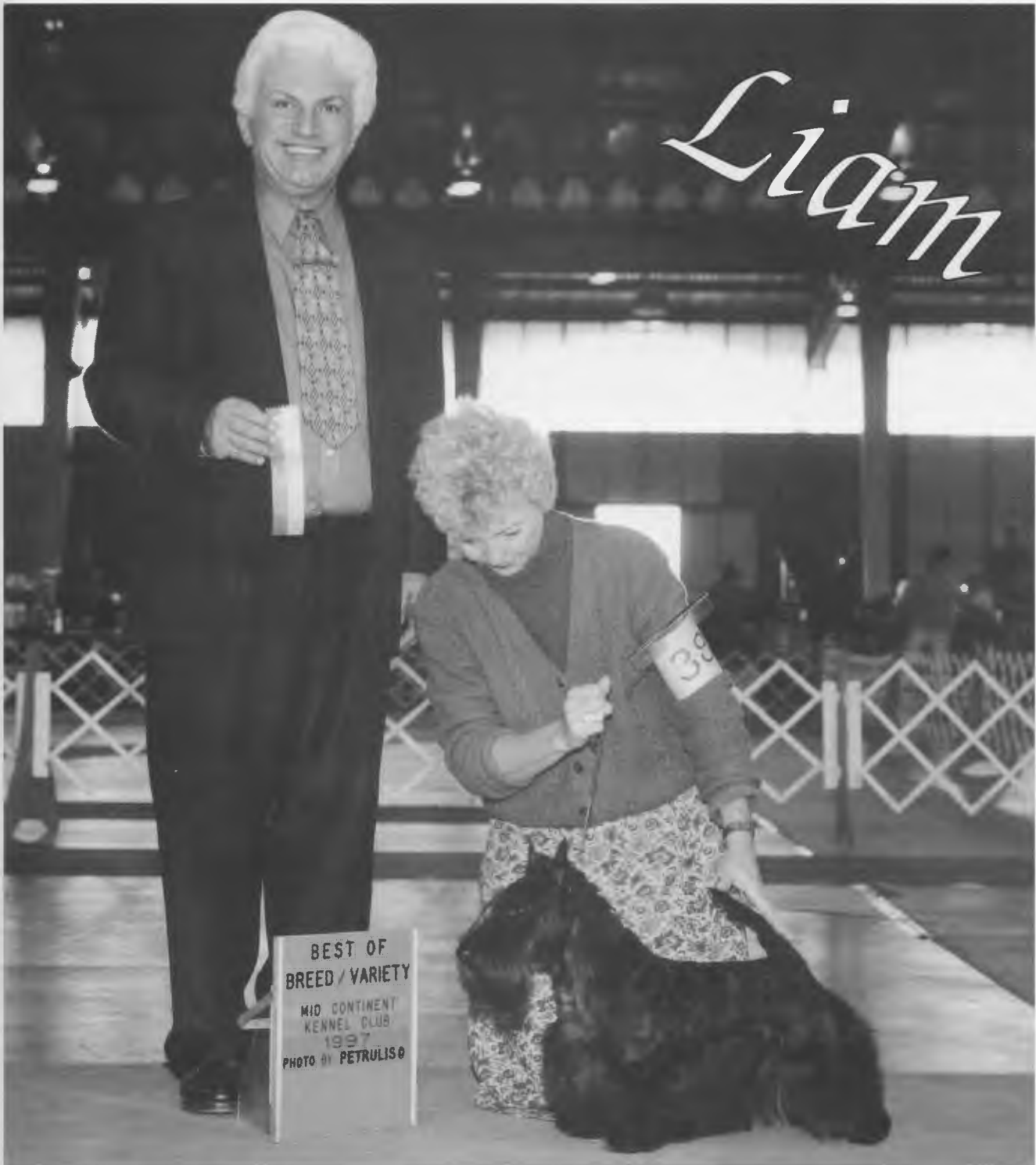
