Thanks also to Marvin and Jackie Burton for contributing the proceeds from entries received for the IndyScotties Lure Course event held in September for the STC of Greater Louisville. And a big thank you once again to Charla and Kari Hill for contributing all proceeds from a raffle of Scottie items donated by participants of the second "I Love my Scottish Terrier Grooming and Handling Workshop" held in August in Lebanon, Indiana. The HTF is grateful to all contributors who remember the Trust, not only in times of memorializing a lost friend or dearly loved dog, but also during fun club events like lure coursing or a grooming and handling workshop.

It is a fact that not many national breed clubs are as fortunate as the STCA in being able to make such great strides in health issues. The STCA membership should be proud of all of the important research currently supported by the Health Trust Fund:

- DNA Study of CMO to ultimately produce a carrier test;
- DNA study of Scotty Cramp to ultimately produce a carrier test;
- Pedigree genetic analysis and owner counseling of dogs with Cerebellar Abiotrophy (CA):

In an interesting development, Dr. Jerold Bell reports that two South African veterinarians published a case of CA in a Scottish Terrier in the (British) Journal of Small Animal Practice. This article shows that the disorder in Scottish Terriers is worldwide, with the defective gene probably originating in ancient blood lines. The HTF plans to spread the word of Dr. Bell's research to the British clubs to inform and assist British breeders, and Dr Bell continues to counsel owners of dogs with clinical signs compatible with CA to help rule in or out a diagnosis.

- Epidemiologic study of bladder cancer in Scotties: The HTF is pleased to report that the Purdue Bladder Cancer Study is well underway and the questionnaires have already been sent out to many of the Case and Control participants. Encouraged that Scottie owners appear to be an especially motivated group, the Purdue researchers are optimistic that the rate of return of the questionnaires will be very high. To all of those who are enrolled in the study, let's prove them right!

Other areas being investigated by the HTF for possible supported research in the future are epilepsy, liver disease including liver shunts and liver enzyme disorders, and inherited eye diseases in Scotties. With the help of all who love and care for this wonderful breed, the STCA Health Trust is able to move forward in its mission to investigate health concerns, to fund research, to

educate all who desire to learn, and to improve the health of all Scotties.

WORDS FROM THE DELEGATE TO THE AKC

With all that has happened in the USA recently, it is hard to know what to report to you. The September Delegates Meeting in Newark, NJ, was cut short by the tragic events of September 11th. Most of us were watching the news on big-screen TV in the lobby while we were waiting for the meeting to begin when we heard and saw the Twin Towers hit by the airplanes. With all of us in shock, the Delegates Meeting was opened, we voted on committee members, and then the meeting was adjourned. The AKC has come under some criticism for even opening the meeting, but it was necessary for us to vote with the previously prepared written ballot — the Delegate Committees are a vital link between the delegates and the AKC Board, who routinely pass issues through these groups before they are presented to the Delegates. Since then, business has been able to go on, albeit not "as usual."

Those of us who have registered litters or dogs recently received a new "List of Fees" from the AKC, noticing that reg-

istry fees for litters and individual dogs have increased dramatically. For those who did not receive the information, check the latest issue of *The Gazette*. Suffice it to say that there have been many protests, from those breeds with large litters.

The suspension of the FSS— Foundation Stock Service — which allowed breeds recognized by other kennel clubs to compete in the Miscellaneous Class while awaiting AKC approval should be of interest to us. A major concern was temperament since these dogs could be handled by Juniors. In terriers, one of the breeds is the Glen of Imaal Terrier.

Parent Clubs have also been urged to work on preserving history both in a written form and orally. We are counting on our Regional Clubs to send our STCA Historian marked catalogues and pictures after every Specialty, so that we can have a complete historical record. Now that we are in the 21st Century, you can send them via CD or through e-mail. Contact STCA

Historian Sandi Lewis.

Finally, speaking of e-mail, I have been asked to remind Regional Clubs of the AKC's policy for using electronic means of communication for your clubs. The AKC allows ONLY PARENT CLUBS to conduct business by e-mail. Regional (local) clubs must continue to use the USPS as the means for sending out official newsletters and meeting notices. Board and club business must be conducted in person or by telephone conference call as stated in your by-laws. A Regional (Local) Club may use e-mail as an additional means of communication but may not use it for the only official business. It has been brought to the attention of your STCA Board that several Clubs are violating this AKC policy. As members of the AKC via your Parent Club, it is important to adhere to their directives and policies. At this time the STCA has chosen NOT to conduct any of its business by e-mail.

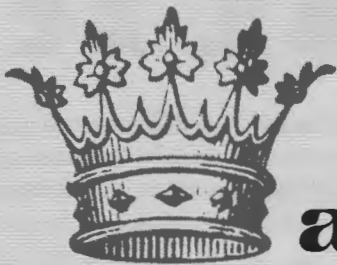

SPARKY

During the month of August we received a telephone call from a woman in Fort Lauderdale, Florida who related a rather odd circumstance. Her sister had been shopping in a furniture store located close to a major highway in Fort Lauderdale and as she was leaving, she saw two men, one of whom was holding a young Scottish Terrier puppy. She made a comment about the "cute puppy" and the man pushed the dog at her and asked if she wanted it as he was about to turn it loose on the highway. He stated that he had bought the dog for his girl friend and they couldn't keep it as they were living in a motel - and he left. She took the puppy home but as she had a house full of pets — two rescued Greyhounds and a Shar Pei — she couldn't keep him. When her sister who owned a scottie arrived the next day from Pennsylvania, she called us at Scottie Rescue. As we have no rescue help in the southern part of Florida, we put this person in touch with the nearest STCA member, Kay Nellis, who agreed to take the puppy.

The plan was that STCA Rescue would pay all expenses for the dog and Kay would eventually transfer him to the Tampa Bay STC Rescue Coordinator, Jim Overby, who at this point was much too far away to help. Unfortunately, this rescue situation did not work out as hoped for, and Kay's story about the puppy she named Sparky follows.

I received Daphne's referral call at 10:30 p.m. asking me to pick up the Scottie puppy. I was told he was approximately 14 weeks old and in good health. Realizing that the puppy (soon to be named Sparky) needed to get into rescue right away, I took off the following morning to bring the little one to my home. The first thing I noticed was how calm and quiet he was. Not knowing what vaccinations the puppy had or any other health history, I brought Sparky straight to my veterinarian for shots and a complete examination. He was very quiet in the Sherpa bag and never fussed during the ride which seemed strange. Since I hadn't had much experience with such a young dog, I just assumed that he was stressed out from changing hands and

very tired from the entire ordeal.

Sparky got his first set of puppy shots, as well as Bortedella. As recommended by my vet, I "quarantined" Sparky in a separate room. His first day was a quiet one. I spoke to other Scottie owners who had experience with puppies who told me he should be much more vocal and anxious to get out of the x-pen. I made hourly checks on him and tried to get him to play. Initially he would show interest in toys and try to get out of his confined area. But in what proved to be a pattern, he would step back and simply sit and look at me. Food was not a primary interest. Again, not being familiar with puppy behavior, I would try and coerce him to eat. Hours later he was completely uninterested in eating, and at times seemed revolted at the sight of food. Sparky had no real interest in anything, no energy, and had no muscle tone.

The second day after rescue, Sparky started to exhibit very abnormal behavior, but his appetite seemed to improve a little. Along with his breakfast, I gave him a puppy Interceptor tablet. Early that afternoon, he vomited and from that point completely ignored his food. I tried everything to get him to eat — treats, baby carrots, baby food, etc. That night, I took him out to potty and he collapsed on the driveway. Thinking he had low blood sugar from not eating, I gave him some corn syrup. Two hours later, I took him outside for his final potty of the day. While he was better, he still was weak.

The following morning I carried him outside to potty (as I always did to avoid possible contamination) and set him on the driveway. He collapsed and struggled to get up. He could not coordinate his legs to right himself. I stood him up and while he could stand, he was very unstable on his feet. It seemed as if he was "drunk" and after a couple minutes, his coordination slowly returned. Now I knew something was drastically wrong. Back to the vet.

Sparky was given a complete neurological exam. Without definitive testing, there could be no diagnosis, but there was speculation he might have had a reaction to the Interceptor, as that was the only

new thing that had been introduced since he was rescued. After x-rays and a complete blood panel, his liver and kidney enzyme numbers proved to be very abnormal. Based on the tests and my described behavior, a bile acid test was administered to rule out liver shunt. Unfortunately, the test results would take a couple days to come back, so Sparky came home undiagnosed.

When he got home, he was ravenous and ate everything in sight. That gave me hope, thinking he had resolved what was thought as a reaction to the Interceptor. The following day he went right back to refusing food. OK, I thought, he needs the company of other dogs. I brought him out of quarantine to socialize with my other Scotties and he immediately took off and played. I thought I found the solution — he needed companionship.

From this point on, his lack of appetite never resolved itself. When the test came back two days later, I was told he had a liver shunt. Now was the time to decide to what extent of intervention could be made. I was told testing and surgery would be very expensive, with Sparky's chances of survival being slim. When it was time to make the final trip to the vet, I found him hiding in my pantry. It was then I knew what had to be done. Sparky had been with me for almost a week, and the ultimate decision of euthanasia was as hard as if he were with me for years.

Liver shunt is a horrific disease and it is very hard to experience as an owner. While I cannot share with you any more than what I saw and tried to help for Sparky, I can point you to an article written by Linda Osborn, titled "Portosystemic Shunt (Liver Shunt) in the Scottish Terrier" in the 1999, #3, *Bagpiper*. This is a very well written and informative article that outlines the classic symptoms of liver shunt. The STCA website also is an excellent source of information about liver shunt.

If you suspect liver shunt or the possibility of it in your breeding program, spay and neuter both parents. Do not for one minute let another one of our precious Scotties be doomed to a compromised life and probable death.

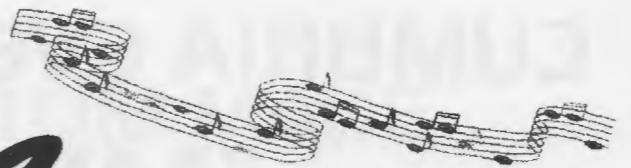

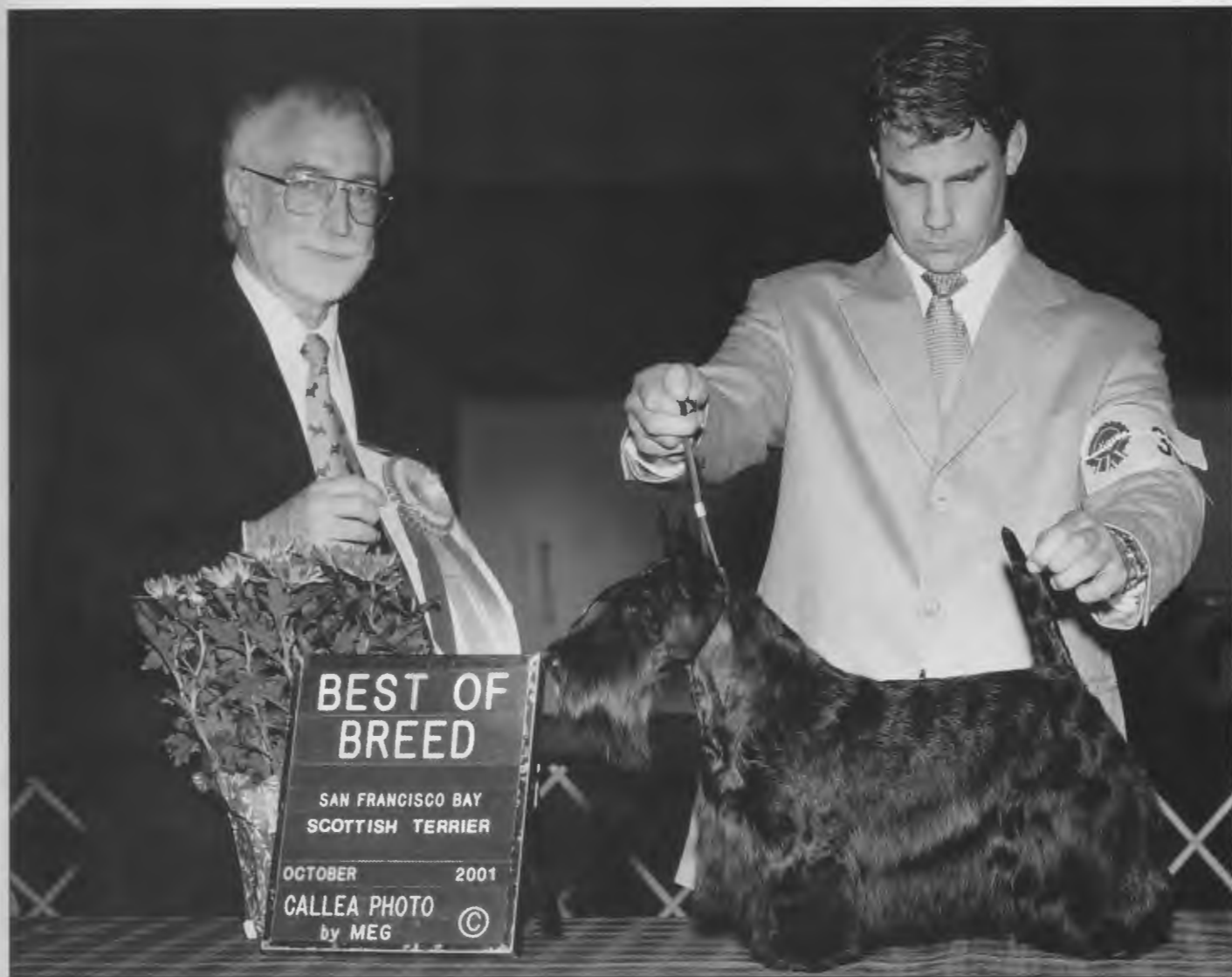

Natural Health Bible for Dogs & Cats

BOOK REVIEW

Browsing the book stalls at dog shows is a wonderful way to unearth new books. I discovered Dr. Shawn Messonnier's The Natural Vet Series this summer at Direct Book Service's Astroshows setup. Looking for ideas for an article on Scottie allergies, I came across The Allergy Solution for Dogs, a companion to The Arthritis Solution for Dogs. Latest book in this helpful series is the Natural Health Bible for Dogs & Cats (Prima Publishing, Roseville, CA, ISBN 0-7615-2673-0). Its subtitle "Your A-Z Guide to Over 200 Conditions, Herbs, Vitamins, and Supplements" doesn't begin to tell the whole story. The readable, easy-to-use reference is a hefty 475 pages and also has sections on diet and other complementary therapies.

Dr. Shawn Messonnier, author of The Natural Vet Series, is a holistic veterinarian in Texas. He is holistic columnist for both Dog Fancy and Cat Fancy magazines and hosted Fox Television's "4 Your Pets" for several years. Some holistic veterinarians refute many conventional veterinary procedures, but Dr. Messonnier is not one of these. He puts the best of all methodologies to use. His is a balanced view that does not "throw out the baby with the bath water," but integrates natural and alternative therapies as adjuncts to conventional veterinary medicine. You will find his "Bible" a balanced, open-minded book, not a radical one.

If you've tried some nutritional supplements, liked the results and wonder about other possibilities both to optimize well-being of your healthy Scotties and to help treat their various diseases, this book will answer many of your questions. Why should you even consider natural therapies?

Sometimes no conventional treatments are available. Scotties have their share of liver problems, for instance. You might like to learn more about milk thistle. "...milk thistle is a wonderful herb to help heal the liver; there are no conventional medications that can do

this," states Dr. Messonnier.

Sometimes a natural therapy can minimize side effects from conventional therapies, as probiotics can lessen damage to the intestinal tract during antibiotic therapy.

Sometimes natural therapies are safer than conventional therapies. An example Dr. Messonnier mentions: "...glucosamine and chondroitin are safer for treating pets with arthritis than corticosteroids or non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medications."

The bottom line: many natural therapies cost less than conventional therapies for long-term treatment of chronic conditions. For instance, Dr. Messonnier mentions a supplement containing choline which is much less expensive to use for cognitive disorder than the conventional drug Anipryl.

More than 40 ailments have their own chapters in the "Conditions" section with various ideas for complementary therapies which you should check with your own veterinarian. Each disorder write-up has many suggestions for therapeutic nutritional supplementation, herbal usage and diet. Since the Scottish Terrier is the #1 breed affected by bladder cancer, that chapter should be of special interest to Scottie owners.

Chapters on liver disease, Cushing Disease, allergic dermatitis, autoimmune diseases, hypothyroidism, and epilepsy will interest many Scottie owners, too.

More than 150 herbs and supplements are described, with therapeutic uses listed, scientific evidence, dosage and safety issues.

Speaking to both veterinarians and pet owners, the veterinarian who authored the book's foreword wrote "This text will provide you with a ready-to-use clinical tool. Or just simply help you understand more about your pet's health."

"Remember that no book can substitute for individualized medical care from a qualified veterinarian," says Dr. Messonnier. I second that. Natural Health Bible for Dogs & Cats will give you many ideas to explore with your own veterinarian to expand the treatment arsenal for your Scotties.



SIMPLE LESSONS FOR BREEDING

T O M N A T A L I N I

STONEHEDGE KENNELS

So you want to breed your bitch? Before undertaking such a task, you should consider several factors before making the final decision.

- *Why do you want to breed?*
- *Have you finished a champion of record?*
- *Have you evaluated the bitch you intend to breed?*

The primary objective in breeding is to improve the quality of the breed. Evaluating the bitch you have chosen to breed must be done objectively and honestly. Look at her. Note the faults you need to correct in the order of importance to her specific breed [eyes, ears, coat, front, layback, tail set, rear assembly, correct hocks, straight stifles]. Pay very close attention to temperament, as this is just as important a consideration as the standards used to grade the conformation of the breed.

Now of course, we are not all objective and many of us do not readily see or wish to see the faults in our lines. Good and experienced breeders know the faults in their lines; while they may not readily admit them, they know them and through their own breeding programs, are continually trying to improve the breed. Novices are not as knowledgeable. The novice breeder may very well think they have a good bitch. They have even compared their bitch to the standard of their breed and, based on that comparison, have decided to breed her. If you are a novice, you must know the standard of your chosen breed. Go to dog shows, watch your chosen breed in the ring, and talk to the breeders exhibiting their dogs. Exhibitors are usually more than willing to talk about their dogs. And listen to what you hear. Then find someone whom you believe will evaluate your bitch honestly.

Once you have evaluated your bitch, you must find the proper male to breed her to. Selecting this dog should be as objective a decision as was the evaluation of your bitch, as you want to choose a dog

that will improve your line. Perhaps your breed standard calls for a straight upright tail but your bitch has a gay tail; you want to pick a dog that exhibits a straight-up tail in order to correct the tail fault. Perhaps your bitch's eyes are too closely set; you would then want to choose a stud whose eye set was correct for the breed. It is important to remember, however, that if you have evaluated your bitch honestly, you may find she has more than one fault you need to correct to improve your line. Therefore, choose a stud that will compensate for the faults you noted when evaluating your bitch. Remember, though, that some faults take generations to correct. Picking a stud just because he has the title Champion in front of his name may not always be the right choice.

Before you choose the stud dog, you need to decide what type of breeding plan you will follow. Will you line breed, or will you out cross, or will you breed to type? And, do you know the difference? Further, have you seen pups produced by the prospective stud dog?

Line Breeding. This involves breeding your bitch to a dog within her existing bloodline. Breeding your bitch to her uncle or her grandfather, or breeding to a dog that is the same pedigree as your bitch. [This type of breeding usually produces the best offspring – if you are satisfied with your bitch.]

In Breeding. This is breeding daughter to father, or sister to brother, or mother to son. [This type of breeding can produce incredible specimens of the breed but more than often, if you are not an accomplished breeder who knows what you are

doing can also produce the worst specimens of the breed.]

If you are overjoyed with your own stud dog, then by all means use him.

Type Breeding. Is a form of Out Crossing to a sire that closely resembles the bitch you have? Type, meaning, good bone, good head, good coat, a size you like, an overall appearance closely associated with the standard of the breed. I consider this a safe breeding when the stud is related to others in the line in appearance.

Out Crossing. Similar to type breeding, the difference being that the stud is prepotent and is a dominating stud. This means he contributes all the elements one is looking for and has proven his worth in past litters that are out cross. This would be introducing a new line into your line. This is also one of the types of breeding most people do when they become enamored with a top champion. I would only consider this breeding with full knowledge of what the dog has produced, and not what he is alone. When you outcross you must look into what baggage is being carried with him. Does he throw the same faults your bitch exhibits? When you outcross, if you improve only one fault, then you have improved the line. However, do not be tempted to outcross the pups you have kept. You should return to the original line. But breed to a dog that is correct with the fault or faults you have improved on either side of the new pedigree.

Now that you have bred your bitch to the right stud, the question then arises, what should you keep from the litter? The first thing you need to think about when making the decision to keep pups from a

litter is to ask yourself whether you have the kind of facilities that will allow you to raise a healthy and happy dog. Do you have the necessary exercise areas, proper housing, and a specific grooming area? Before you even decide to breed you should be asking yourself if there is a market for your pups.

Note: A GOOD RULE. Never keep a male if you cannot make him top dog. The unwritten rule is go to the best stud. If you have limited facilities, keep only bitches.

How long should you keep the litter? Most states now mandate that no puppy can be legally sold before it is eight weeks old. However, if you inquire of experience breeders you will find that litters are usually kept until the puppies are at least twelve weeks old. Now you have examined your litter and selected the pup or pups you think you would like to keep to continue your line. The pup or pups you have selected to run with should be kept until six months old. At that age you will be able to determine which you will keep for show and breeding.

Registration. You have the opportunity to sell your pups with full or limited registration. I suggest limited registration for dogs or bitches you would not keep yourself for show or breeding. If you have decided that a puppy you have bred is not up to the standards of your line, or the breed, it should be sold as pet quality with limited registration. Limited registration means that the puppy will have its papers but the person purchasing the puppy will, under the limited registration, be allowed only to register the puppy you sold them. No offspring from that puppy will be allowed registration under the guidelines of the American Kennel Club. But say you have sold a puppy and you have continually seen the puppy progress. You have sold it with limited registration; if at a later date you decide you have made a mistake and the puppy you have sold is a puppy that should be shown or bred, you can contact The American Kennel Club and change the status of the limited registration.

The breeding concept is as follows:

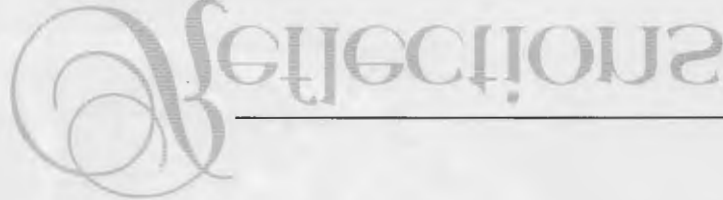
When breeding always breed to improve your line. Be aware that some faults, such as light or round eyes take three (3) generations to improve. If you are breeding simply to make money you are in the wrong hobby sport. The average vet bill for a "C" section is about \$550.00, shots per pup average around \$100. An average visit to the vet for the litter will be an additional \$100.00. Puppies require a minimum of 4 visits. Four pups, 4 visits = \$1,600.

Then there are the added expenses of travel, grooming, training, advertising and the list goes on and on. So plan your breeding carefully. Don't just breed to the champion.

If you use a handler and he or she suggest you might want to use a stud they are currently exhibiting take out this list and review the dog first before you commit yourself to use the dog.

Good luck and pray for success.

That was the last thing he said to me too!! I will always cherish his good sportsmanship.

I am reminded of how rewarding this sport can be because of some of the great friendships that we make. Harry touched my life. 2001 STCA Regular Classes Critique

Tom Natalini

As an exhibitor, breeder and former handler I take this opportunity to thank the STCA for affording me the honor of judging the 2001 National Specialty. When I joined the STCA some 35 or so years ago, I hadn't a thought about judging or handling for that matter. I always wanted a dog like F.D.R. had. Well guess what? Here I was in the middle of a show ring surrounded by a number of beautiful Scottish Terriers, and I was about to judge my first class of pups. What a wonderful sight. I could feel my skin tingle. A moment I will remember the rest of my life. Thank you STCA and my three great stewards.

Montgomery County All Terrier Show is more than an event. It is an opportunity to review the Terrier

Breeds nationwide. It is a presentation of each breeder's interpretation of the official standard. (It is also the chosen judge's responsibility to review each class and come to a knowledgeable conclusion that either the standard is being maintained, or that it is wandering a drift). It is the judge's responsibility to uphold the standard, which in turn will influence the Breed for the coming new year.

I could list every fault I may or may not have witnessed. What I intend here is to limit my comments to the areas of the Scottish Terrier that I feel requires attention.

First of all my general observation was that all the Scots were groomed to perfection! Obviously our exhibitors have become proficient in grooming the Scottish Terrier.

My concern was in two distinct areas. The Head & Expression and the Front & Back assembly.

The "Head"

The Scottish Terrier is a head breed. If you have read the standard you would see how many points are dedicated to the head.

The "Eyes"

I only found three Scotties with extremely light eyes. But I did observe a number of large round eyes that were placed forward on the face lending a "wide eye surprised" expression. The almond, small, dark eye set deep under the brow is rapidly disappearing.

The "Ears"

Ears I found were either wide set, large, or Wide at the base.

The "Cheeks"

"Apple" or "Round" in shape.

Combine these three elements and you have lost that Terrier

"Varminty" expression. A vital part of the Breed.

Now I must state that not every "Diehard" I examine showed all three of these faults. But to "lightly" state my concern about these areas would be harmful to the breed.

Fronts - There were a number of narrow fronts, which produce poor layback in shoulders, and a lack of reach in front.

The standard requires a chest deep enough that a judge to be able to fill the cup of an average man's hand. This does not mean two fingers! When reaching from behind, a man's fist should be able to have the chest touch his fist.

Rears - When Betty Penn Bull judged the Breed in 1978, she particularly pointed out the absence of the so-called shelf behind the tail. I observed this same absence at this year's specialty. I found it in both the dog and the bitch classes. This indicates a loss of drive from behind and gives the appearance of a low tail set.

I am aware of the illusion that can be obtained by good grooming and I have had to use that system myself. However, we must remember that not addressing these faults now can cause all the other faults to join together, and we all lose in the end.

I do not want to sound as if I am "Pontificating;" that is not my intention. But a critique is to assist in becoming aware of the most prevalent weaknesses in the breed before they get out of hand. Our breed is fortunate that we have no disqualification in our standard, as other breeds have. As one of the oldest of recorded breeds, we have maintained the quality we once had, through the big kennels, which are no longer in existence.

I congratulate all the breeders and exhibitors. We, as Terrier breeders, are once more fortunate enough to have a number of new Terrier judges

and with their help we will see a resurgence of top quality in the Terrier Breeds.

Ok, I've said enough let me proceed with my choice for Winners etc.

Winners Dog came from my favorite class, BBE. He caught my eye the moment he walked into the ring. Handsomely groomed, he held his head high and moved with determination and drive. While still young, he had an attitude and composure to carry himself to *1st Place* and finally to *WD*. The breeders class had a number of outstanding entrants which made the job that much more difficult and gave my winners a run for his life. This entire class was superb.

The *Winners Bitch* was from open bitch class. A lovely bitch; good front and back, tail carried erect, a beautiful head with proper eye. She was every bit as feminine as the male was masculine. Both winners were as close to the standard as you can tell. Maturity will prove them both champions. The bitch was elected *Best of Winners*.

My *Reserve Winners Bitch* came from the *Puppy Bitch Class*. I was most impressed with her in the puppy class, and hadn't seen a pup of her attitude, bone and substance in a number of years. She held my attention in the winners class right up to my final decision. I'll watch her at future shows. Truly a quality puppy bitch.

The *BOS* was an outstanding bitch, which turned out, to be the *BOS* winner at the 1995 Specialty. Nancy Walters said later that she had clipped her down and then decided to show her to me. So she put her back in coat. I was then and I remain now as impressed with her as I did the first time I saw her as a pup. Quality will always win out. She is all

you would want in a Show Bitch.

Finally my *Best of Breed* was a smashing brindle Scot, **CH Friendship Hill Dr. Watson.**

Another dog I've seen as a pup and had now grown into a handsome well built Scotsman. His conditioning was outstanding, deep chest, good front, and great drive from behind. An aristocratic head with plenty of fire in his eyes. Expertly handled by Ernesto Lara. Dog and man were on the day my choice to represent the Breed, and is without trick grooming an honest Scot.

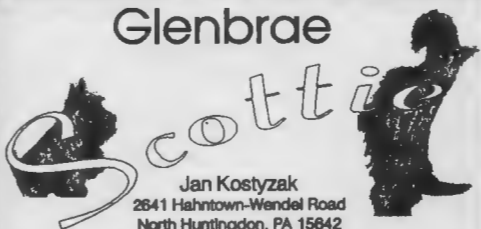

ELSA'S STORY

A PLACE FOR A VWD CARRIER IN YOUR BREEDING PROGRAM

LINDA L. ORSBORN

Gail Fisher and Ray Dubreuil entered the world of showing Scotties at the same time my husband Jim and I did. We were all newcomers to the STCNE and met at the 1992 annual banquet. Gail and Ray were owners of Sam, a brindle scottie girl and were negotiating to become co-owners of Amescot's Lotta Talk, Bradley. Gail had owned Scotties for years but Bradley was to be their first show Scottie. At that time we had our first Scottie CH Blueberry's Dressed To Kill, Bernadine. Bernadine had been owned and finished by Kathi Brown and Gerry Poudrier

As newcomers we all had a lot to learn about the art of showing and breeding. In 1992 both Abby, an Amescot black female puppy fathered by Amescot's Talk Of The Town and Bradley started the show foundation of SnoMtn.

Our foundation was our finished champion, Bernadine and our new puppy Blueberry's Ibebad. The puppy was co-owned by Kathi Brown. As the next year went by, the four of us newcomers learned about grooming, handlers, handling classes and Scottie health and breeding.

Elsa's story starts in August of 1992. She was whelped and owned by Gary and Susan Carr. Her mother was a Whiskybae Yanky scottie and her father was CH Amescot's Lotta Talk, Bradley. She was a beautiful elegant black puppy and just what Gail and Ray needed to help build their kennel. Her registered name is Whiskybae Yanky SnoMtn Fury.

In August of 1993 Elsa was tested for vWD status. She had been in heat shortly before the test. Her status came back as a carrier, she was retested in October of 1993. The results were the same: vWD carrier. It was an area of concern. Elsa

was a quality bitch, a Bradley daughter and so very dear to both Gail and Ray. Abby and Bradley had tested clear and at that point, the Dubreuils could have given up on Elsa, but she had so much to offer. Gail is very conservative and would never endanger the health of any SnoMtn Scottie. She and Ray decided to educate themselves thoroughly on the subject of vWD and to take a wait and see attitude.

After Elsa finished her championship, it was time to look for a suitable Scottie male to breed her to. The first criteria for a stud for Elsa was a clear vWD test. Obviously, conformation traits and temperament were also important, but it was important to ensure the health of any puppies produced. CH Charthill Victory At Sea, a vWD clear dog was chosen to father Elsa's puppies.

About this time the new VetGen vWD test was readied for the Scottie market. The Dubreuils had seven SnoMtn Scotties tested. The test confirmed six vWD clear Scotties and Elsa, the single vWD carrier. In April of 1996 Elsa had her first litter of eight puppies. Elsa is a wonderful elegant princess of a Scottie and eight puppies were overwhelming. She was not the most enthusiastic new mother. Can you blame her? Eight puppies are a heavy burden for a Scottie bitch. Ray and Gail worked very long hours to care for Elsa and her puppies.

Later as the puppies were weaned and becoming independent, the entire litter was tested with the VetGen DNA test. Elsa had produced three vWD carrier puppies and five vWD clear puppies. This information was shared with each perspective buyers and built into the decisions for limited registration and

spay/neuter contracts for the puppies that were sold.

In the end the Dubreuils kept Brutus, a solid tanky brindle boy, who is a vWD carrier and Rachel, a short backed elegant brindle girl, who is vWD clear. In 1997 Brutus won the STCNE Specialty Sweepstakes and Rachel won the STCNY Specialty Sweepstakes. In 1998 Rachel won an Award of Merit at Westminster. If Elsa had not been included in the SnoMtn breeding program, there would be no Rachel or Brutus.

Brutus finished his championship very quickly. The next logical question for Gail and Ray was: do we keep a second carrier in our breeding program? Ray had improved his grooming skills by working on these two puppies. Both Brutus and Rachel had been a dream to show and a source of pride and accomplishment for Sno Mtn. But Brutus is a male. Stud dog owners cannot always control how someone else's puppies are sold. Would Brutus's puppies all be tested for vWD status? Would they be sold with spay/neuter contracts if they were carriers? Would the potential buyers be fully informed about their vWD status? These questions remained. Gail's daughter Debbie had grown up with Scotties. Eventually in 1998 Brutus went to live with Debbie and her husband Todd. He was neutered in 2000.

In the meantime, Elsa produced a litter of one. After eight puppies, Bob was easy. Elsa was much happier with only one to care for. Bob's father was CH Charthill's Jazz King, a DNA vWD clear dog. Bob was a big heavy boned puppy full of spunk. He was sold to a college professor and his family. He is now a

campus ambassador for the Scottish Terrier breed.

Rachel, Elsa's daughter, was the type of Scottie that pleased the Dubreuils. She represents the next higher level of excellence on that never ending quest for the ideal Scottish Terrier. If only they could produce a vWD clear boy with similiar potential and traits.

So once more Elsa was bred to CH Charhill's Victory At Sea. On April 27, 1998, Elsa's third and final litter of nine puppies was born. Nine puppies! Elsa was a better mother than the first time, but she wasn't exactly thrilled. In June all nine puppies were vWD tested with VetGen DNA tests. There were four carrier puppies and five vWD clear puppies.

After the decision to place Brutus, Gail and Ray decided to consider only the clear puppies as show possibilities. A large part of this decision was based on the knowledge that they really hoped for an excellent boy. They decided on a brindle boy with an extremely beautiful head and excellent front. He is SnoMtn's Second Thoughts, Moe. Moe has gone on to win WD BOW at the STCNE Specialty and to be a very competitive dog. He has many of his mother Elsa's strong points. In addition, he is vWd clear. By the end of 1998 all of SnoMtn's breeding Scotties were vWD DNA tested and clear.

The story goes on. In 1999 Rachel, CH Sno Mtn's Short 'N Sweet was bred to Bradley, her grandfather. This breeding brought Sno Mtn full circle. Bradley and Rachel produced three puppies. Two became additions to SnoMtn. They are Nicholas, SnoMtn's Lots Of Lotta Talk and Joy, SnoMtn's Talks A Lot. Nicholas is Sweepstakes winner and Joy has both Sweepstakes and Specialty majors. They both finished quickly and have been competitive nationally.

In the year 2000, SnoMtn finished second in the STCA Bred By Exhibitor standings. This relatively young kennel has grown and improved. Without Elsa, the vWD carrier bitch, the progress would have been much longer. The Dubreuils have maintained Elsa's good traits and eliminated her vWD carrier status from their breeding program.

This success is due in part to the judicious use of the VetGen vWD test. It involved a monetary expense and commitment. I asked Gail and Ray how they felt about the cost of almost \$2000 to test all of their Scotties. They both expressed the view that the tests were worth the investment. The peace of mind knowing that they have vWD clear stock and that no SnoMtn puppy will suffer from the horrors of vWD means more than dollars and cents. Breeding and raising Scotties is, after all, a labor of love involving a good deal of pride and responsibility.

Would you make all the same decisions that the Dubreuils made concerning their breeding program? Maybe yes and maybe no. What Scotties to include in a breeding and show program is an individual choice. But the bottom line is DNA vWD testing allows a breeder to make safe choices. As we enter the twenty first century, we can ensure that no vWD affected puppies are born from a planned breeding.

The STCA through the STCA Health Trust Fund and the AKC Canine Health Foundation is sponsoring research for a DNA based test for CMO and for Scottie Cramp. In the relatively near future we hope to have DNA tests for these defects. They will then become preventable just as vWD is preventable today..

Other breeds and AKC CHF have initiated research into

Epilepsy and into Liver Shunt. These diseases will involve complicated research and a great deal of time, but realistic hope for DNA based answers for Epilepsy and liver Shunt will exist in the future.

A special thank you to Gail Fisher and Ray Dubreuil for sharing Elsa's story with the Scottie community. The last time I spoke to Gail on the telephone, Elsa was sitting on the couch, between Gail and Ray. She is still the princess and will gladly tell you how special she is.

Elsa has done her part to contribute to the health and excellence of the Scottish Terrier. We should help our Scotties achieve their genetic potential. The proper use of the vWD DNA test will help to preserve the genetic diversity of our breed and also help improve the health of this breed.

The portrait of An'Gus, who is a rescue Scottie, was a long time coming, having originally been commissioned over 3 years ago by Cheri and Rick Biggs. They said they would like a drawing of him and sent many photos. In several photos, he was wearing different bandannas. About a year and a half ago, we visited the Biggs and met An'Gus and his family. He is a very sweet and gentle Scottie.

Finally, this August Marion did a sketch of An'Gus from a particular-

ly sensitive photo of him wearing a bandanna. She decided to use the flag motif taken from a different photo of him.

Marion sent the sketch to the Biggs and suggested that if they liked the idea of the flag bandanna, the flag should be done in color. They agreed with the suggestion. We went away on vacation in early September. While we were away, the horrible events of September 11th occurred.

After we returned, Marion start-

ed working on the finished pencil drawing. The drawing took on a new meaning for her. The more she looked at An'Gus' sensitive expression, the more it became a reflection of the concern and feelings that everyone was now experiencing. The look in his eye and his raised brow seem to convey a sense of bewilderment. It is as if he is truly trying to understand what has happened. Now all of the delays in finishing the drawing seem somehow meant to be.

An'GUS came to us from the SPCA in 1996, and with his soulful eyes and charismatic personality, we knew he was something special. It became clear that An'GUS' mission had been predestined by some greater power as he was here to help me cope with the darkest days of my life, when my Mother died suddenly only six months later! What a comfort he was letting me cuddle him to the point where we all feared I would rub the fur off his tiny body!

Having long admired Marion Krupp's work, we knew that if there was one Scottie in our lives who deserved to be immortalized by her, it was An'GUS. This soon became an obsession; so we commissioned Marion to draw our little son. We were soon to discover that gratification was by no means instant! She had a waiting list! Meanwhile, in 1997, Dr. Joseph Harvill asked me to write an article on Marion for Great Scots Magazine. Fate at work again! Marion and I were thrown together to get a "different" mission accomplished! As time went on, and no progress was made on my portrait, it seemed that we were seeking an impossible dream, so we gave up. The article, however, was written and published in 1998. But the biggest surprise of all was when Marion and Fred came to our house in the summer of 1999 with a beautiful color print of "Waiting for Dad" and it had a "Remarque" of my An'GUS at the bottom!!

Now we knew we must have a full-blown Krupp portrait. Back to the Waiting List we went! But at least we understood the



meaning of "waiting list."

In May of this year, Fred Krupp promised this was to be the summer we would get our An'GUS portrait! In the middle of July, Marion said she was struggling with all the roughs and didn't know which we would like best. We said — let's just expand on the one in the "Remarque" — we've always loved it! By mid-August we had our roughs in hand — and what a surprise, Marion had combined two of our favorite photographs, one of him wearing his American Flag Bandanna!! We were

thrilled! But we can't have the American Flag drawn in black and white — would she be able to add color?? The answer was yes! Now the only thing to do was to — wait some more. But by now, we were good at that!

When the World Trade Center, Pentagon and Pennsylvania tragedies occurred, we discussed how strangely ironic it was that Marion had drawn An'GUS with his American Flag. We were happy; but sad at the same time. The next "news" about our portrait was that the Krupps wondered if we

would want to share An'GUS soulful image with Scottie lovers of the world during a time when we all needed inspiration. How could we refuse?

Life as we all knew it will never be the same. However, we are still Americans and our spirit, like our Scotties, is that of a diehard. It is our sincere hope that "Trying to Understand" will, in some small way, serve to unite the Scottie Lovers of the world with this message of confusion, courage, but most of all, hope.

Cerebellar Abiotrophy Research: STCA Health Trust Fund Project Leads the Way

With its new Cerebellar Abiotrophy (CA) project, STCA's Health Trust Fund is on the cutting edge of important genetic research. In fact, STCA's work started before the first published scientific report of CA in a Scottie appeared in the August issue of a British veterinary journal.

Dr. Jerold Bell of Tufts University is the geneticist Health Trust Fund contracted to investigate this progressive degenerative neurological disease in Scotties and to make recommendations to breeders and the STCA on how to control it. He will determine how widespread Cerebellar Abiotrophy is in Scotties and its mode of inheritance. From the pedigrees Dr. Bell is seeing, he indicates that the CA gene is an ancient one in the breed, going back into Britain. He suspects CA, a relatively rare disorder, is carried by an autosomal recessive gene in Scotties as it is in other breeds.

I've been hearing that "the word is out" on CA. Dr. Bell is totally confidential in his collection and use of pedigrees of CA-affected dogs. The persons who are helping find and direct Scottie owners and breeders to Dr. Bell have been equally confidential. How then would anyone know pedigrees of any CA-affected dogs? Probably through history's fastest news organization, the dog world Grapevine!

Now is a good time to remind breeders and owners who become aware of pedigrees of CA-affected Scotties not to make assumptions about which dogs carry this gene. Don't jump to conclusions! To decry a grandparent or great-grandparent or other

relative as a carrier simply because it's name appears in a CA pedigree is unfair. It is what geneticists call witch-hunting. Dr. Bell emphasizes: "The only obligate carriers of recessive defective genes are parents or offspring of affected individuals, or those identified by valid genetic testing."

Which Scotties are carriers of Cerebellar Abiotrophy? You can't guess it, nor can I. Nor can Dr. Bell. All we can say is that at least one dog in every generation of both the sire's and dam's side of an affected dog's pedigree carries the disease gene for an autosomal recessive disease. Dr. Bell reminds us, "...the rest of the ancestors are there due to happenstance; breeding choices made by the owners."

Until we have techniques including relative risk analysis, disease registries, DNA tests, and totally open and honest breeders, the time-honored Grapevine is all breeders have to fall back upon to avoid producing disease. Let's not hunt for witches in that Scottie Grapevine.

Important: Don't mistake Cerebellar Abiotrophy for Scottie Cramp. Symptoms of CA can be confused with Scottie Cramp, a neurological disease which is endemic in the breed. Keynote differences: CA is constant and progressive, while Scottie Cramp is episodic, triggered by exercise or excitement, and not progressive with age. In Dr. Bell's words, "Dogs with Scottie Cramp are normal, with episodes where they do not walk or move normally. Dogs clinically affected with CA never move normally; the signs are constant." If you know

Scotties diagnosed with Scottie Cramp which have constant and progressive symptoms, please urge owners to contact Dr. Bell to ascertain if the condition could actually be Cerebellar Abiotrophy instead of Scottie Cramp.

New CA video: Debbie Smith, owner of the CA-affected Scottie Murphy, has produced a video showing Murphy and two other CA-affected Scotties at different ages and stages of disease. If your Scottie has odd movement and is uncoordinated, request a copy of the Cerebellar Abiotrophy video so you can compare your dog's symptoms with the CA-diagnosed Scotties. Kiltie's Kookies

DAPHNE BRANZELL

Mix in blender:

1 egg
1/4 c. powdered milk
1/3 c. bacon grease
1/2 c. + 2 Tbsp. Water
1 garlic clove, minced
1 Tbsp. Brewer's yeast
1 tsp. Bone meal

Combine:

1/2 c. corn meal
2 c. bacon bits

Add wet ingredients to dry and mix until moistened. Turn out onto floured board and knead 5 minutes. Add flour if necessary. Roll out 3/8 inch thick. Cut into desired shapes. Place on lightly greased cookie sheets. Using a skewer or two pronged fork poke holes in each biscuit. Bake at 400 for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 325 for 15 minutes. Turn over and bake another 15 minutes.

Liver Treats for Dogs

1 lb. raw liver
2 to 3 c. wheat germ
1 egg
Garlic powder
1/2 c. cooking oil

Puree liver in food processor or blender. Combine with remaining ingredients and spread thinly on greased baking sheet. Bake in preheated 350 oven for 20 to 30 minutes. Break into pieces.

Dog Biscuits

SHIRLEY KARAS

1/2 cup uncooked oatmeal
1/2 cup cornmeal
1 1/4 cups white flour
3/4 cup whole wheat flour
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
1/4 cup sesame seeds
1/4 cup dried parsley
1/2 cup shredded carrot

1/4 cup canola oil or margarine

1/2 cup chicken or beef stock

Combine dry ingredients, then add carrot, oil, and stock. Stir with fork until mixture holds together. Knead briefly and roll on floured surface. Cut with dog biscuit cookie cutter. Bake on lightly sprayed cookie sheet at 375 for 20 to 30 minutes or until done. yield about 30 cookies

Dog Biscuits

YVONNE KAZAN

1 1/4 cups unbleached flour
1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
1/2 cup cornmeal
1/4 cup shaved carrots
1/8 cup non fat dry milk
1/8-1/4 tsp garlic powder
1 egg
1 cup water
1/4 cup plain yogurt

Chill dough. Use your favorite cookie cutter to make shapes and bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 min.

Scottie Treats

JANET KOSTYZKA

1 cup whole wheat flour
1/4 c rye flour
1/4 c wheat bran
or just 1 1/2 cups of whole wheat flour
1 tablespoon safflower oil
1 tablespoon parsley (chopped fresh or dry flakes)
1 tsp. garlic pwd.
1 tsp. kelp
chicken bouillon or beef bouillon pwd or cubes (just enough for flavor) approx. 3 cubes
1/3 c water
1 egg
contents of 1 400 iu Vit. E oil (preservative)

cheddar cheese or parmesan cheese (powder form like the cheese in the cans used for spaghetti)

Mix all ingredients together - if you have

a kitchen aid mixer with a dough hook you can use this or simply knead dough by hand- if too hard or dry add a little water, if too wet add a little flour. Let set about 15 min. then roll dough out to about 1/4 inch thick and cut out your favorite shapes - if using a cookie cutter make sure you dip it in flour so that your dough doesn't stick. Place on cookie sheet (if you have parchment paper this is great or a teflon coated sheet works best. Bake in 350 degree oven for 30 min rotating sheet at 15 min. Biscuits can be glazed with egg wash last 15 min (optional) then reduce oven temperature to 200 degrees and bake an additional 25 to 30 min. Cool biscuits and store either in a plastic bag with airholes or a cookie jar with a loose fitting lid. These should keep for about 1 1/2 to 2 months. Can be frozen. Note: Sealed plastic bags will cause biscuits to get moldy. The Vit E will help maintain shelf life.

Salmon Biscuits

KAY NELLIS

1 large can salmon, undrained
2 small jars mixed vegetables baby food, stage two
1 egg
garlic
approx 2/3 cups rolled oats *
wheat flour *
all-purpose flour *

Mash and mix the first four ingredients. Add oats and mix. Add enough wheat flour to form a ball. Sprinkle liberally with all-purpose flour. Roll dough into balls about the size of a green olive. I find I have to continually add more all-purpose flour as I go to prevent the dough from sticking to my hands. Place all the balls in the refrigerator for approx. 30 minutes.

Spray your cookie sheet with Pam. Flatten balls out to the size of a poker chip. Bake at approx. 400 degrees until crisp. It usually takes about 12-15 minutes. Let cool and put in a covered container.

* I never measure, just eyeball it.
