Health Trust Fund News

Time really does fly! The last firecracker has popped off and the glorious July 4th of 2002 is already history. And now we turn our thoughts to the annual pilgrimage to Montgomery County in October. The excitement is building and we all anticipate that special time in Pennsylvania when we see old friends, make new ones, and revel together in the one powerful obsession that brings us all to this place: our Scotties.

The Health Trustees are pleased to announce that a full audit of the Trust was completed on July 6, 2002 at the residence of HTF Treasurer, Theresa Thomas. Thanks to Bob Phelan, Claudia Leffler, Carole Owen and Theresa, who were willing and able to give of their time and expertise to carry out this first full audit of the HTF, going all the way back to the inception of the Trust up through 2001. The auditors are happy to report that, due to the meticulous job of all the HTF treasurers, past and present, no discrepancies were discovered. Your Health Trust Fund is in good order.

Periodically the Trustees are asked just *what* is the Trust doing with all of those funds? It may seem to some that the HTF is pretty good at collecting and counting, but what about spending? This is a fair question, and deserves a response.

The Trust is empowered to oversee collection and management of donated funds and to make recommendations to the STCA Board for distribution of these funds to support research deemed important to the health of our dogs. The process of investigation, contact with researchers, and study of prospective projects all take time and appropriate care on the part of each Trustee. The final vote by the STCA Board is an important review of the proposals and ensures that many good minds have formed a consensus on each project that the Trust supports. Things may not always happen quickly, but the process works well.

Once the funds are sent to a researcher, then the actual work of the scientist begins, and this often takes *years*. Many of us can remember how long the vWD research took, and how we had to be patient for the DNA carrier test we all were waiting for. It is no different now with the HTF supported CMO and Scottie Cramp projects currently underway. Without a doubt, there will be a DNA cheek swab carrier test available for both CMO and Scottie Cramp one day in the near future. This may not be next month or even next year, but it will happen soon. In addition, the Health Trust is now supporting researchers who have turned their attention to bladder cancer in Scotties, and in time, we will have some answers to the environmental and genetic secrets of this devastating cancer. Counting in the funds for earlier studies on liver shunt and melanoma, and other current studies on atopic (allergic) dermatitis and cerebellar abiotrophy, all projects together represent **in excess of \$45,000.00** already sent in by the HTF for research. **What is also important to understand is that the HTF is obligated to hold nearly this same amount of funds in reserve for the second phase of several projects, ready to send in as soon as the dollars are needed.** But in the mean time, we will have to be patient. As painful as it is to watch



a puppy suffering with CMO, or to spay and neuter beautiful pups out of a Cramp litter, or to care for a beloved Scottie in the final days of terminal cancer, we will have to be patient.

The funds generously donated by so many to the Health Trust Fund are ready to support the kind of studies that will help our dogs now and in the future. In an informal Internet survey of several breeders across the country, I discovered a remarkable consensus among many of the producers of our breeding stock. The top five areas of concern mentioned most frequently were:

1. Cancer (bladder, lymphoma)
2. Scottie Cramp
3. Endocrine disease (Cushings, hypothyroidism)
4. Liver disease (shunt, elevated enzymes)
5. Seizure disorders

Clearly these are the areas that are of prime concern to the future of our breed, and these need to be the focus of the investigative efforts, education, and research dollars from the Health Trust Fund. Already the Trustees are investigating new studies on epilepsy, liver shunt, lymphoma, and a pedigree analysis of bladder cancer in our dogs. There will be more studies and seminars and information in the future. So please stay tuned!

The Health Trust Fund has been the beneficiary of many generous donors over the years, including the STCA regional clubs and members past and present. In addition, there is a large non-STCA member population of fervent Scottie lovers and pet owners who deserve mention and praise for their tireless and passionate support of the Trust. Heading the list of major donations this quarter is a stunning figure from the participants of the Great Scots Gathering held this year in Columbus, Ohio on April 25-26. The 130 attendees with nearly 70 Scotties in tow held auctions and raffles to raise funds for the Health Trust Fund, earmarked for cancer research.

In another show of wonderful generosity, participants of the 2nd Annual Door County Scottie Rally held May 18 in Wisconsin raised a large donation from the silent auction of many beautiful and desirable items. These funds are to be used for Bladder Cancer Research

Ephemera and The Medallion

Hatton Sandy

1905 - 2002
By Nancy Aaron



One of the rarest and most unique items in our collection is a 1908 medallion that, through a chain of circumstances, has been growing in significance with both the passage of time and happenstance. Found on a flea market table in Arundel, Maine, on October 14, 1996, the heavy 2" bronze award, with the embossed figure of an atavistic Scottie, encircled with the words "Scottish Terrier Club of America," was a standout in an array of canine collectibles. The reverse side was engraved "Brooks Trophy, Hatton Sandy, Schutzen Park, 1908." The piece was not only handsome, the text was intriguing. Trying to find out about more about Hatton Sandy, an early 1900's show Scottie, the significance of the Brooks award, as well as the the origin of the metal,

became a mission. And, while researching these topics, a well spring of STCA historical information was uncovered.

Through the excellent cooperation of the AKC Library staff, copies of fifty-seven marked show catalogs were obtained, dating from October, 1907 to May, 1908... including that of the January 1, 1908 North Jersey Kennel Club Show, held at Schuetzen Park, when Hatton Sandy won the second of his Brooks Trophy medallions. Of greater importance was another catalog, one that served to correct all previous Yearbook accounts for the date of the first Specialty show to be sponsored by the STCA. All dates previously listed had shown either March, or May, and the year 1910. For a breed club, which had originated in 1900,

not to have held its first specialty until ten years later, always had seemed a bit odd. Now, with the marked AKC certified catalog in hand, the enigma had been resolved. The 2nd Annual Bryn Mawr Kennel Club Show and the First Specialty Show of the Scottish Terrier Club of America were held on Saturday, September 17th, 1904, at the the Merion Cricket Club Grounds in Haverford, Pennsylvania. The President of the STCA at the time was Fayette C. Ewing. This first Specialty was judged by James Mortimer, who from 1885 until his death in 1915, was Superintendent of the Westminster Kennel Club Show. And, just for the record, the Winners Dog at this first specialty was Abertay... who also went on to sire Hatton Sandy.

SCOTTISH TERRIER CLUB SHOW

September 17, 1904

Twenty-seven Scottish Terriers lined up on benches on the Marion Cricket Club's lawn Saturday at Haverford, and a bonny sight they were as a whole to a lover of the "diehards."

Dog puppies were the poorest class, for but three of the seven entries were worthy. The winner, Craigdarroch Kennel's Douglas Dhu, is a handsome son of a handsome sire and dam. Later he and his litter brother, King Fergus, won for The Laird the piece of plate offered by Mr. Caldwell for the best stud dog, and a similar trophy for their dam, Silverdale Queen, as best brood bitch. Jeffries 2nd seemed to me a bit snipy and soft coated. Third, Gray Boy, was long distance beneath the second prize dog, and in fact the four pups shown by Mr. McFadden were a discouraging lot. Mr. McFadden must be very fond of Scotties to be willing to keep a litter of such unpromising one as he has there. But when one looks at the sire and dame, Nosegay Narcissus and Nosegay Wild Rose, just such a litter should have been expected. Breed differently, Mr. McFadden, and see if you can't lose those light eyes, soft coats, and short wide heads your present stock has.

I am sorry that Miss Brooks's efforts to get a good-boned, hard-coated dog should not have resulted in a better pup than the one she showed, Cracker Jack, res. The tremendous bone is there and the good quality of coat, but as often happens in these big specimens, the quality desired is gotten in the extreme degree and at the expense of something else. Cracker Jack gave the impression by his sluggish movements of being unable to hold up head or tail, both are so heavy. He is also shown at a

disadvantage because of his owner's conscientious scruples against any degree of trimming or "barbering" as he so aptly designated grooming.

Maiden dogs were in the same order, leaving out Cracker Jack and substituting King Fergus for Douglas Dhu. Fergus, the black one, is even better than Douglas Dhu in front and fore face. Novice dogs, Jeffries was winner and Black Douglas, another very good Laird dog, second. Limit dogs showed up. Rochelle Wizard at the head, Rob Roy second, Cracker Jack third, Nosegay Narcissus res. The Wizard has improved a lot since he came out a puppy last winter. His coat, which was nothing but seal-skin then, has now a good hard top dressing, and with his straight front, good cobby body, well-carried tail, beautiful ears and typical expression of eye, he only lacks fore face to make him a hard dog to beat. In the competition for American bred I think he showed more style and has better coat than Mr. Goetz's Bobby Black, who is very good in fore face, but rather light in coat. Bobby Black won, however [I am Wizard's owner so, of course, my think does not go]. Rob Roy, second, is a rather long-bodied dog, five years old and so not likely ever to be any better than he is: a fair Scottie that one need not be ashamed of. Nosegay Narcissus is a big, course dog, lacking everywhere in quality. The open dogs, American bred Bobby Black first, Rochelle Wizard second, Cracker Jack third. Bobby does his sire, Abertay, as much credit as the Wizard does The Laird. He is more than a year the senior dog.

Open dogs was close fighting and finally Abertay got the blue, with Sandown Garnet second and Brandywine

Jock third. Abertay is a grand Terrier and if he never had to have The Laird alongside he would seem as good as one could want. This was the case in this class, as The Laird and Merlin were shown for specials only. I like Garnet's head and expression better than Abertay's, but, of course, his very crooked front is a great detriment, as is that of Brandywine Jock's. Edgehoch Brier res. was as high as he should be; excepting for his homespun style of coat I don't think him a good Scotchman. Abertay won the handsome little winner's cup, with Garnet res.

The only bitch puppy was my Nosegay Honeysuckle. Nosegay Honeysuckle—The Laird - Nosegay Forget-me-not—is a neat little bitch, a bit long in body and narrow in skull at present, with a very slight protrusion of upper jaw. Her good points are coat, very flat and hard, very small well set ears, small beady eyes, and straight legs and correct tail. As she is only eight months old she may chance all these conditions in a year's time. All of the Rutheven entries were absent. In Maidens, Honeysuckle shared the ring only with Mr. F. Willoughby Mitchell's unnamed bitch. This "dark horse" of unknown age, etc., etc., is common in head and expression, but Mr. Mortimer did not think this as much of a fault as the slightly overshot mouth on eight months' old Honeysuckle.

As an exhibitor of long, and I believe, good standing, I feel at liberty to criticize the taste of Mr. Mitchell in showing at all under the circumstances. Whether the fault were his or Mr. Caldwell's, as he claims, the fact is bench-show rules appear to have been violated, and it would have looked better to an interested person if he had waited to bring out his bitch until such time when he could devote ten minutes to properly entering her.

Novice bitches were Mr. Mitchell's She first, Miss Brooks's Scottish Witch second and Nosegay Honeysuckle third. The Witch is a very fair one of the older style head, a bit short, but with good mouth, ears and expression. She is good boned and could have been made to look neater, but I believe with careful mating she will yet get for Miss Brooks the typical Scottish Terrier she is anxious to breed. Limit bitches brought out Miss Dohan's Katherine first, a very small specimen with beautiful ears and lots of style for so wee a lassie. She is nearly five years old. Scottish Witch second and Nosegay Wild

Rose third.

In American bred open bitches I was again alone with my little Nosegay Honeysuckle.

Open bitches, Craighdarroch's Heather Charm won. Sandown Heather and Brandywine Jean came second and third. All three of these beautiful bitches are well known. Little Katherine was reserve and Scottish Witch V.H.C.

A lot of specials were hurried through just before dark, and the new medals offered by the Scottish Terrier Club for American bred stock were greatly admired. From now on we hope winners of the STC specials will feel that they are getting something worth having for their money and trouble. One of the most important general specials was awarded to Mrs. Brazier with her team of four Scotties, being the best four in the whole show. She also won the brace and team prizes in Scotties and best Scottish Terrier. Nosegay Honeysuckle won the specials for best American bred bitch, and she with Rochelle Wizard won special for best American bred brace. Honeysuckle also won Dr. Ewing's vase for best with the flowery prefix.

As usual, the L. T. U. of Massachusetts were generous with their specials and the S.T.C. people should be, and I am sure, are very grateful.

FRANCIS G. LLOYD

THE MAN OF THE TROPHY

The Francis G. Lloyd Memorial Trophy has been awarded annually since Ch. Albourne Beetle was the first winner in 1921. As well known as the trophy is Francis G. Lloyd, himself, has become a faded figure about whom only a few facts, recited in breed histories, are all that we know of him.

What is said about him in those histories? That he founded his Walescott Kennels in 1906 in Bernardsville, New Jersey; that it was a large kennel of upwards of 75 dogs; that he supplied multi-dog entries of what would be unthinkable numbers today; that he imported many good dogs, and bred many good ones; and that he died suddenly in 1920 and his kennel was straightaway disbanded.

Facts which don't explain why he was memorialized with what has become the STCA's most prestigious trophy.

Lloyd did die suddenly in 1920, but not prematurely. He was 72 when he had a massive heart attack in his offices at Brooks Bros., of which he was President at the time, a position he had risen to in Horatio Alger fashion. He went to work for Brooks Bros. at the age of 14, in 1862, making a 58 year career.

During those years he married, fathered one daughter, became a vestry-man of his church in New York City, involved himself in civic affairs to some extent, served on a draft board during World War I. And, when the mayor of the city at the time asked William Randolph Hearts to serve on a committee to organize a welcome home for "the boys," Lloyd resigned along with others from that committee in protest. Hearst had opposed American entry into that conflict.

Lloyd came late to the Scottish Terrier fancy. He entered it, howev-

er, in a big way, storming the shows with large Walescott entries. Guided by professional dog men, who both managed his kennel and handled his dogs, his kennel became a dominant force in the breed. The kennel brought over such prominent British dogs as Eng/Am Ch. Walescott Invader (nee: Clonmel Invader) and a number of Merlewood dogs; and they produced such prominent dogs as Ch. Walescott Maister Wullie and Ch. Walescott Whim. There were always candidates for the shows at the kennels; and there were always puppies.

Just when Lloyd became a member of the STCA is not certain, but it is quite likely early on in his association with the breed. He was elected President in 1915 and 1916, then

Vice President in 1917, but became President again when the President, Dr. C.C. Little, was called to war duties, and was President when he died.

In 1915 the Club began a quarterly publication, *The Bulletin of the Scottish Terrier Club of America*, the first editor being Mrs. A. B. Saunders of Clinton, New York.

There were others who had large kennels, and had good show records. It is likely that the Memorial trophy was not established to honor Lloyd for his record in the kennel and in the ring. Rather, it is more likely that his record as President of the Club, putting it on a firm foundation, is the basis for the esteem that led to the Club so memorializing him.

When it comes to Scottie collectibles, a number of our friends and acquaintances have often referred to us as being obsessed and addicted. What constitutes either of these compulsive behaviors? When it comes to the live, four-legged, bearded and browed version, many of us find it is very difficult to have just one, or even two, after once having lived with that stubborn, stoic, devoted temperament. Why is it so difficult to transfer this concept to the realm of collectibles? Isn't there always room for just one more? The fact that every available nook and cranny is bursting with infinite variations of items, all exhibiting little pointy ears and beards is irrelevant. Scottish Terriers are the most recognizable dog outline, and have enjoyed popularity for years, so there is virtually no way to own one of every Scottie collectible – but, that doesn't mean that we cannot have fun, spend money, and meet new and interesting people in the attempt to accomplish the endeavor.

What possesses us to make that next purchase? Is it genetic? Did we come from a long line of collectors? Were we deprived of "things" as a child? The answer to these questions is probably, "No." We are no longer required to actively go out and hunt for food to sustain us, but we still seek the thrill of the hunt, and the exhilaration of locating the prey, stalking it, bagging it, and bringing it home. Oh, the satisfaction when we find an item we have sought for some time because of its uniqueness, desirability, or just because it will complete a set. Who knows what triggers that initial purchase, maybe it's the attempt to satisfy some mystic memory from childhood. I acquired my first conscience Scottie collectible, a rabbit fur plush toy, as a teenager (I won't mention how many

years ago that was!), but I didn't acquire my first live Scottie until 1970. Several years later my sister sent me one of the wooden blocks we had played with as small children... it had a raised Scottie on one side.

We have a soft spot for Jock from "Lady and the Tramp" and have decorated our guest room in his honor. Back in the mid-70's, I had the opportunity to purchase an original Jock cel from an estate for what I thought was the outlandish sum of \$20. Money was tight then. There were two cels in the estate. I didn't have the money to buy both, but splurged on the one. I brought it home, put it in a cheap metal document frame, and hung it in my daughter's room. When she outgrew it, it went into a drawer until we moved in 1987. It was only then that I realized the value of this wonderful piece. I am speaking of value as appeal, collectability, desirability, availability, and what it was worth on the current collector market. It was then that I took the piece in and had it professionally framed to protect it from damage. I also kicked myself for not having purchased the second cel all those years before. My \$20 investment is now worth more than \$1000! A couple of years ago we drove about 2-1/2 hours south of where we live to deliver a rescue dog to his forever home. We decided to make a day of it, take a leisurely trip to stop and browse the antique shops along the way. At the very last, small, off-the-beaten path, shop we spotted two "Lady and the Tramp" ice tea glasses marked \$11 each. We had recently seen some of the same glasses marked at over \$100 each at an antique show. We quickly picked them up and tried to conceal our excitement as we went to the counter to check out. Imagine how we reacted when the clerk asked if we had

seen the set of eight of these same glasses in a holder in the same booth. No, we had not seen them – we couldn't believe that we could have missed such a find. The clerk volunteered to go back and help us look, saying that her sister had also been interested, and maybe they were gone. We were about to give up, when we noticed something peaking out from under a cloth that was covering a small table. There they were!! Eight glasses, all in mint condition, and priced at only \$45! We didn't think twice about making this purchase!!!! The clerk gave us 10% off the set and apologized that she couldn't discount one glass (of the earlier pair) that we had passed on because it had a crack. Just proves that you never know when or where you might find something special. We put the single glass in an auction a few weeks later and sold it for \$150, which we promptly spent on an auction item we had been wanting.

The time to buy a collectible, or an antique, is when you see it. There is a lot of truth in this statement. If you find something that appeals to you and you know it is not very common, you probably should buy it. I used to be able to think about something I had seen and go back in a few days and buy it, as it would still be there. This was the case when we first moved to Denver. Then it was a buyer's market. Today, there is a lot more competition out there looking for Scottie items. So, if you see something that interests you, you should be prepared to buy it, and to pay a good price for it. We have also found that many Scottie collectibles are increasing in value, at a rate that makes them good investment items too. So all you have to do in pursuit of your quest is to convince your kids that, by collecting, you are actually investing in their inheritance!

THE

CAST IRON

The use of iron has a fascinating history. Objects made of refined iron ore were found in ancient Egypt dating back to 4000 B.C. The first cast iron figurative work, a pair of lions, appeared in China during the sixth century A.D. The earliest iron making efforts in America began, and ended temporarily, in the early 1600's. But, by 1790, Yankee enterprise had kicked in and the American iron industry became a tour d' force in the world market.

Certainly one of the most popular fields in the world of Scottie collecting is that of cast iron. The malleability of the material, and facility of casting methods, lent itself to the imaginative creations by early artisans. And, while the earliest small items were robust in function, primarily doorstops and boot scrapers, other uses soon evolved and paperweights, smoking accessories, bookends, banks, lamps, and other art novelties were soon being mass pro-

duced.

By far, one of the most prolific producers of cast iron Scotties was the Hubley Manufacturing Company, founded in 1894, in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. The Hubley Metal Art Goods Price Guide lists 24 different Scottie items. The brand name was retired in 1978.

Other notable cast iron manufacturers of art and novelty items included the Littlestown Hardware & Foundry Co., "Littco," founded in 1916; Wilton Products, founded in 1940; the John Wright Foundry, founded in 1850; and the National Sewing Machine Company, founded in 1880. The N.S.W. manufacturer has a somewhat unusual history. During the depression, when their sewing machine sales plummeted, the company turned to making less expensive items, including doorstops, lamps, smoking accessories, bookends, paperweights, and the most popular Scottie doorstop of all time, the "Texaco Listen Scotties."

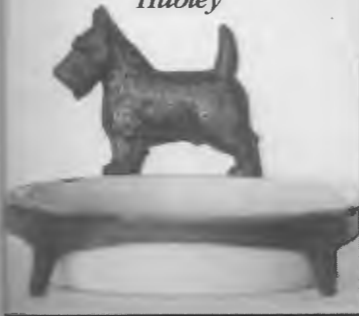

Crown Jewels

from Across the Sea

Pure classic beauty best describes most of the foreign artware Scotties manufactured during the past 70 years. Made of the finest porcelain, and crystal glass, many of the pieces are considered rare either because of their limited production years, or because of the competition that has been generated amongst an international field of doubles collectors.

And, while the Scottish Terrier was not used in abundance as subject matter, those that were made are truly elegant in style and design. Created by some of the more famous artists and sculptors of the day, the focus for their rich talent seems to breathe life into the models.

Outstanding in the field of porcelain manufacturers are Royal Copenhagen, founded in Denmark in 1775; Rosenthal, which bears a crown hallmark, founded in Selb, Bavaria, in 1879; Doulton Pottery, founded in Lambeth, England, in 1815, later to become Royal Doulton in about 1901; and, the small exclusive Dahl-Jensen factory, started in 1928 in Denmark, but only operated for 50 years. The crystal art deco figurine, was made by the Wedgwood Company, founded in 1759 in Burslem, England.

One of the most interesting pieces, made by Royal Doulton, is "Albourne Arthur." It is that of English Champion Albourne Arthur, born on September 9, 1924, the great grandson of English and American Champion Albourne Beetle. Beetle was born in England on December 12, 1915 and after obtaining his British title, was imported to the United States to become the STCA's first winner of the Lloyd Memorial challenge cup in 1921. When, or how, Albourne Arthur became the model for the Doulton figure that bears his name will probably remain a

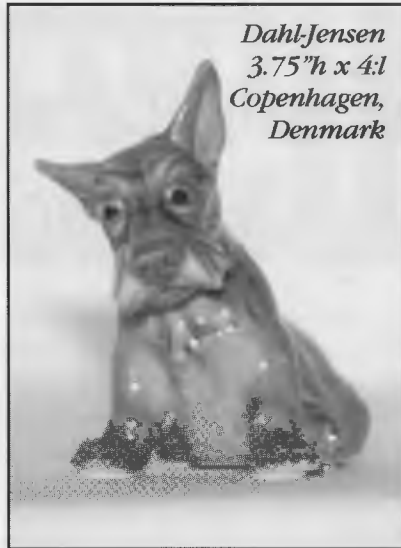
The comely small seated Dahl-Jensen Scottie, with its melancholy and somewhat pensive expression, is considered rare. The modeling by Jens Peter Dahl-Jensen [1874-1960], is magnificent with full detail of coat, feet, even toes. Dahl-Jensen is considered as one of the most accomplished Copenhagen sculptors, particularly of dog models, of which this Scottie is a fine example. He managed to instill life into his models like no other porcelain artist was able to achieve.

And, in the collector's world, there abound myths and fantasies. One of the most challenging to make, or break, has been that surrounding the origin and purpose of the Wedgwood Scottie paperweight. Efforts to solicit information from the manufacturer have been futile. Yet, we have been told that this particular piece was designed by Wedgwood as a prize to be given at a Crufts Dog Show.

Seren, Chester and Sophie were the STCA Rescues of the Year 2001. Seren's story was told in the previous issue of the Bagpiper and the following vignettes are about Chester and Sophie. These three dogs were abandoned and unwanted and are now in loving homes thanks to Scottie Rescue and the great people who devote their lives to the less fortunate members of our breed.

CHESTER

Chester was turned in to Animal Control in Austin, Texas by his owners who could not or would not treat a serious leg injury. They requested that he be euthanized. San Antonio Scottie & Westie Rescue picked him up and took him to their veterinarian. The leg was so badly mangled that the dog had to be anesthetized to examine it. The bone was exposed and there was serious infection and maggots. The leg was cleaned, splinted and bandaged and

Chester was started on massive antibiotics with hopes that it could be saved and would not have to be amputated. While he was under sedation, a lifetime's growth of matted hair was shaved off. It took several weeks of intensive care, with frequent dressing changes and never knowing from day to day if the leg could be saved, but Chester recovered. He is now a happy healthy boy in his new adoptive home with a Scottie friend named Gracie.

SOPHIE

Sophie was discovered lying in a ditch on the side of the road in northern Minnesota, close to death due to the extreme weather conditions. She was dehydrated, had an intense infection, patches of bare skin and was covered with bite marks. She was estimated to be between 6 and 8 years old and had recently had puppies. Jan Seeger, Memory of Monroe Scottie Rescue for Minnesota, took her in and nursed her back to health. Her back was swayed, she had luxating patella in both rear legs and no muscle tone. This extremely sweet girl was so grateful for all the TLC she received, and she started to improve. When she was well enough

she was spayed and dental work was performed to correct a lifetime of neglect. Many of her teeth had to be extracted. She showed a great will to live and her wonderful personality emerged. She now lives with her adoptive family in Mitchell, South Dakota with Dachshund friends Rudy and Ginger.

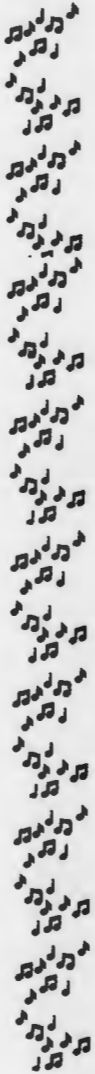

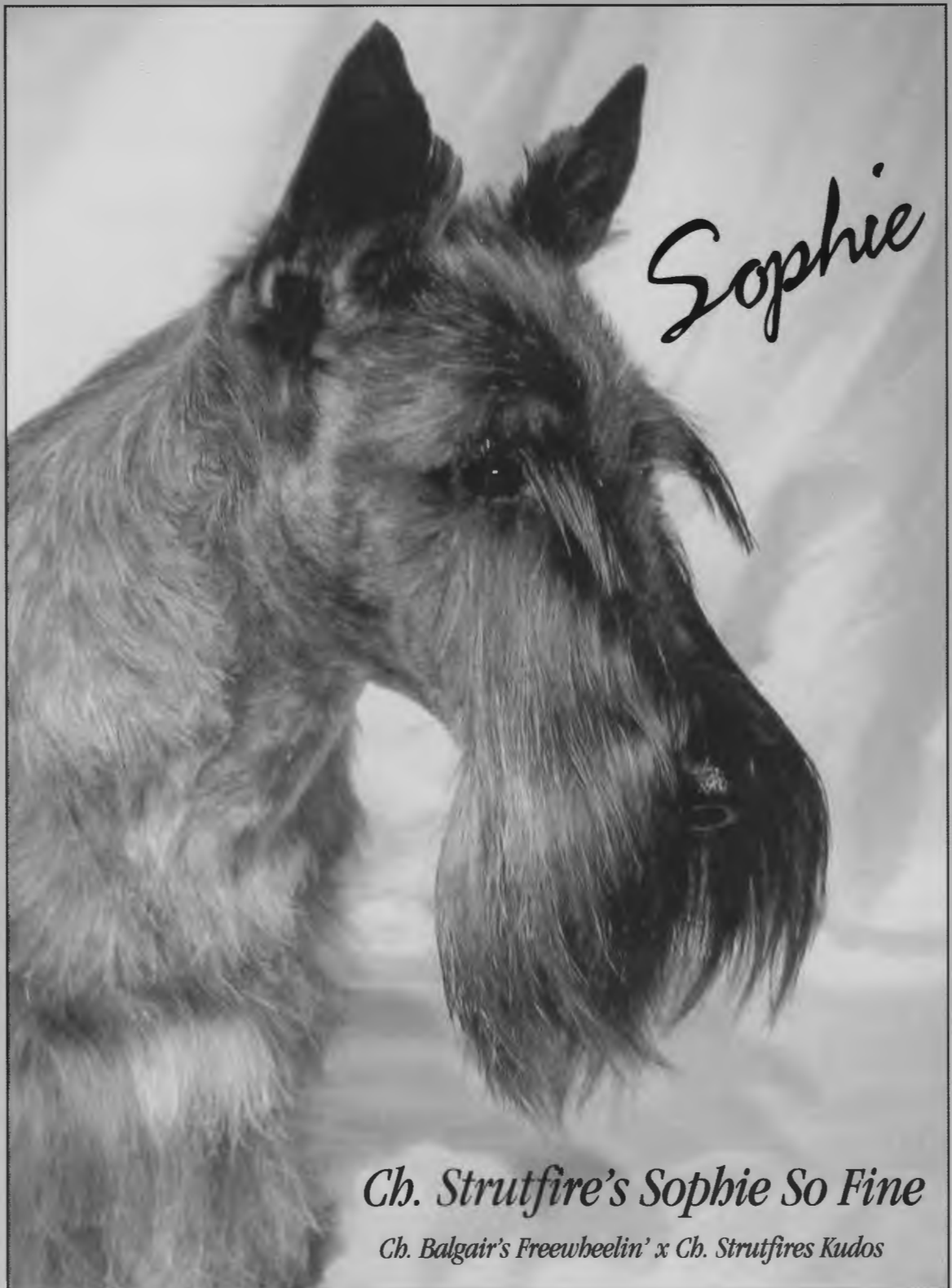

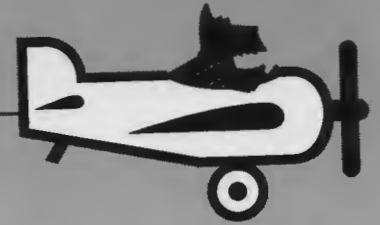
